I hope you've done nothing. I have dreams about this. I have dreams where I show up unprepared. Dreams about high school tests still. Oh, man. Yeah, it's just a nightmare. I really got to you. I know. I know. Well, why don't you guys do you want to talk about Health Freedom Idaho? I have a lot of friends in it. They've done excellent work on vaccines. And you were the founder. Yeah. So tell us a little bit about your journey and some of the great things that you guys have done in Idaho. Oh, man.

[00:07:08] It's like, where do I start? It's been about 10 years. And so about 10 years ago, we started Health Freedom Idaho because Dr. Karlfeldt, who's my husband now, was actually trying to be legislated away by the Idaho legislature. He's a naturopathic doctor, and they wanted it to be a misdemeanor for him to call himself a doctor because he wasn't educated in America. He's Swedish. So they only wanted to license American-educated naturopathic doctors. So I had never been involved with politics at all. In fact, I hadn't even voted at that point. I was just enjoying our free state or so I thought, right? And I got active because I wanted to stop that bill. And what happened was, I guess the shackles, like the scales just fell off my eyes. And I just saw that we weren't really a free state. And the good old boys club owned the state. So we were emailing and everything saying, 'Hey, don't pass this bill.' And we couldn't get it stopped. And the co-chair of the Health and Welfare Committee said, 'We're annoyed by all of the emails we're getting.' And I was like, because they were getting thousands of emails. I was like, nobody put you in that position. You ran for that position. So you're annoyed that the people are telling you what they want? So they weren't listening. They were passing the bill. There was 10 days left of legislative session. And now my now husband. um got a lobbyist ten thousand dollars for ten days so about a thousand dollars a day i was there when he made a few phone calls and they went kind of like this you know hey joe remember when our kids went to college and we went to the football games how much fun we had remember that yeah hey don't pass that bill okay i was like what is happening so i

met some awesome people sarah clendenin leslie manukian rosie main and we started health freedom idaho because we realized that the legislature was really listening to groups and not individuals, which is backwards. That's not right. That's not constitutional. So we started Health Freedom Idaho really to protect our access to people like Dr. Karlfeldt and also to strengthen our vaccine laws because that was about the time of SB 277 passing in California, where they took away the exemptions, right, for kids to go to school. So we decided we're going to strengthen the exemptions. And when you ask kind of what we've done, we first held the Health and Welfare Department accountable to the law, which says that parents can opt out for any reasons from vaccines, okay? Any reason. You can put it on a napkin. It doesn't have to be on a form. Right. But at that time, the department was making parents sign that form, that incriminating form that says, 'I'm knowingly putting my child at risk because I'm not doing the chickenpox vaccine.' Right. Which to me sets up a whole CPS situation. Right. Oh, yeah. You're signing over and over, 'I'm knowingly putting my child at risk.' So we got the department to get in line with the law, which means that you can opt out for any reason at any time and you don't have to tell the government why. And you don't have to agree that you're harming your children. That was the first thing. Then we got the daycare exemptions. We got the university's exemptions. So now, next legislative session, and we're going to need everybody's support, we really want to remove the requirement. Why have a requirement when we have all the exemptions? Right. It's just the government tracking your data. Right. So let's just remove it all together. But the big one, the banger, you guys, is that we now have the Idaho's Medical Freedom Act. And that got passed this year, which means no forced or coerced medical. Intervention of any kind ever? Wow, so no mask, no vaccine, no cutting your arm off to go to work, you know, whatever nonsense they say and I know a lot of people are worried about the chip in the hand or whatever. Right, right! No forced or coerced medical treatment of any kind. They can't go chipping your hand, that's amazing.

[00:11:37] You know, the Republicans have a great platform if they really followed it, but they don't. And so it just looks like one big party doing all the same things. So, I mean, even like on a national level, back when ASFA was passed, when Clinton was president, ASFA is what fast tracks our kids that are taken by CPS into adoption. And the Republicans are the ones that ran that bill. And Clinton's the one who signed it, you know. So it's just things like that over and over. I'm like, this is not actually two different parties. And I wanted out of the party that I was just consistently disappointed in. I just didn't really want my good name with the Republican Party who's behaving like they're behaving. And mainly because with Health Freedom Idaho, we're trying to get bills heard, really good, important bills, like rolling back the health district's power to do all things. That's why during COVID they were, you know, doing all things. Right. Luckily, they didn't bust into our homes and vaccinate us because the law said that they could do all things. And when I can't get a Republican committee to hear a bill that rolls back the power of the health districts like this is come on. This is not conservative. This is gross and swampy.
