

I. How am I loved?

- 1. You are a thinking, feeling, emotional being created in the image of God, and you were created with individual features and abilities that God Himself gave you. Nobody knows your individuality and distinct abilities more than God.
- 2. You were created to live in a world not only to experience the beauty of God's creation, but also to display the magnificence of God through the exercise of your unique giftings and abilities. The environment is hard and challenging, but through God you can do amazing things!
- 3. Even though you may not have known God, He has cared and continues to care for you. He has protected you in this world, even though you may have had great difficulty, and He has also provided for you in accordance with what He has planned for you.
- 4. Also, God now gives you the opportunity to draw near to Him, to actually know Him to see and understand

how He works, and to one day see Him and be with Him. When we draw near to God, our lives are greatly enhanced. He helps us with our difficulties and complexities. Our joy and happiness is greatly increased as well as our peace of mind and soul. He gives us His Spirit to be our personal guide not only in this life, but for eternity. All of this begins by coming to hear and follow the Lord Jesus Christ.

II. Evidence of God

- 1. There is no such thing as "nothing." "Nothing" has never existed. If it did, there would still be "nothing." No evolutionist has a credible explanation in this area. Even the smallest organism to begin a "random mutation" had to come from some place. Albert Einstein believed the universe was created by a massive intelligence (see T. Aquinas, "The Necessity of God").
- 2. The circumstantial evidence is overwhelming. Just as every invention has a designer, the universe and everything in it (working together in sync) is all circumstantial evidence of an intelligent creator. Many

scientists have found evidence of this not only in the fossil record, but also in the study of creation (See ICR - Institute of Creation Research). God Himself is reflected in creation, and especially in mankind.

- 3. Physical evidence for God is seen in the nation of Israel. The history of the nation of Israel, including its origin and relationship with God has always been visible and open for examination. Discoveries in archaeology (including the Dead Sea Scrolls) have repeatedly affirmed the credibility of the Old Testament.
- 4. Physical evidence for Jesus Christ is vividly seen in the Church. The historical records from the age of the apostles number around 30,000, including around 5,000 complete or almost complete copies of the New Testament. This far outnumbers other historical documents from this period, and it comes from a time where writing was a lot more difficult.
- 5. The survival and growth of the Church is also "physical evidence". Thousands of Christians were courageous enough to proclaim and practice their faith

in the face of death. For many, relief did not come until the third century under Constantine's "Edict of Milan" (Eusebius). However, many Christians in recent times still meet under the threat of death. In spite of massive oppression, the Church of Jesus Christ continues to grow as our Lord predicted.

III. Drawing near to God

"And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or fields because of my name will receive a hundred times more and will inherit eternal life."

problems, accomplish much good to His glory, and eventually bring you to Himself for eternity.
