



SENIOR VICE COMMANDANT by Chris Taylor

All members can assist with recruiting and retention. There are still a lot of Marines out there that do not know about the Marine Corps League, or even know we exist.

- If you see someone with a Marine Corps Veteran license plate, bumper sticker, hat, shirt, or anything Marine Corps related, stop them and talk with them. Let them know about the Marine Corps League and what we do. That person you stop, may be a potential new member, and may even want to help volunteer their time.
- Build a relationship with the local recruiters as well and help them with Poolee functions, or see if you can talk to the Poolees about the Marine Corps League. Those Poolees may not be a member now, but they could be in 4 or 5 years when they get out of Active Duty, or even their parents may be a potential associate member.
- Retention is a problem throughout the Marine Corps League. Make members feel
 welcome by talking to them, doing family functions, finding out about their hobbies. The
 Marine Corps League is more than just a nonprofit, trying to raise and donate money. A
 lot of younger members are not involved because of trying to juggle their work and
 family lives. Doing family functions that they could attend and bring the entire family is
 something small but can make that member feel welcome and want to help out more. Do
 not recruit members just to get a number now, and then you never hear from them
 again.
- Encourage Member's to attend the Department Conventions and Conferences. Numerous
 members have stated in the survey that was sent out, that they do not attend because
 they are either not a Department or Detachment Officer, they are just an associate
 member, or they served in another branch. All members are welcome and encouraged to
 attend. There is a lot of information that gets passed, and a lot of excellent classes that
 go on that any member can attend.

PAYMASTER POINTS TO PONDER by Dave Englert

DATABASE PORTAL – Paymasters and Commandants, if you are a frequent user of the Database portal, then you have probably already seen many of the great changes that have happened since the National Mid-Winter Conference within the portal. Detachment Paymasters and Commandants now have greater resources at their fingertips than ever! If you attended the Department Spring Conference, you have already seen the demonstration. If not, go to the Member Library on the national website and review the Database 101 and 102 classes there.

MEMBERSHIP CARDS – Please continue to send me scans or pictures of cards that need replacing. If you do not receive a new card within a few weeks after requesting a replacement, let me know and I will investigate the tracking on it.

APPLICATIONS – Before accepting an application from a member, please ensure that the applications are an up to date one! The photo copies of 20-year-old applications are no longer valid. Visit the library or a recent copy of the Semper Fi magazine to find a current copy. Additionally, the member must check a box on the felony statement. If the answer is no and the application is signed, then it is good. If the answer is yes, then a statement must accompany the application explaining the felony.

TURNOVER – If the detachment replaces the paymaster, it is up to the detachment leadership to ensure a complete turnover occurs. The new paymaster cannot fully complete the assigned duties until the ROI is processed by National, giving the new paymaster the appropriate access level within the database.

THE FUTURE – Paymasters need to have access to a scanner and an e-mail. We are close to the day wherein "snail-mail" becomes virtually unused. The only thing that absolutely needs to be mailed at this time are checks. That can change soon! Be prepared to meet the future!

SERVICE OFFICER by Jim Atkinson

- Indiana has the Good Samaritan Act that protects and provide immunity to anyone that renders emergency first aid/care in good faith from civil liability.
- When filing a disability claim with the VA remember how important it is for you to
 initially go in with a strong claim submit medical evidence that supports your issues
 and submit lay/buddy statements that are relevant to your claim.
- If you receive a denial on part or all of your claim you have 3 formal appeal processes that are available to you:
 - Supplemental appeal opportunity to gather and submit new and relevant evidence
 - higher level appeal if there has been a clear or unmistakable error on your claim this appeal goes to a supervisor who puts a set of new eyes on the issues
 - board of veterans appeals (BVA) sends your appeal to a federal judge that interprets the appropriate VA law to help overturn your denial or she/she can remand the claim back to the VA regional office for further development




