BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DEPARTMENT AWARDS

MARINE CORPS LEAGUER OF THE YEAR

CRITERIA FOR NOMINATION:

- a. Nominee must be a member in good standing in a detachment within the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League.
- b. Nominee must be a dedicated, enthusiastic and loyal Marine leaguer: not a self-seeker, but rather a total, all around credit to the league.
- c. Nominee must actively participate in league functions and activities, such as recruiting new members, fund raising projects, parades, ceremonies and community affairs etc, etc.
- d. Nominee should present a well-rounded personality, balancing his/her interest with other family, community and civic activities.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Only one nomination may be made from each detachment per year. That is not to say that an individual cannot be placed into nomination again if not chosen during a particular award year for the department's highest honor (re-submission is encouraged). However, a member may be the recipient of this award **ONLY ONCE**.

Nominations must be submitted in the form of a letter from the Detachment Commandant and/or their Awards Committee to the Department Commandant via the Awards Committee Chairperson.

AWARD:

The award will consist of a plaque with emblem, suitably engraved.

AWARDS COMMITTEE ACTION:

The selection of a single winner will be made by the Marine of the Year Committee following the instructions contained herein:

Marine of the Year Committee/Society: Marines who have been formally honored as Department of Indiana Marine of the Year and the current Department Commandant shall be responsible for the selection of each year's recipient.

PRESENTATION:

The Marine Corps Leaguer of the Year Award will be presented at the Annual Banquet of the Department of Indiana by an individual as the Department Commandant may direct.

DEPARTMENT COMMANDANT'S SPECIAL AWARDS

AUTHORITY:

The Department Commandant has the authority, without prior notification to the Department Membership, to issue in the name of the National Organization and in the name of the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League, awards as he/she deems necessary for the good of the league.

In the same token, the Department commandant is also held responsible regarding the decorum, good taste and the reflection upon the U. S. Marine Corps and Marine Corps League as to his/her judgment when using this authority.

These awards may be in the form of medals, citations, certificates, plaques, trophies or mementos as he/she sees fit to be in the best interest of the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League.

This authority may be delegated.

INFORMATION:

The Department Commandant's Special Award authority is not a duplication or replacement of any awards found in this manual.

The Department Commandant will not bear the expense of these awards personally.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION:

When possible, copies of all awards issued will be made and kept on file with the Department Awards Officer for historical purposes.

When possible, citations will accompany any medal awarded.

THE EDWARD W. STORCK MEMORIAL "SEMPER FIDELIS" AWARD

BACKGROUND:

For almost 20 years the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League was blessed with one of the best, most competent paymasters that ever balanced a financial record: **Marine Edward W. Storck**, a charter member of the Fort Miami Detachment, Fort Wayne, Indiana. In 1995 Ed was diagnosed with terminal cancer. That same year, upon the recommendation of the Department of Indiana Awards Committee, the Department Commandant authorized the creation of this award for annual presentation. Ed Storck received the first award at the 1995 Department of Indiana annual convention.

AWARD INFORMATION

The criteria for this prestigious award is as simple as its title:

Semper Fidelis (Always Faithful)

Edward W. Storck "Semper Fidelis" Award is to be given by the current Department Commandant to a deserving member of the league and/or auxiliary who has devoted much time and energy over the years as an outstanding member that has shown outstanding loyalty and meritorious service to the Department of Indiana.

An individual may be the recipient of this award ONLY ONCE.

AWARD:

The award is a plaque with emblem with the following engraving:

The Edward W. Storck Memorial Semper Fidelis Award Presented To

In recognition of outstanding loyalty and meritorious Service to the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League (Year)

PRESENTATION:

The Edward W. Storck Memorial Semper Fidelis Award will be presented at the annual banquet by an individual as the Department Commandant may direct.

RECRUITER OF THE YEAR

CRITERIA FOR NOMINATION:

Nominee must be a member in good standing in a Detachment within the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League for at least one year.

Nominee must have recruited a minimum of five new members for the Marine Corps League. A delinquent member re-instated due to the effort of the nominee is considered a new member for the sake of this award. A normal renewal will not be considered regardless of the nominee's effort(s) to keep a member aboard.

The recruited member need not be a member of the recruiter's detachment. However, the membership application along with dues assessment must have been processed at the detachment level.

AWARDS COMMITTEE ACTION:

Highest number of new members recruited. In the event of a tie a duplicate award is authorized.

DETACHMENT LEVEL INDIVIDUAL MEMBER AMERICANISM AWARD

CRITERIA:

This award is presented to one individual from each Detachment within the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League each year. The name of the detachment candidate is submitted in writing to the Department Commandant via the Awards Committee Chairperson and may be made as an enclosure along with outer award submissions. The selection of your candidate is **automatic.** (Although this is not a mandatory award, it is issued by the Department of Indiana to recognize those individuals at the detachment level who have made contributions in the field of Americanism. Candidate submission is encouraged.

AWARD COMMITTEE ACTION:

Prepare the necessary Citations for Department Commandant's signature.

DEPARTMENT AMERICANISM AWARD

CRITERIA:

Although this is not a mandatory award it may be issued to a detachment in recognition of contributions and outstanding service of any nature in the field of Americanism that has significantly brought credit upon the U. S. Marine Corps, the Marine Corps League and the naval service.

It may be awarded for a single outstanding act a detachment has performed or (as there is no time limit set for a detachment to be cited) the award may be given for cumulative endeavors.

AWARD:

The award consists of a plaque with the American Flag and Marine Corps emblem, suitably engraved. (The Department Commandant has the authority to award the Department Meritorious Unit Citation in lieu of said plaque.)

Accompanying the Department Americanism Award is a Red, White and Blue streamer ribbon which may be affixed to the detachment's colors. (Or authority for Gold/Silver Star(s) to be placed on streamer ribbon in lieu of additional award(s).

AWARD COMMITTEE ACTION:

Be familiar with detachment action reports. Consider recommendations from other sources regarding detachment activities.

DETACHMENT LEVEL INDIVIDUAL MEMBER AMERICANISM AWARD

CRITERIA:

This award is presented to one individual from each Detachment within the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League each year. The name of the detachment candidate is submitted in writing to the Department Commandant via the Awards Committee Chairperson and may be made as an enclosure along with outer award submissions. The selection of your candidate is **automatic**. (Although this is not a mandatory award, it is issued by the Department of Indiana to recognize those individuals at the detachment level who have made contributions in the field of Americanism. Candidate submission is encouraged.

AWARD COMMITTEE ACTION:

Prepare the necessary Citations for Department Commandant's signature.

DEPARTMENT AMERICANISM AWARD

CRITERIA:

Although this is not a mandatory award it may be issued to a detachment in recognition of contributions and outstanding service of any nature in the field of Americanism that has significantly brought credit upon the U. S. Marine Corps, the Marine Corps League and the naval service.

It may be awarded for a single outstanding act a detachment has performed or (as there is no time limit set for a detachment to be cited) the award may be given for cumulative endeavors.

AWARD:

The award consists of a plaque with the American Flag and Marine Corps emblem, suitably engraved. (The Department Commandant has the authority to award the Department Meritorious Unit Citation in lieu of said plaque.)

Accompanying the Department Americanism Award is a Red, White and Blue streamer ribbon which may be affixed to the detachment's colors. (Or authority for Gold/Silver Star(s) to be placed on streamer ribbon in lieu of additional award(s).

AWARD COMMITTEE ACTION:

Be familiar with detachment action reports. Consider recommendations from other sources regarding detachment activities.

VETERANS SERVICE RIBBON

CRITERIA:

All league members, including auxiliary and associate members and in worthy circumstances individuals outside the Marine Corps League are eligible for this award.

- 1. To have personally assisted veterans/widows and/or children in filing a minimum of ten claims for Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits.
- 2. Or to have personally assisted veterans/widows and/or children in humanitarian assistance such as: food, clothing, financial aid, transportation, etc... a minimum of ten cases.
- 3. Or to have personally visited any Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Hospital or other medical facility including nursing homes, for the express purpose of Veterans Administration Volunteer Service (VAVS) a minimum of ten times.
- 4. Or to have helped veterans/widows and/or children in any significant manner that is not outlined above a minimum of ten times.
- 5. Or to have accumulated a minimum of ten events in any combination of the categories shown in criteria method paragraphs (1) through (4) above.

There is no set time frame involved to accumulate the necessary "ten points" to be eligible for this award. It may take one person only a year or less to accumulate the points whereas it could take another person several years to obtain the "ten points" to qualify for the award. However, the **TOTAL OF TEN SEPARATE EVENTS WILL BE STRICKLY ADHERED TO**.

Nominations for the VSR must be submitted in letter or endorsement form from the Detachment Commandant to the Department Commandant via the Awards Committee Chairperson no later than the first day of the annual meeting. The letter format will state unequivocally that the selectee(s) have met the "ten point" standard making them eligible for this honored award.

PURPOSE OF AWARD:

The purpose of this award is to encourage and reward those who involve themselves in Veterans Affairs. One of the primary projects the Marine Corps League and Marine Corps League Auxiliary should strive for is to have every member earn the VSR.

AWARD:

The award consists of a standard size military ribbon with solid scarlet field with a Marine Corps Emblem centered in the middle of the ribbon. A Veterans Service Ribbon Citation will accompany each award. Subsequent awards will be denoted by Gold/Silver Star(s).

UNIFORM REGULATIONS:

The Veterans Service Ribbon will be placed behind all National Marine Corps League awards but takes precedence over any/all Department or Detachment decorations.

AWARD COMMITTEE ACTION:

The Awards Committee will accept as valid the statement from the Detachment Commandant or Auxiliary President as to the eligibility of the nominee(s) submitted. Any questions of validity concerning eligibility by the Awards Committee will be addressed to the Detachment Commandant or Auxiliary President submitting the recommendations for clarification.

PRESENTATION:

The Veterans Service Ribbon, or stars in lieu of subsequent awards, with Citation will be presented to the winners at the discretion of the Department Commandant by an individual the Department Commandant may direct.

VETERANS SERVICE RIBBON UNIT CITATION

CRITERIA:

If the members of any Detachment or Auxiliary Unit, acting as a body, perform service to that degree that an individual could be cited for an award of the Veterans Service Ribbon, then that Detachment or Auxiliary Unit will have performed service to be awarded the Veterans Service Ribbon Unit Citation. (For the term "acting as a body" must be at least fire team size, four members.)

To further clarify the criteria the following explanation is offered: A review of the criteria for an individual to earn the Veterans Service Ribbon shows that a minimum of "ten points" must be earned to qualify that person for the ribbon. In other words, ten separate acts of service. Therefore, a Detachment and/or Auxiliary Unit "acting as a body" must have performed TEN SEPARATE ACTS OF SERVICE.

AWARDS COMMITTEE ACTION:

The Awards Committee will review the Detachment/Unit letter/endorsement paying close attention to the information provided regarding the dates and number of members performing the duty involved at the location mentioned.

PRESENTATION:

The Veterans Service Ribbon Unit Citation will be presented in the same manner as outlined for the Veterans Service Ribbon.

PAST DEPARTMENT COMMANDANT AWARD

CRITERIA:

This award is given to each Department Commandant upon the successful completion of his/her term of duty at the helm of the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League. (In various forms the award may be earned more than once.)

PRIMARY AWARD:

The primary award consists of a plaque with emblem with trophy style gavel affixed thereon. Engraving for the award will be worded as shown below:

A Past Department Commandant Medal and Past Department Commandant Lapel Button will accompany the plaque. (The medal and lapel button will be presented only once in the event of subsequent eligibility. Gold Star(s) will be awarded for those serving more than one term.)

For those Department Commandant's serving more than one term, a suitable memento will be awarded each year.

PRESENTATION:

The Past Department Commandant Award will be presented at the annual banquet of the Department of Indiana, Marine Corps League by an individual the Awards Committee Chairperson may select.

RAINBOW MEDAL AND CITATION

BACKGROUND:

The Rainbow Medal and Citation is a multiple purpose award in memory of and tribute to the six Marine Corps Combat Divisions of World War II fame.

CRITERIA:

The primary criteria or theme of this award is "Patriotism" as evidenced by the wording of the citation that accompanies the medal:

YOU ARE COMMENDED FOR YOUR DEVOTION TO THE PATRIOTIC PRINCIPLES HELD DEAR BY THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS AND THE MARINE CORPS LEAGUE

AWARD:

The award consists of a ribbon pennant with the colors of the rainbow with an attached gold sunburst medal engraved with the Marine Corps League seal. A Rainbow Medal Citation is issued with each medal.

INFORMATION:

The liberal use of this award is encouraged by Detachments within the Department of Indiana as well as Auxiliary Units. It may be used, but not limited to, the following areas:

ROTC, Boy Scouts, Visiting VIP's, Civic Leaders, General Public Relation Presentations, Active Duty & Reserve Marines, Other Armed Forces, Veterans Organizations, Detachment & Auxiliary Members (including Associate Members)

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION:

The department Awards Officer will maintain a supply of subject award to be sold to all Detachments of the Marine Corps League. The cost of the medal and citation is \$8.00 for each set. The Detachment Commandants have the authority to sign the citations in behalf of the Department Commandant.

NATIONAL AWARDS

All National Awards should come to the Department Awards Committee/Chair, forwarded to the Department Commandant for approval and then the awards chairperson shall forward said request on to the District National Vice Commandant for approval and submission to the National Chair/Committee.

CRITERIA:

When submitting a request for a National Award, the request must include all the information regarding what the person has accomplished, not just that of serving in the Marine Corps League but what they have accomplished within their communities, etc.

The request must be accompanied by form (NA-897) which reflects the required endorsements which are part of the approval process for a National Award. Without the proper endorsements the request will be returned to the submitter.

All requests for National Awards must be submitted directly to: Chairperson, National Awards Committee at the address listed on the National Roster.

National Junior Vice Commandant's Awards (Membership)

Marine Corps League Recruiter of the Year Award - Will be presented to the League's top membership recruiter. The recipient will receive a plaque in the shape of the United States with his/her name engraved thereon and will be presented a Distinguished Citizen Medal - Gold. This award will be presented annually at the national Convention.

National Junior Vice Commandant Citation

- Ch 2- This Citation will be awarded to all Detachments, Departments, and Divisions that maintain 100% Membership from 30 June through 31 December. The Citations will be presented during the Mid-Winter Conference each and every year.
- Ch 2 This Citation will be awarded to all Detachments, Departments, and Division that have exceeded their membership strength from 30 June through 30 June. The Citations will be presented during the National Convention each and every year.

<u>National Convention Streamers</u> - These will be awarded to those Divisions, Departments and Detachments who display their League standards at the National Convention and will be Blue in color with Gold lettering.

National Junior Vice Commandant's Awards (Membership) RECRUITMENT AWARDS

- Citations will be given to those members who have recruited 5 24 members during the year.
- Distinguished Citizens Medal Bronze will be given to those members who have recruited 25 49 members during the Year and a Distinguished Service Award signifying the accomplishment.
- Distinguished Citizens Medal Silver and plaque will be given to those members who have recruited 50 plus members during the year and a Distinguished Service Award signifying the accomplishment
- 100% Membership Streamers will be given to those Divisions,

 Departments and detachments who have achieved 100% membership during the Fiscal Year ending 30 June, as compared to Membership on 30 June of the prior Fiscal Year. The streamer will be Red in color with Gold lettering.

NOTE

- 1. For each additional medal award, a bronze star will be worn. A silver star will be worn in lieu of five (5) bronze stars; a gold star will be won in lieu of five (5) silver stars unless otherwise noted. The exception is Distinguished Citizens Medal Gold, where one (1) 5/16" gold star will be worn in lieu of five (5) 3/16 gold stars.
- 2. All stars noted in the above will be 3/16 except for the Distinguished Citizens Medal Gold.
- 3. When a Marine is elected to the National Staff, it is suggested that the Marine be honored by the Department and presented with the National Staff Medal (Elected). When a Marine is appointed to the National Staff, it is suggested that the Marine be honored by the Detachment and presented with the National Staff Medal (Appointed).
- 4. When a Marine is elected to the Office of Department Commandant, the Department should present the Marine with a Department Commandant Medal.
- 5. When a Marine is elected to the office of Detachment Commandant, the Detachment should present the Marine with a Detachment Commandant Medal.
