I think that what's happening is largely a function of the imagination of a tyrannical figure, one Bibi Netanyahu, who has been busily engaged in trying to manufacture war with Iran, as we talked about last week for a long time. However, in terms of what exactly happened over the last week or so, which was a fiasco of fiascos. I mean, to say I've followed politics a long time in my life. I've seen some meltdowns. You know, certainly we've all read about some bastardized operations in the past, things like the Bay of Pigs, for example, or the incident in Somalia that happened with ID that we commonly call Black Hawk Down. But this is one of the most egregious acts of incompetent buffoonery I think I've ever seen. And I say all of that to say this, and this is sort of the dessert, I guess, the show to some degree. What you witnessed, which was sort of a man who may not be in control, as Dave said, but he is still the decision maker. He is still the President of the United States. And look, we know the President matters. That's why he signed his lobby, was desperate to get him into office to do their bidding. So the Commander-in-Chief is still the President and his decision matters. What occurred was some kind of manufactured crisis that was presented to the president to get him to sort of bite. And we're going to talk about the various components of this. But more or less, I think what happened is that the president was led to believe that Iran was on the precipice of getting a nuclear weapon now, that proxies like the Houthis potentially may have had access to that. community led by Ratcliffe, the director of the CIA, seemed to reaffirm all of this. And Donald Trump is nothing if not emotional. And he seemed to have been swayed by this. Now, maybe there were other manipulations that I can't see behind the scenes. In any case, the green light was given. And it seems as though what happened is that the Israelis themselves got caught up thinking that somehow they could swiftly regime change a massive country like Iran, which was always a delusion. And so they went and they quickly stumbled upon a disaster and then called upon Donald Trump to bail them out. And that equipped with the intelligence that was almost certainly contrived both by the IAEA, by his intelligence community, by American intelligence, and by the Israelis. He decided to go. And what has unfolded, I think, will go down as a total disaster, a disgrace of a military operation that, A, didn't actually accomplish anything. And now the president is trying to backtrack. So he sort of stepped onto a proximity mine, blew off a leg, and now he's trying to distance himself from it. I think that's what occurred.

Donald Trump is not a man known for rigorous detail and focus. And method. However, he did bring in somebody in Tulsi Gabbard, who was at a minimum supposed to be a counterweight to the warmongers. And to her credit, she did her job, at least until recently. And she did say Iran was not anywhere closer to having a nuclear weapon today than they were, you know, three or four weeks ago, five months ago, what have you. And he publicly rebuked her because he was exhilarated. He was emotional on television, That's really him. And his personality, his idiosyncratic lack of focus, his undisciplined approach, that has infected his entire administration. And so what did you see? So that means 70% of people do not support continued U. S. airstrikes compared to about half who said they were opposed. However, within the Republican Party, 62% backed further strikes. I actually find it hard to believe that it's that many. 22% were opposed. Republicans were more deeply divided. Some 79% of Americans surveyed said they were worried that Iran may target U. S. civilians in response to the U. S. airstrikes. Of course, I mean, I think that it's becoming apparent to the average American that we are going to pay for this. 4% say they were worried in general about the growing conflict. So, like, this is a serious concern for the average American citizen. I don't know who these people are, who these Republicans are that support continuing airstrikes but are still worried that there are going to be retaliatory terrorist attacks, presumably, domestically.

Remember, Trump said, 'I'm going to think about it for two weeks and then bang, we struck.' I think that's because Israel was getting smashed. Now, we don't know exactly the extent of the damage because there's been a lot of censorship, but that's the first piece. The second, I think, is that Netanyahu and his sort of megalomania has gotten complete control of that government and society. And I think put them on a course that they as a people cannot reverse at this stage. They've gone all in on this Holocaust in Gaza, which Amnesty International just put out a report on calling it a genocide. Tens of thousands have been killed, maybe hundreds of thousands. That has made the state of Israel a pariah, not just with the UN, but with countries around the world, some of whom have expelled the Israeli ambassador. So they've become isolated in the rest of the world. And thirdly, I think that there is a very real sense in the Jewish community in the world, in the Zionist movement, that they have sort of been exposed. In D. C., that everybody knows who's staffing the Trump administration. Remember, Trump was supposed to end the forever wars. He was supposed to be the America-first candidate. He was supposed to reverse a lot of this damage. And yet we're plunged into another war. They've been exposed for that. And so now I think that this sort of survival mentality is beginning to kick in, which is why I think you're going to see escalation in the Middle East, United States. But this is the amalgamation of some compound fractures that Trump has instigated since he became president, failing to end the conflict in Ukraine and come to terms with the Russians, dithering on whether or not to give aid to Zelensky and the Ukrainians, right? The friction with Musk and the failure of Doge, the complete and total disaster that is Dogecoin. And remember, we have a fiscal emergency that's operating sort of in the background. And then, of course, now we get the strike against Iran, which is basically sending a clear message to MAGA that America first is out. So Trump, I think, is a second big loser. Mentally, psychologically, and otherwise, for these things to happen, because when they do, you're going to start to see a counter virality, a counter monologue, if you will. Now, we're not there yet, but the emotional torque that you see in Iran, that you see in Israel, that you see in other countries, it's coming in this one too. There's a sort of virality. When emotional peaks are hit and when all of a sudden you go from zero to 180 degrees. That's what's coming, folks. So get ready for it. And when that occurs, all manner of things are going to be possible. You know, and I say this in part because there's a lot of comments that address some of the things that I say in particular. I say, oh, well, that's impossible. You

know, we can't possibly reverse this or do this. Look, when that virality of emotion is so forceful, when it inflames itself, all of a sudden, truly shocking things happen that you never thought were possible. That's what you're seeing in Israel. That's what you're seeing in Iran today. And eventually, it's coming here too.
