It's not like I have a whole laundry list of tweets lined up to start going over, showing off all the interesting people that I met while I was there, like Adam Back, the inventor of proof of work. He created something called Hashcash in 1997, which serves as the basis for Bitcoin. Without his invention, Bitcoin wouldn't exist.

David J. Reilly

[00:05:25] He's one of the people that is commonly claimed. They say, oh, Adam Back is Satoshi. He's not Satoshi. I don't even think he bought into Bitcoin until 2013. It was several years after it had already kind of bootstrapped. Well, what an idiot. Yeah, well, anyway, so

Adam Back, he's the CEO of Blockstream. He's pretty cool. I saw Michael Saylor. He's worth \$10. 3 billion. His company's worth about \$60 billion.

[00:05:49] No, I think he's just like, he was marching around with like eight security people. And so I think he was just keeping an eye out, laser eyes to see if anybody was like going to try to kill him or steal his Bitcoin.

[00:06:03] I am. I nerded out like so hard. Got to meet these guys. It's Solo Satoshi. They actually, we've got one of their miners right down here. It's actually hashing right now, mining Bitcoin. Adding strength to the network, which is pretty cool, I think. And then I also got a chance to have a longer meeting with the Blockstream guys, which is pretty neat. They make a really interesting layer too. They invented the Lightning Network protocol. They're really awesome, super into free speech, open source, all of that. We have a partnership with them now, the Backlash does. So you can, I'll tell you a little bit more about that. I also got to meet Larry Lepard. He's the author of The Big Print. And I think he might be coming on the show at some point to talk about inflation and how that's going to pan out in America. Also got to meet Rockstar Dev, who invented Bitcoin payment server, BTC pay server. So that's what we use actually to get donations on our website. So I was absolutely nerding out. There's the old Bank of America on fire thing, which was pretty fun to see. But yeah, it was a really interesting conference. I was kind of surprised too, seeing the content of the speeches. So there was one speech with Mike Benz. Now I know he's like an Israeli spy, so that's okay. Like we can all just be aware of that and know that. But what's interesting is that when he got on stage and was talking with the moderator, the moderator basically opened up talking about how we live in a fiat world of consensus, that is very low fault tolerance. So once you get something to about 3. 8% of the population, it's enough for revolution. And so, that's obviously a pretty fragile system. And the idea that we might be switching to something called a Nakamoto consensus, which is much more fault-tolerant, where people are basically allowed to say what they want. And he proceeded to go on and announce to 30,000 people sitting in the room that we are rethinking the post-war consensus and who the good guys and bad guys were in World War II. And everybody starts clapping, going, 'and it's like, what the fuck conference did I just walk into? Also, you know, Mike Benz used to run Frame Game Radio. You know about that, right?

I think this is actually showing my effing account. Great, wonderful. You all know how much money I have now. Not much, but anyway, Bitcoin is great. You can buy it at River with very

low fees. You can keep your savings in River and earn 3.8% interest in Bitcoin, which is nice. So you don't actually have to buy Bitcoin. You can just hold your cash there. And get some Bitcoin. Get some Bitcoin as rewards. You can also go to blockstream.com with our link from our website, and you can pick up one of these bad boys. Their government is bizarre. So this was also a little bit break glass in case of emergency action on his part. I'm glad he did it. I think it was a mistake to enter the government the way he did it in the past. He was the man who won the elections. He should have become prime minister. He didn't even become a minister. And I hope that for the upcoming elections, he will tell the Dutch people, listen, vote for me. I'll be the minister if we win the elections again. Just as Nigel Farage in the UK finally is saying, 'I will be Prime Minister if Reform wins the next elections.' I think this was always a mistake by the rights to say, 'oh, we kind of want to be part in government, but we don't really have to be at the levels of power.' I think this is finally changing and it's a good thing.

[00:27:20] This is going to be the word of 2025 and maybe for the coming years in Europe, and that's the word remigration. It is a term that was originally used, and I don't mean this in a negative way. I think it just describes it most accurately, that it was used mostly on the political fringes. It was used by fringe groups, but it is now coming into the center again, which I think is a good thing. This idea that people are in your country who just got, let's say, a passport yesterday, who commit crimes. Dual citizens, that there must be ways and means to encourage these people to return to their countries of origin. This is something that the field has demanded. The government rejected it. This was the main reason, at least that's what he said, why the government blew up. And this is also what an increasing number of right-wing parties, but also luckily right-wing and conservative commentators are demanding. So this, I think, is going to be the main issue for the coming years. So we're no longer talking as much about assimilation and integration, which is going to be an important topic, but we're talking more and more about the concept of re-migration and how that can actually be executed.

And obviously there's crime and so forth. The point, however, though, I think is that we're all in the same position. And this is not really about remigration. I think what Selner has done is effectively changed the narrative; that's a good thing to be sure. But the reality is, that we're starting to figure out that the democratic process is completely broken, and it doesn't much matter who's elected. And that's what the election of Geert Wilders ultimately demonstrated. Part of the reason he resigned, by the way, is because on condition of his party, which I think is called the Party for Freedom, being the dominant party in a plurality in the coalition government, it was required that he not be prime minister. So already you were off to a very difficult start. But the other issue is mechanistic or functional. If you want to take drastic executive measures, which is what's required to deport a lot of these folks, the democratic process in Europe does not permit you to do that. It doesn't. Neither does the United States Constitution, more or less. Now, some people will quibble with you and they'll say, well, the Insurrection Act might. Maybe, maybe. We'll see. I think it's noteworthy that Trump hasn't invoked the Insurrection Act. That's something I've talked about before. But the takeaway here is that the democratic process, the parliamentary system in Europe, the constitutional form of government in the United States is broken. And it's nothing is going to improve or resolve itself until it breaks completely. What will break it? Probably a financial disaster. Or, if the Europeans, which are currently massing forces in Estonia, sufficiently piss off the Russians, then they're going to invite a military catastrophe. Either way, it will break confidence in the government and then everything will shift in our direction or in the direction of Geert Wilder or anybody else that wants to repatriate tens of millions of migrants across Europe and in the United States. There is no other way to do this. As I say, Every time I do a show, the extreme position will be the only one left. I think we're months away from that. Yeah.

There's a New York Times piece about this this week. The purported deal follows project talks Palantir had with the Social Security Administration and the Department of Education. The reaction from Trump supporters reflected growing unease within conservative circles, indicating a rare rupture between the president and key segments of his constituency. Wow, they really do not understand the right. The controversy underscores nationwide anxieties around privacy, civil liberties, growing influence of technology firms over personal information. And Palantir secured more than 113 million federal contracts since Trump took office, including a recent \$795 million agreement with the Department of Defense. Its data analytics platform, Foundry, has already been deployed at the Department of Homeland Security and

Department of Health and Human Services. Potentially enabling cross-agency information sharing like they're not already doing that. For those of you that don't know about Palantir, it is insidious.

He added that he carries no embarrassment or regret about the acts depicted in the videos. Of course, he should. And then the videos depict consenting

adults engaged in intimate actions in their private lives.

A lot of the ideas that have come to prominence over the last few years started as very arcane, very obscure discussions that were being had online by very small numbers of people over 10 years ago. Now, why is that part of it? It's to some degree because the broader population is starting to sort of wake up to what is going on. OK, that is to some degree. And there's a symbiotic relationship between these two things. Certainly you have people like Fuentes, like like you, Rebecca, like Vince James and others that are sort of whispering to the animal spirits. But the animal spirits have to be receptive. They have to be listening. They have to be audible to that sort of thing. And they are. And increasingly so. And I think the first salvo was Donald Trump's rise in 2016. Because remember, when he was elected president, it was completely befuddling to the legacy media, to the establishment on both the right and the left, that such a thing was even remotely fathomable. In Europe, it was very similar when Brexit occurred. And a lot of people said, well, obviously, it's because they had these sort of alternative networks. Well, that may have been a mechanism. But the broader reality is that the population has reached a point of no return. Minds are open, there's an awareness that our government is not what people say it is; that our countries are degenerating in ways that are completely undeniable at this stage and are affecting people tactically on the street level, the term I use all the time being what's happening on the street level, which you're beginning to see sort of vibrate on Twitter. And orchestrate through the words of people like Nick Fuentes and Vince James and Rebecca Hargraves and so forth and so on. There's a symbiosis going

on. That's one component. The second is that we are increasing.

And the product of that new construction will be new parties, new movements. And yes, a vanguard that will ultimately stitch it together. Where you and I disagree, Rebecca, is I don't think the population is ready for that yet. I think we still have more dynamite to lay to explode the lives of the legacy system because we're not there yet.
