And the answer that came back was no, but there were a couple names that they said were close. And who was Roy Cohn? Well, he was Donald Trump's mentor in many ways. The gatekeeper of elite life in New York City and famous for gaining compromising information and alleged sexual misconduct, among other potential criminality.

So yeah, this isn't going anywhere. It's only going to get worse from here for the president.

How many billions of dollars? Don't even tell me how many billions of dollars we've sent to Israel at this point. I don't know. I don't want. I don't really want to know. But the number is astounding. I'm sure. So we have to support his ethno state, his homeland, so that he has a place to go back to, but we have no right as Americans to community build. That is not our birthright. What an asshole.

No one in the United States should be retiring at 65 years old. Frankly, I think retirement itself is a stupid idea unless you have some sort of health problem. Everybody that I know who is who is elderly, who has retired is dead within five years. And if you talk to people who are elderly and they lose their purpose in life by losing their job and they stop working, things go to hell in a handbasket real

Their ethos, their worldview is what's really being unmasked. You know, when people tell you who they are, listen to them, pay attention. And what Ben Shapiro is arguing is the ethos of the rootless cosmopolitan. There is no community. There is, there is no folk. There is no hometown. There is just an economic opportunity. There's a social economic ladder and you climb to the top of it. And furthermore, if you do not climb to the top of it, well, fuck you. You're a loser. That's what they think. Their, their perception of anybody that has not accumulated vast amounts of wealth is that that person is not as smart or not as capable or what have you. Now, let's we forget that you should not live your life in pursuit of money. Countless religions around the world. Certainly Christianity, among others, has said, look, life is a glorious metaphysical reality. It's something that is about family. It's about love. It's about community, right? It's about the human connections that we form. But that's not the way that they see it. They see it as this social economic, social Darwinist experiment. And unfortunately, that has dovetailed very well with the libertarian ethos, which is something we've talked about at length on this program. The bottom line is that that ethos is becoming detestable by a population that, as Dave said a moment ago, is increasingly squeezed. They're compressed, right? They can't get ahead. There's no way out. And what they see is rampant corruption and hypocrisy. They don't see the guile and the alacrity of elites. What they see is rank corruption. And that's exactly what's there.

Um, and I do not think it does. I watched this very interesting video today. This very interesting video today. Dave, I watched this very interesting video today. We're working on our transitions. That explains why there actually is no under no, um, underlying value.

And then we have real world data, like a recent MIT study that says 95% of companies that are using Al in the workplace are seeing no return on investment. These are, these are people within the company that are using AI to do their jobs.

And so it looks like she's, she's not making any money, but it looks like she is increasing the value of the company. And then they give, I don't know, like, like 30 free glasses to an uncle. And the uncle comes in and redeems those glasses. So she's, she sold 40 glasses that day, but 30 were redeemed by her uncle, who's invested in the company. Uh, nine were to her father again, and one was to the neighbor. So she seemingly on paper has drastically increased the value of the company without actually creating any value. And that seems to be what's going on here. There's some kind of like incestuous reciprocity where they're feeding into one another, and then they use that for collateral. And, and then they're just able to keep the cycle going. And now they're so overvalued. And he talks about their nose. And we talked about this last week or the previous week. This is exactly what their nose is did. She didn't have a product. She was able to use the esteem of people that were on her board. General Mattis was on her board. Larry Ellison funded her product and she would say like, it's proprietary. I'm not telling you how it works, but look at these people that are involved. And I think their nose was valued at \$9 billion. She had no product. She was able to launch in a Walgreens and horrible things happen to people. A pregnant woman was told that she was miscarrying, that her ACG had gone down to zero. Somebody had a false HIV. Just awful, awful things. People just going into a Walgreens where they think, just to get a simple blood test, thinking that they were going to get feedback about their health and then acted accordingly based on that feedback. And just disastrous consequences. She feels no remorse. And we're seeing exactly the same thing on a much larger scale with the entire economy. So why does this matter to the, the everyday person? This is a long clip. I need you guys to bear with me. It's very important. Very important. But this is going to affect all of us. And I think that this might be what starts the economic catastrophe that Cameron has been describing for months.

They probably have a 401k match. They probably put in at least enough to get that match from their employer. And it's probably in something like a traditional 60-40 portfolio, 60% stocks, 40% bonds. Now the stocks tend to be going into mutual funds and, you know, open up the prospectus on all these funds and the top five to 10 holdings are always the same. Nvidia, Apple, Microsoft, Amazon, Google, it's all the same names.

[01:05:21.840] Cameron M: Everybody is invested in the same companies. And the concentration of those companies is now higher than it has ever been. If you just buy the S&P; 500 index fund, like the SPY is the famous spider fund, a big chunk of that money is going to Nvidia. A big chunk is going to Microsoft and Apple and to Amazon and Google and Tesla. And that chunk is bigger than it has ever been. There's now concentration risk. It is the most crowded trade in history. Everybody is in the same names. Now that's on the 60% side, the stocks in somebody's portfolio. What's happening now is the Al bubble is going after the 40. Also, they're going after the bond side of the portfolio. They're getting into bed with private credit, which is financial institutions that are not banks, that are not regulated banks, but pretending to be banks, making loans, in this case, loans to build data centers. And that debt is being sold into bonds, into people's 401Ks, IRAs and pensions.

[01:08:05.560] Cameron M: Is it the elites, the government, the tech bros, the wall streeters, et cetera, et cetera, all part of some kind of circular financial Ponzi scheme. And that is about to be rug pulled. At least that's what I think. And part of what you're seeing is the unmasking, right? You're seeing the unmasking of who has real power in Washington, DC, APAC, Netanyahu, the Cuban lobby, you know, goes on and on. Who has real power in Wall Street? Who has real power in Silicon Valley? That's what you're seeing here. Now, what exactly does that mean? Why do we think this is so devastating? Well, this is a game. And that's really the way to think about it. It is very much a casino. If you go back to 2007, there's a book called The Tower of Basel. I don't know if you can bring it up, Dave, but in that book, there is a pretty good description of the ethos that captured Wall Street in the lead up to the great financial crisis in 2008. And basically he uses a guy named Charles Chuck Prince. He was the CEO of Citigroup. And Citigroup was at the heart of the mortgage meltdown that happened in 2008. And he was interviewed. I believe it was by the Financial Times sometime in 2007. So a little bit of distance before the meltdown occurred. And he was asked about rumors that there were these subprime loans and that potentially there were default rates. You know, there were murmurings that there were problems in the months leading up to the crisis. And he said, look, as long as the music is playing, you've got to get up and dance. You've got to play the game. And that's the way to think about it, because a lot of you are beholden to the notion that these are clever supervillains that sort of sit above in the clouds and cleverly entrap the rest of us. That is the wrong way to think about it. It is very much a gambling game. And those who gamble, what are they? They are addicts. And there's another good book. And I'm going to quote from this book, A Short History of Financial Euphoria, written by John Kenneth Galbraith, because it describes in excellent detail exactly what possesses these people and what ultimately leads to these bubbles, which then collapse in a short history of financial euphoria. Galbraith says the euphoric episode is protected and sustained by the will of those involved in order to justify the circumstances that are making them rich and is equally protected by the will to ignore, exercise or condemn those who have expressed doubts. So basically, hey, as long as the Ponzi is going, we're all getting rich. We don't do our due diligence. We don't pay attention to the details. And anybody that calls attention to the Ponzi scheme, well, we we marginalize them, we diminish them, we discredit them as a criminal. And if you watch that video that Rebecca put into the into the show that that we showed highlights of just a moment ago, he talks about how he was vilified two or three years ago when he was looking at the accounting of NVIDIA and some of these other big firms. OK, great. We got that. It's a bubble of some kind. What does that mean for the rest of us? If you go back to the pension protection act of 2006, a very significant, I would argue, a seismic shift happened in the laws governing the retirement accounts, the 401ks of Americans. Basically, what happened is that Americans went from an opt-in system where you would meet with your HR advisor. You guys probably remember this. You would sit down with somebody and they would say, well, here's your package, the company will contribute X amount and you'll put in X amount. And then you were given a list of companies and you effectively had to choose which of those funds you would allocate your money to. And some people didn't. It was an opt-in. So you had to say, I want to go with X fund and then they would disperse your contributions accordingly. Thus was one of 401k. Post 2006, it was opt out. So instead of having to select one and actually put your money into the market, now you're automatically in the system. You're automatically obligated. Okay. The Trump administration comes in in 2024. And as we've said on this program, the Trump administration might be the most pro-Wall Street administration

we've had since Ronald Reagan in the 1980s. And what they came up with was a further liberalization of what average people could invest in. And specifically they called it a democratization of the 401k program. And this allowed basically retail investors, okay, so regular folks to invest in shadow banks, to invest in private equity. Now, why do I say all of this? A very large number of Americans.

So is this the straw that breaks the camel's back? I don't know. What I do know is that this entire economy is basically the greater full theory. It is some attempt to keep you in the system, to keep you vested and persuade others to come into the network. The minute, the instant that all of a sudden people realize, oh, shit, my money may not be in the bank. Maybe my 401k is at risk. They will pull the plug and there will be a mass exodus. That's how this game ends. That could happen next week. It could happen next month. It could happen in six months. I don't know. Why is it that it's gone on for so long? It's not just stupidity. Okay. I have a friend. He's probably 50 years old, 55, something like this. He is not a boomer. He's very red-pilled. He knows about who's really running this country. He is in the know, but he's got two daughters. He's got a wife. He's got, I believe, two homes and a timeshare. And in order to subsidize his lifestyle, he cannot divest from the Ponzi scheme. So it goes on and on and on and on. And at some point, the plug is going to get pulled and his entire net worth is going to vaporize in some significant fashion. That means, ladies and gentlemen, revolution. Because remember, the younger generation, we can't afford a house. We're ninias, no income, no jobs, no assets for the most part. We're already outside the system and we're already pissed about it. Those who are in the system, they think that this can go on and on. The minute, as I said, the New York second that they realize that there's funny money and their retirement, their net worth is ethereal, that's when you're going to see real change in this country. And I think we're a stone's throw away from that.

And it's, you know, I'm not, I only kind of started to become financially literate like six years ago when I met my wife. She's smart. But the way that he's describing the current financial system, what's it called an auroboros? Auroboros, the snake eating it's tail. Right, snake eating it's tail. So like whether we're talking about SOFR and the Fed funds rate, the overnight rates, the repo, the liquidity is, is gone. It's like evaporating overnight. And in order to make more liquidity, you're going to have to raise inflation. And no matter which way you turn, the system will fall into its own footprint. Whether it's printing more money or deflating, we're fucked. And the smart thing that we should be doing is we should be closing the border, deporting illegals, allowing inflation to hit in the jobs market, like allowing people to make more money. And that would actually get our manufacturing going again. But we're like not doing any of that. Instead, we're passing the Genius Act and doing the crypto thing. And it's and H1Bs, we're not deporting people.

Yeah, I think we've got it, right? It seems to be the case that we're in some kind of a fiscal debt crisis. War with Mexico. I don't exactly think we're there yet, but that's still sort of on the back burner. War with Iran. Well, we had a 12 day skirmish with them that could have gone nuclear for Christ's sakes, but that very much could still happen. Netanyahu's still in power and God knows what he will do to stay in power. So that's very much in play. Recession, I think we're entering a recession, right? A banking crisis. Yeah, well, I'm hearing murmurs that unrealized losses, interest rates, repo rates, it's all communicating that the financial plumbing is in trouble, that it's disrupted, it's dysfunctional. Stock market crashed. That has not happened yet, but we're beginning to see the stocks sort of wobble a bit and then of course the trade war with China, which we've been we've been at off and on for the last six months. So this is what is building. And I think it's all going to crash on Donald Trump's head, which is why I say I don't think he's going to survive his presidency. I really, really don't. I think either he will be forced to resign or he will resign voluntarily. That's how bad folks, I think the situation is that we're in.

So I wanted to talk about on the right, if we have a problem with filling information gaps, it's, you know, we do do with, with total, with total slop. So John Keats said negative capability. That is when man is

capable of being in uncertainty, mystery, doubt, without any irritable reaching after fact and reason. This is important. So what does Keats mean here? He certainly doesn't mean because he was an intellectual and he was intellectually curious. He does not mean that we should stop seeking truth or answers, but we cannot know everything and sitting in that uncertainty, something that I'm very, very bad at, is such an important part of being human and of developing a worldview rooted in reality. And as a movement, I think we have a major weakness in the, in this department that's emerging, especially with the, with the Charlie Kirk assassination. There's strong decades, long evidence showing that political conservatism is associated with a higher need for cognitive closure and a lower tolerance for ambiguity or uncertainty. So in the context of Keats, in the context of Keats information gap, this manifests as an irritable reaching after fact and reason or sometimes after alternative facts in order to more quickly arrive at certainty, order, clear answers, rather than this painful process of lingering in doubt, which I think we all hate. So people who score high on need for cognitive closure prefer definite answers, dislike ambiguity. They're drawn to structure, tradition, decisive leadership. Many studies meta-analysis have found a reliable positive link between this, this measure and conservative political ideology. This is not necessarily a bad thing. I would argue that the left has a similar need we all do as humans. And they tend to fill the gap with emotion based reasoning. And those that don't have no intellectual curiosity at all. They are at the forefront of the total rejection of basic sex characteristics. Some answers are easily found and they tend to create philosophical uncertainty around straightforward facts of life that aren't plaqued by the unknowable characteristics of which we're discussing, like accepting racial differences, that's another one. But it's obvious that the irritable reaching is causing issues with black and white thinking and conspiratorial conclusions on the right. We're talking blindly supporting Israel, this insane conclusion drawing with Charlie Kirk, throwing people over in the dissonant right for minor infractions. The examples are plentiful. Approaching topics with skepticism, it's always appropriate. But filling in gaps with unsupported conclusions drawn from erroneous evidence never is. We have to be comfortable in the not knowing. So closing the information gap, that's the distance between what we know and what we need or want to know without abandoning the search for truth is the central challenge of all elevated thinkers. And the trap is pretending to close it with false certainty. And the art is learning to carry the tension productively while still moving towards better approximations of reality. So for the vanguard, this needs to be dealt with through constant study, constant questioning, when appropriate, viewing the matter at hands in terms of probability, not certainty. Like how likely is it that X happened, that Y happened? What is the best solution given this probability? Then just dealing with the remaining discomfort and uncertainty, even though it's uncomfortable, but for the general population, I think for your average person, thinking like this is just too complex. And so they need to be dealt with through hierarchy. The vanguard develops to understanding of the problem, the best solution. And the hierarchy dictates the behavior of the rest of society based on the judgment of the higher level thinkers. This is the problem with democracy, right? Let me know what you think in the comment section, because I think it is to our benefit sometimes to engage in this black and white thinking, like especially with the gender issue. Like, oh, no, this is wrong. This is right. There is a universal truth about certain matters, but there isn't always. So is this going to be a benefit to us? Or is this lack of nuance thinking destroying the right, destroying the philosophies of the right? Let me know what you think in the comment section. Please get our engagement up. More comments. I read every one of your comments and they keep me up at night and forced me to get some Botox, lots of it.

The master and his emissary is an argument that the Western world is in a conflict of left versus right hemispheres. And a lot of you probably heard verbiage along these lines, left brain, right brain, stuff like that and so on. But this book is very nuanced. It's very technical and philosophical. But one of the things that it argues effectively is that the left brain, which is how we empirically engage with the world, it's how we categorize things, it's how we think in a rational way that that side of our brain, particularly over the last several hundred years, if not since the Reformation, has completely closed off the other hemisphere. And the other hemisphere is actually the source of our consciousness. And the other hemisphere thinks sort of mystically or stands outside of empiricism. It's the mechanism by which we emote. All right. But a moat does not mean to be emotional per se. It means to channel a kind of metaphysical sentiment. And oftentimes when I when I talk and I talk about things that are abstract or

nebulous, you know, some people will say that they don't like it because they're thinking empirically, right? Where's the party? Where's the vanguard? Where's the headquarters? This is all sort of left hemisphere dominant thinking. And it's very limited because it assumes that human beings live inside of a box and that that box is limited by certain variables, right? Power or money or fear when in reality, human beings, a human mind is very much an open system. And what I mean by that is that there are lots of variables that influence how we do things, why we think the way that we do, why all of a sudden we change direction. And those are impossible to model. They can't they cannot conform. They do not conform to mathematical formulas or empirical analysis. They are from the right hemisphere. And I suppose what I'm suggesting to all of you is that this conundrum that the devil's people who want to see spectacular change, they want to see revolution, they want to see transformation, all of these things that I believe is actually in progress, they can't see it even though it's happening, right? These are the people, as you said earlier, Rebecca, you know, I'm on team. Nothing's happening. Oftentimes, nothing is happening in the moment. And then you look back at your life and you say, holy shit, everything has changed. We are in a kind of hemispheric change. Our systems of governance are going to have to change. Scientific paradigms are breaking. It's not to say science is over. It's to say, scientism is dying. Our notion of politics, as I said repeatedly, that's changing. How we communicate personalities that resonate, they're changing. But they're coming from sources that are different, that are new. And it's very hard for people to wrap their minds around that. So I guess the point of what I'm trying to say, folks, is that it's not just that things are changing materially. It's not just that the economy is bad. It is. It's not just that we have a racial mess unfolding in every Western country. It's also that psychically speaking, we are rewiring. We're becoming something. We're moving into a different direction. And that is a higher consciousness, a higher racial consciousness, a higher national consciousness, which is why things aren't falling apart, per se, as much as we are transforming. But that's going to look a little bit different. And we can't see the path with precision. It is mystical. It's from that sort of right hemisphere. That's where we're headed. That's what's going to kick into gear. And that means that we've got to reenvision. We've got to reimagine. And to some degree, we've got to have faith that there is some kind of divine inspiration to this play that we're all engaged in. Because if there isn't, what the fuck is the point of any of this?

OK, now what happens if all of a sudden the Treasury Department revalues the gold that it has on its books at current market value? What that means is that all of a sudden gold is as important, if not more so, than a US Treasury bond. Now, operating in the background, there's been a net exodus out of US Treasury bonds not for the last few years, not for the last 10 years, but as far as I can gather since 2010, foreigners have been net sellers of US Treasury bonds. And at the same time, they've been accumulating a lot of gold, especially over the last few years. So what I'm suggesting to you is that I do not think the Treasury Department will voluntarily revalue and gold, because if it does, that's sending a clear signal that the dollar and specifically Treasury bonds, which is the collateral that backs the US government's full faith and credit, are over. If and when they do revalue, it will likely be in the midst of a financial catastrophe and they have no other way out. Eventually that will come, but they will not do it voluntarily. They will do it when it's forced upon them.

And it's not just the sex trafficking stuff. His financial crimes were arguably more impactful on America than the sex trafficking was. And that's to say nothing of what was the sex trafficking about was a blackmail for Israel. And then you get this whole Iran contra network that he was involved with wrapped up into it. People act like this is so highly

It is cancerous to the core and we can't reform that system. That system is disintegrating in front of us, which is why we're being treated to 50-year mortgages and \$2,000 stimulus checks, which are policies that if you went back even a few years, people would laugh at because they would say this is fatuous and ridiculous. But nonetheless, here we are. And why are these policies being advanced? It's because the system is careening out of control. It's because it is imploding. This is why Larry Fink, who runs BlackRock and everybody in this space, talks about how much of an evil genius he is, he's presiding over a giant Ponzi scheme. And that Ponzi scheme is beginning to liquidate. They're experiencing losses, of course, because it's a fraudulent business model. That's why under the auspices of the Trump administration, Wall Street is desperate to seize whatever concentrations of capital they can get, whether that's via stablecoins or it's your 401k or it's pension programs, whatever, because Wall Street is running out of money and their bubble-nomics scambit, it's just not going to work much longer. The question, however, is what's the power process to use Kaczynski's analogy? He calls it freedom, the highest good to pursue your power process. Well, I think the power process for us in this very troubled time is to live in our own society, to have our own communities. We, as white people who founded and built this country and founded and built Western civilization and all its various incantations and iterations and so forth, that is our power process to live in our own country with a government that represents us and us alone. Nothing else will do. And until we get to that point, we are not going to rehabilitate or resuscitate in any meaningful sense. It is that power process that has been denied to us. Now, that raises a question about what exactly this system is, because a lot of you think that this system is a very carefully orchestrated simulation that's manipulated by a very competent cohort of elites that are operating in the shadows. This is a trope at this stage in right-wing circles. And I have tried to make the case, again, as expertly as I can, to categorically refute that, because it is the 180-degree opposite of that. No, these people are not terribly competent. They're just like this director of federal housing who come up with kakamemi ideas so that they can compound interest, because that's really all they know how to do. And if you accept the premise of what I'm saying, then you'll buy my solution, which is to let the system disintegrate. Now, I've said before to many of you that I'm heavily influenced by the East, in part because I spent a lot of time in China, in Japan, in Thailand, and I learned a lot when I was over there. And their methodology, their thought process, their worldview is very, very different than the way we think, specifically when it comes to something like psychotherapy. In the United States, we have a

problem. We take a drug or we go to a shrink and the shrink confronts whatever our psychological malady is head-on. Well, in the East, that's not really how they operate. In fact, they believe strongly in self-correction. This is, in fact, a Buddhist principle that you allow the person that you're trying to mentor to push the delusion or the illusion as far as it can go so that it collapses within itself. We are in no position. I'm talking about the three of us on this podcast. I'm talking about you listening in this audience. You are not going to dissuade. You're not going to pull people out of the matrix. It's just not the way that it works. On margin, people wake up. And this show is about that awakening. But that is not ever necessarily going to be broad-based because of persuasion. It's going to happen because they push that delusion as far as it can go. And Dinesh D'Souza is part of that illusion. He is a confirmation of exactly what Rebecca said just a moment ago, which, in the wise words of another Asian, Lee Kuan Yew, who is the founder of Singapore, he put it in very stark terms. He said, in multi-racial societies, you don't vote in accordance with your economic interests or your social interests. You vote in accordance with race and religion. That is what is unfolding in American politics today. And yes, the white population is slowly but surely waking up to this, but we cannot accelerate that process any more than we can vote for some octogenarian named Donald Trump to reform and save America. That's not the way this is going to go. The system, in other words, has to break. It has to collapse in and of itself. And that's exactly what it's going to do. And what we must do is facilitate the sort of, we have to awaken within that vacuum. And that's what this show is all about. I'm worried. We're not going to elect our way out of it. What we can do is spontaneously reorganize to prepare for that system's demolition. And whether it's the election of Mamdani, or it's the financial meltdown that I like to talk about, or it's this racial tribalism that's breaking out on the street level, there's nothing that can be done to stop that. We've got to let the process unfold and respond accordingly. Let the delusion collapse in and of itself.

So, I mean, a lot of what you're talking about is just that baked into the cake of life is the destruction, is the death, is the sadness, is the sorrow. And that's what all prophecies discuss. I mean, but we have to continue to try. I mean, I totally agree. No matter how bleak things get, we have to

And now the Latino population and God knows what else based on the large s of that wealth and the institutionalization of our guilt. And that process has expanded and expanded and expanded. And now we're exhausted because the state has been completely turned against us. This is why I talk about the social contract breaking. That's why this is not really about Israel. Israel is a part of this. They're not the epicenter. The epicenter is the broken social contract. And what is a social contract? Social contract at its basic core is that the government, the authority, right, the state represents the people. It represents the ethnos, in our case, the citizenry, and that there is a profound, a legal, a mystical, spiritual difference between a citizen and a non-citizen. That distinction has dissolved. Now there is no distinction. You heard it from the president earlier on the podcast. We need, we need this foreign group. Imagine any other country outside of the Western world saying, well, we need this, that and the other. No country would say such a thing. They might have a limited program that brings in skilled labor that will not confer citizenship upon you. It will not grant you property rights. It will not make you a citizen in the same way as everybody else. That's the social contract and ours has been broken. And when a social contract is broken, that means that the state authority itself, I don't care whether it's called the Constitution or its democracy, you know, or it's the government and the founders who cares. That's all bullshit. When that government ceases to represent the citizen and protect spiritually, legally, metaphysically, and otherwise, that difference between the citizen and the non-citizen, that social contract has broken. However, that's a very good thing because that means that the state can be discharged and we can create a new state. And that's what we're going to do, which is what I've talked about a reintegration. The white population is going to spontaneously reorganize itself in this vacuum that's coming. Why are we going to do that? How do I know that? Because we've done it our entire history. That's the nature of our entire economy. Whether you look at a store, I don't know if you guys have gas stations called Sheets in Idaho. Oh, we have them in PA. They're all over the country.

And the enterprising Italian immigrant who ran the Bank of Italy, he kept his bank open during the earthquake and gained a whole bunch of new clients, which he then used to expand Bank of America into a national company. I didn't know that. Spaghetti nationalism wins.

Look, part of the problem that bedevils people on the right, particularly in the online right, many of them are very smart people who have done an excellent job diagnosing the problems that beligra us. The Jewish power structure, the banking system, right? Zionism, multiracialism, open borders, all of these things, despiritualization, all of these things are accurate. What's the prognosis? What is the actual solution? Well, it's not to look at the past and what bedevils us is a lack of imagination. And imagination is a second cousin of faith to some degree, a faith, a

confidence that we're going to construct new things. This is why I've mentioned Bitcoin before. And I know Dave is even more evangelical about it than I am. Bitcoin is a new technology. It is something new, something different. We've never had anything that can disintermediate financial enterprise before. We've never had social media, online community and connection the way that we have today. These are radically new innovations that enable us to scale movements and reorganize ourselves in ways that cannot be contained in ways that can bring down governments. For Christ's sakes, we just saw a president elected in 2016 without any media support with virtually no grassroots organization. Why? Because of people like Dave Riley and Rebecca Hargraves. This is the future. This is where we are headed. We're going to have to reimagine the way that we organize, but we know that the state as structured is broken and we're going to have to reorganize it. We're going to have to reconstruct it. Yeah, it's going to be messy. It's going to be a violent correction. There's no question about it. But ladies and gentlemen, that's why we have all of these men that are 40 and under sitting around wondering what the fuck is the purpose of their life. This is it. This is what they've been waiting for. What the hell else are they going to do? Get a nine to five corporate job with a slave away for some Indian affirmative action case who's going to take their job as the VP of sales at some point and get the corner office. So right before they get their 20 year pension, this is what's happening. No, that's not what these people are going to do. What they're going to do is serve as the rank and file of this restoration, this reawakening that we've talked about, which is why I focus like a laser on masculinity and particularly young men who carry in their blood, in their psyche, the true consciousness of the nation. That's what's awakening. That's what Fuentes tapped into eight years ago, 10 years ago when he got started. That's the direction that we must go. That is the key to everything. And mom Donnie's election, Trump's failure, his disappointment. This is working in our favor because it is destroying faith in conservatism in the notion that there's a moderate middle path forward. There is none. Our path is the way forward. Awakening is the path forward, spontaneously reorganization and a restoration of order. That is the way forward. That's the way this is going to

And my friends who are Russians, they said, yeah, we'll give you a little bit of money, but you're not going to rebuild that. It's impossible. It will never happen. It's in ruins. This country's in ruins. We're finished. It's over. Well, as you can clearly see, not only did they survive, but they rebuilt it. Civilization is not just a building process. It is a rebuilding process. It is an iterative process. We are not so much in decline as we are figuring out who the hell we really are as a people. That's what this whole process is about is a process of self-discovery. We are coming to grips with who we really are as a white country, as a white nation, and that ultimately is what's going to carry us forward. That's why we're going to, as I say, reintegrate with the state. We are going to enter a post-constitutional order that's going to stabilize this country, and I think we're poised to achieve even greater things than we did in the 20th century. But, you know, obviously it takes so, so long and it's just like not really, you know, it's not, it's very, very hard to fit time in, you know, if you're an adult with like adult responsibilities. So the fact that this AI has come and I can now just like generate a, you know, eight minute

You know, people have experimented and stuff, but no one's done a complete show. Maybe people do like South Park parodies, but I'm the first one that's done like an original complete series. And it seems like I'm still the only one who's doing that. So I mean, just, it's like literally, you know, I've been thinking, I've been dreaming of a tool like this since I was like a kid. I was like, maybe one day I'll just be able to manifest my vision straight out of my brain and manifest them immediately. Wouldn't that be great? Because you know, I'm constantly getting visions and ideas and, you know, as an animator, it's painful to not get them out. I have to get them out at all costs. And so the fact that I can just manifest, and you know, I'll have so many ideas that, you know, with traditional animation, you just have to pick one and then dedicate yourself to it for like six to nine months to make like, you know, a few minute long cartoon. And so you, you know, sometimes it's not the best idea. Sometimes there's other ideas that could have been better, but you just have to pick one and go with it. And now any little frickin' idea or joke in my head, I can just make it happen like immediately. And I'm finding that it is like a snowball effect that now that I have this directorial power that I didn't have as much before because I was bogged down by the intensive labor of hand drawing every single frickin' frame and coloring, filling in every color and doing the bitch work that people usually get Korean studios to do, you know, Korean slave labor. I now am freed up of that process and my mind is really free to make the jokes and come up with the ideas and explore the concepts. So really I feel like I've just evolved light years in the span of a month. And it feels like, I say it's like, it feels too

good to be true. Like every time I go and make a new episode, I'm scared it's going to get taken away or something and I'm almost too scared to start generating again. But it is here to stay no matter what this tool is available and it can, you know, people are installing it locally on desktops. One way or another, I will be able to use this AI forever. And it just feels like a happily ever after moment. It feels like I'm living happily ever after now. That's so amazing. I hear a lot of artists that are bemoaning AI and talking about how it's going to destroy the artistry and film, but nobody's really entertaining this idea that it's going to open up individual creators to tap into their ideas more quickly. And, you know, the AI on the Will Stanzel show, it's so good that if you had told me that you had, you had hand generated everything, I wouldn't have known. I mean, would you?

Although it would be probably more fun to use Korean slaves. I don't want any slaves.

I think just now with this show, people are finally being like, oh, she's still alive and she's in her prime and she's making like the best work of her life now. Like this is, I think, you know, this is possibly better. We're as good at then my best Alfred pieces.

And then we have no idea what their potential would have been. But you really, you really stayed the course. And now it and now it's paying off and it makes me so happy. It makes all of us so, so happy to see it's a testament to like really pushing through when things are shitty. Triumph of the will triumph of the will. That's exactly right. No, for real. Yeah.

Like don't you know, you got to know about crypto if you're going to get involved in it and the risks and everything. But yeah, that was nice. But yeah, that meme man, that was like really weird. Like that I've never I never expected anything like that to happen. Like the point where Elon Musk said it was like, what the fuck is going on? You've tapped into something that has really resonated with people. And I think a lot of it is that we were waiting for AI to prove its usefulness in the creative process. And so we were happy to see that happen. But but there's but it's just funny. I mean, we don't see a lot of stuff like this come out of the right wing. I hear a lot of times that like the right wing is not as creative. And I think that, you know, you prove that that's not true. But watching something like this come out of the right, it's been so much fun for all of us to experience it together. And I think that that's probably why you're getting actual billionaire support. And I DM someone and I was like, how did you do that? And they're like, oh, you got to get an invite code. And here go to this guy's page. He's giving out invite code. So I got a code and I got in and I started playing around with it. And I was like, this is pretty good. And this is actually pretty good with 2D. So I was like screwing around with it for five hours. And then I was like, what if I plugged in a drawing of Will Stansel and I drew him and plugged him in and I made the theme song in like two hours.

And like I said, it's just like kind of a happily ever after moment and it's still all very surreal. So do you have like a do you know how many episodes you're going to do in this series? I'm going to do as many as I like as I can. Because people are like, where do you go from here after the third episode?

And and and then also just like the the aspects of like the trauma that is used to like control that is causes him to have multiple personalities and causes him to have flashbacks and stuff. That element is there with the grok rape. So it's really where it's like kind of a resurgence of Alfred, but in a way that I can really do political commentary now with it. Because the great thing about Will is and what I've achieved here is that I'm finally able to do like political satire and like scathing political comedy. That is also like good political commentary, which something I've been struggling with for years to kind of find that that mold that meld between art, comedy and politics.

And, you know, the fantasy world that Will lives in and liberals live in about that. He doesn't think it's a fantasy world, but that's where the satire really comes in well with like the first episode, which is just like, I'm just going to play him as he sees himself. And as he wants like what he wishes he could do in the world, which is like a superhero among black people and, you know, right. Bring peace back to the streets, you know, And that is that is representative of this this liberal fantasy. I think a lot of them view view themselves as the arbiters of truth and of morality and they fantasize about how they can impose their sense of morality on the world. And that's one of the reasons that everybody's watching this and they're like, because it's representing something broader about the liberal mindset. Yes, in a way that you can't really critique liberalism, you know, it's it's such a good, like, what's the word, medium to to to critique

liberalism because, you know, after a while, it's just like making fun of them and stuff, you know, just like typing and getting like angry and replies to liberals like that. That just gets old and like just being able to make a show and a cartoon. So it's really, I think the best way to to to to critique this to critique this ideology. And thankfully, I'm able to do it. Are you still getting them? Last time we we spoke, it was probably like a year or two ago, but you would have this major resurgence in Alfred because of younger people finding it. Are you still experiencing that? And what is your audience demographic look like now? Yeah, the Alfred's still huge.

And then when I got back on Twitter in 2024, I realized that I had like this huge fan base on TikTok that are like all like Gen Z, Gen A, like young people. And that's like a really rare thing for like, you know, a millennial like me, that's like part of the original Newgrounds people. Most of the original Newgrounds people are still like pandering to like millennial fan basins and stuff. And so if they're even doing work at all, a lot of those people are just like dead. But it's just amazing to have like to really resonate with the youth. And it's like kind of sad, actually tragic because it's it's a very tragic story. It's tragic character. It is a comedy, like it's a dark comedy. But like the fact that kids like relate so much to Alfred and everything is, you know, kind of troubling. But they find comfort in him and they they they love him very much. And I guess that's still going on on TikTok. I, you know, tried to, you know, maybe like go like, you know, talk to the talk to the fans or something. And, you know, be like, wow, like, you know, try and get back in touch with them. But I kind of have to stay away from the Alfred fan base. It's it's kind of insane. There's a lot of like, you know, mentally ill young people that are fans of Alfred. But, you know, it helps it helps them. Like I've gotten so many emails that are like Alfred saved my life. Like, you know, you you made me start animating and animating saved my life. And so that's still going on. Right. I mean, I think it's a date. Like now it's like, I'm glad I have another thing that I can do that's not Alfred. Yeah. I don't know that it's really troubling that they relate to Alfred. But I think that one of the reasons that they do is that they're traumatized by the generation they were born and they're traumatized by society. And when we were growing up, we had a lot of like upsetting animation that we were we were into. Ren and Stimpy was pretty fucked up.

But yeah, I'll probably have some Alfred merch on my fourth wall, too, because I've been begging for Alfred merch. And I'm just like, forget about Alfred, man. Will Stansel is now my best friend. I'm just glad now because it's when you have a big success, like when you're like 17 and you put out one of your big, biggest pieces of work, well, most well known pieces when you're like 17, it's kind of hard to like, you know, you know, you're constantly having to be like, am I going to do something as good as that again? And now I think I have. The one-hit wonder thing. Yeah. Yeah. Well, you definitely. I think I'm better. I think it's better now. And I'm just going to keep getting better. Yeah, absolutely. I mean, who knows what you'll be doing in 20 years. And I also think that this says something about the creative process, too, because sometimes like I paint and I paint something. I'm like, this is a piece of shit. But but it's used. I use it as a building block for the next thing that I do. And so if you guys are doing the creative process and you're getting frustrated, like you just have to keep working. You have to keep working through it because you don't know what the ideas are going to be later that are built upon what you've done that was, you know, what you thought wasn't as good. So I'm just so happy to see this come to

fruition for you. So where where are you politically? Are you still doing modern politics with Warren?

They can't seem to exceed it Well, they've got five six seven fronts that they're fighting abroad We're well versed in those we've talked about those they include states like Iran They include fighting the Houthis they include fighting Hezbollah Hamas Obviously you have the the conflict brewing in the background with Iran Netanyahu has added the propaganda war but then there's the internal war and the fact of the matter is that Netanyahu is taking a country that's very fragile That's divided that has serious sectarian divisions within it I mean very serious commentators people that I trust like Elon Papi have said that Israel was on the path to a civil war before October 2023 and so he took this very fragile and divided state Essentially Consolidated around a hardcore Right-wing religious Ideology alienating a lot of the Ashkenazi Jews in the country and he is now stuck with that coalition and a shrinking population and putting them into a war footing and Needless to say the Jewish population isn't isn't prepared for that They assume that the United States would step in and fight all the wars So I think what you're seeing is the collapse of Israel as the state and the support Domestically the United States as you point out Rebecca that has collapsed and interestingly enough It's collapsed because they're under siege both on the right From people in America first obviously we talk about that at length But it's also because of what's happened on the left and this is the self-destruction that these people Invite every hundred two hundred some odd years and that's what we're seeing on display This is a massive win for us as a country And I think it'll probably be conducive the world peace the question is how much collateral damage? Will there be before you get some kind of a regime change in Israel that stops these crazy wars that I'm sure I don't know

He's a financial elite then you have the Zionists and I would subsume the neocons underneath them And these are people that dominate they tend to be they're overwhelmingly Jewish and they tend to dominate our foreign affairs And they try to plunge the United States Into all manner of conflict around the globe because they want to leverage American military power to create global hegemony and then thirdly Thirdly you've got the revolutionaries and the revolutionaries are people like an Apple Bomb Noam Chomsky, you know, this is David Brock at media matters These are people that want to invert society culturally racially Religiously and otherwise these three groups don't always align in fact They can be quite fragmented But what is absolutely clear to me is that nobody's really in control of the government It's this this notion that there's a monolithic political structure That is a mistake as we've said before there are many different agencies like the CIA that are rogue that have their own interests and The one thing they have they all have in common to be sure is that they undermine the national interest There's no question about that, but it doesn't mean that they're all swimming in the same direction either So this is an oversimplification the other thing is the the leftist mantra It's the haves against the have not suggest that these racial Divides that we have religious divides linguistic divides cultural divides that those are artificial that they're distractions. No, they're not They're fundamental. I think race is the most fundamental divide in the United States today It's the most hotly contested issue in the United States today other than the JQ, which is why we talk about it all the time That's not fictitious. It's not a distraction That is at the epicenter of everything that we're dealing with so that represents a war against white America and its replacement That's what this whole thing is about. It's not the haves versus the have nots or the 1% or versus the 99% There are elements of those things but fundamentally speaking what you have is a government that's completely out of control a government that's been sabotaged and subverted by Foreign interests rogue interests domestically would have you and thirdly a government is just doesn't work anymore a Constitutional framework that is broken structurally Systemically etc. That's the situation that we face that means you could get all manner of conflict I think we're in a revolutionary moment. I think that's the right way to look at it But there's no question that tribalism is ascendant and as the economy really starts to crumble You're gonna see an intensification of that everywhere and that's what we're seeing Chicago Philadelphia Los Angeles it goes on and on and that's only gonna get worse

I started my career in sales and In sales and I I did it the hard way I worked Uh cold calling by a telephone. It's awful. I don't know if you guys have ever had to do that. It's absolutely horrible And uh the first three months were particularly brutal. I did it about four to six hours a day So it's not like I was doing it 10 or 12, but Four to six hours a day just going through a phone book and trying to find clients Not fun And the first 90 days or so were particularly bad I used to I used to go out to my car and I would spend maybe 20 minutes screaming at the top of my lungs Because it was so brutal after that first 90 days I started to break through and I started to understand the dynamics of selling people Of of cold calling itself and yeah, certainly rapport was part of it connecting with people Maybe finding indirectly something that you could relate To them with you know, what have you whatever in any case? I did that and I became very successful As a sales person But I hated it and I hated it because ultimately What you do in sales as I'm sure many people in our audience know is you have to sell a dream You have to sell This sizzle right you have to create A marketing program and draw people in And I I never particularly liked that because I didn't find it all that substantive one But two what I quickly discovered in tech Was that the sales pitch was always More than a few degrees off from actual Delivery from the actual product itself So about a year or so after I started I got into The delivery side so typically there's a sales side We actually had to sell the product you have to grow a client base and then eventually people like me Um, we went to a delivery side We actually implement the product and this could be quite extensive But there's always a handoff after the sales process that goes to delivery And when I took over projects as a as an implementer The first thing that you do is you meet with a client And you go through this process of truth telling so everything that was pitched during the sales process Is then thrown into sharp relief and now you get down to brass tacks and it's usually an ugly uncomfortable conversation because more often than not the salespeople sold the dream and it was a lot of bullshit It just wasn't factual. It wasn't Accurate to what the product actually was it did whatever they Whatever the the client wanted is what it did and it came to me and my delivery team and I had to say Look man, it doesn't actually do those things. Here's what it does do And when we had those conversations And however ugly they may have been from that moment forward all of a sudden things started to change because the the fictitious That the fictitiousness the fantasy of the sales product That was over that story died and then a new reality that was based in foundational truth Ugly truth in many cases all of a sudden that was the rock bottom bottom foundation to build everything And I started with a couple projects then 10 and 15 All of it because of that truth telling we are at a moment in time now Where the sales team which has been operating for the last five to 10 years Which has been evangelizing a lot of the ideas that we discuss Those ideas are attractive. They're drawing crowds

Right. They're entertaining. That's why people watch a lot of these shows But they're not delivering any results yet and they're not delivering any results because as as bad as things Are people have got a choke

associated with martial law or something of that nature basically extra constitutional powers That concentrate executive authority in one particular person or party or group to solve an existential crisis this is uh This is different than saying we need to change our structure of government, right that we need to be Antidemocratic and often this frustrates a lot of people On the right because they don't know how to articulate exactly what they want because nobody wants to live in a dictatorship per se And even for the roman's dictatorship was a temporary phenomenon This is why julia seizer was killed before you had the rise of the seizers in any event. You need a temporary transitional government that Concentrates power and executive authority to solve major problems. This has happened by the way in various forms throughout american history lincoln Ablished extra constitutional powers at the time of his presidency. So did george washington So and a lot of this is associated with the insurrection act for example isan hara did so in the 1950s After uh after the korean war and obviously fdr did during world war two these things have happened before That's what's necessary to solve our our problems now tethered to that We do need constitutional reform and we need to overhaul it in part because this country And this is something a lot of people Particularly conservatives don't understand the reason why the united states succeeded as a nation and i don't like the word experiment Uh the reason why it succeeded as a nation is because of you people listening to this podcast It's because of the tremendous human capital The energy the dynamism the self-governance of the population that settled the united states That's what made us great. This is why we have the podcast This is why we are ethno nationalists because there is no substitute for the white population that built everything The constitution by contrast was always kind of clunky And it didn't really matter all that much Because the government didn't do anything for most of our history until it had to do things and it had to do things during Emergencies like the world wars for example or the great depression We are now in a similar moment and that's why conservatism has failed It's why electing our way out of this out of this problem is not going to work.
