Well, I recently read a long piece written by my friend Deepak Bhargava and two others (Deepak was our speaker last month) that helped me understand better. Published by the longtime progressive thinktank, the Roosevelt Institute, I admit its title put me off a bit "The Cultural Contradictions of Neoliberalism: The Longing for an Alternative Order and the Future of Multiracial Democracy in an Age of Authoritarianism" – NOTE: it was written BEFORE the world changed on July 21: I admit I've never exactly understood what "neoliberalism" is, but if my shero Heather Cox Richardson can use the term these days, I can too!
