And so this is the group that we're talking about. So Palantir. Since 2015, the IAEA has used Palantir's Mosaic platform designed for U. S. military ops to monitor Iran's nuclear program under the JCPOA. Mosaic processed over 400 million data objects, including satellite and social media, enabling 60-plus surprise inspections. But during an AMA, Palantir's Peter Thiel was asked, is Palantir a front for the CIA? Front for Palantir, most likely referencing to their CIA funding and founding. They did get a lot of seed funding from In-Q-Tel, by the way. Even more recently, as recent as last week, Thiel fielded a question about Palantir's use in Gaza, which he said, IAEA Chief Rafael Grossi coordinating directly with Israel. Iran says the IAEA became a conduit for Israeli intelligence, echoing earlier claims from 2018 when Mossad raids uncovered internal IAEA files. The June 2025 IAEA resolution, the first in 20 years, citing 400 kilograms of 60% enriched uranium. Days later, Israel bombed Natanz, Fordow, and Efsahan. Iran accused the IAEA of providing cover for the strikes. Meanwhile, Palantir's CEO held a 2024 board meeting in Tel Aviv in solidarity with Israel. And Thiel's Circle, which pushed for Trump's 2018 JCPOA withdrawal, of a surveillance network blurring the line between arms control and regime change. Iran has now limited IAEA monitoring. Critics, including Russia's Yermakov and analyst Ali Veyaz, warn that Palantir's data could produce false positives from dirty inputs like Israel's 2018 file dump triggering inspections or war based on politicized intelligence. International law is dead. And now we've got these links. Files that were recently published by Iran, Iran, whatever so this is all properly sourced and vetted, it does look like Palantir is firmly in the driver's seat and one of the things that I pointed out a couple weeks ago, Palantir took out a massive ad in the New York Times on October what day was this 18th, 2023, so just a few days after the October 7th issue and uh you know here is Alex Carp in 2024 saying that the U. S. will likely fight a three-front war against Russia, China, and Iran now how is he saying this? Is he saying this perhaps because he is going to instigate the war between the United States, Russia, China, and Iran? Yes. Because that's exactly what it seems like is going on.

What I think is important for everybody to understand, so there was a paper that was written, I think in 2009, it's called Which Path to Persia? Options for a New American Strategy Toward Iran. Maybe you can bring it up on the screen, Dave. Which Path to Persia? And this was a paper that came out of the Brookings Institute. Tanks, nonprofits that basically are part of the war machine inside Washington, D.C. And this policy paper laid out the case for how a war with Iran could be brought on and how we could essentially leverage some kind of a manufactured event between the state of Israel and Iran to actually pull it off. However, even though that paper was hawkish towards Iran and was sort of fueling the fire today. Listen to this statement that comes from that document, which is advocating more or less for a war between the United States and Iran. Nuclear weapons lack the delivery systems to threaten the United States directly. Further, its economy is anemic and even if substantially reformed will probably never provide the base for Iran to make itself a challenger to the United States on par with Nazi Germany, Imperial Japan, the Soviet Union or Communist China. That is a pretty declarative statement from a hawkish policy paper, more or less laying the case out for war with Iran. So the first thing that everybody needs to understand is that Iran in no way, shape or form poses a threat to the United States. There is absolutely no reason in our national interest as Americans that we should be engaged in this conflict whatsoever, passively, actively, directly, indirectly or otherwise. You must understand, because if you're driving your truck in the middle of Idaho or you're working in some kind of a grocery store stocking food or what have you, what Iran does has virtually nothing to do with the United States. So why is the president of the United States demanding in all caps on Twitter and sending carrier strike groups to the Middle East as we speak in preparation for what looks to be a major war between the United States, Iran, and God knows who else. The reason is because we don't have a deep state. We have a Jewish state. And this has been the case for a long, long time. The Netanyahu Likudites finally, after decades and decades, as Dave talked about a moment ago, have entrenched themselves in the entire political economic apparatus of the United States government, the whole thing. And just to be very clear with you, because we started this discussion today talking not about people that are in AIPAC, not these sort of neocon advocates that are at some think tank like the Institute for the Study of War, nothing of the sort. These are servicemen that are supposed to represent the United States and its interests. Our National Security Advisor or CENTCOM commanders, what have you, all of whom are basically in collusion with a foreign power. Now, that's basically three. There are three components here. There's the elected government. The elected government, I think, is almost uniform in support of some kind of a war against Iran. It doesn't matter whether you're talking about Ted Cruz or Lindsey Graham or any number of the Democrats. The entire Democratic Party, the entire Republican Party is committed to this war. They say publicly, what they say on Twitter, what they do when Netanyahu comes to the United States, with what Americans think: over 90 percent of the public thinks this is a bad idea. It's probably higher than that. That tells you that your elected government no longer represents you and there's nothing you can do about it. That's the first piece. The second piece is that you have a military industrial complex and you have a sort of national security intelligence apparatus that's completely rotten to the core. It doesn't matter whether you're talking about the CIA, the NSA, you're talking about DOD, which has its own intelligence. As Rebecca said at the outset, only one person in Trump's administration with any real force opposes this. And that's Tulsi Gabbard as the director of national intelligence. And we saw what the president had to say about that. The third and connective tissue here is AIPAC, the American Israeli Political Action Committee. It ensures that they get the generals that they want in DOD. It ensures that they get the bureaucrats running the government apparatus. It ensures that the politicians on the Hill who were elected, conform to whatever they want. That is why now, after decades and decades of this slow insinuation, Netanyahu finally got his war, because there was simply nobody left outside of Thomas Massie and a handful of others to say no, even though the American people, even though all of you listening to this, absolutely stridently oppose any escalation in the Middle East from the forever wars. So the first component here is that this has nothing to do with the United States, and it demonstrates the complete subversion of the U. S. government. Now, to your question about nuclear weapons and so forth. This is not a war about nuclear weapons at all. This is a war that is reminiscent, I think it's in lockstep, with exactly what happened in Iraq. And if you go back to 2003, in the lead up to that war, the very same arguments were made by the very same people, that Saddam Hussein had weapons of mass destruction, that he posed a threat to Israel, which he never did, and that the United States desperately needed to interdict and regime change. Well, we did. And what was the result of that? We destroyed the country of

Iraq, which is much smaller, by the way, than the country of Iran. It's like about 30 million people in a largely flat territory in which we had, at least at that stage, a lot more support in the region than we did, population against us. We turned over half of that country to Iranian militias, and then we spread that instability across the region in Libya, Syria. Basically, what we did is we terrorized an entire region. Now, fast forward to today, if the goal is regime change in a country the size of Western Europe, with a population that's almost 100 million people that has been preparing for this for decades, because as Dave said a moment ago, they've been threatened for decades. Now we have a war, a war in which a major power backed by great powers is prepared to do us serious harm. And that's exactly what's going to happen. Will there be a nuclear exchange? What exactly do the Iranians have? I'm sad to say I don't think it matters at this stage. Pakistan already said, I think over the weekend, that they would provide the Iranians with the nuclear support that they needed. Iran's cause, because the rest of the world believes now that the United States is a warmongering power, and there's only one way to deal with that, and that is escalation. Now, one other thing I want to say just briefly is that it appears, and I'm not 100% sure on this, but it appears as though in order to make this operation happen, an operation that was almost certainly planned 12 months in advance by all the intelligence agencies in the was complicit in this deception, that he lulled Iran into a trap, that he maintained the pretense that he wanted peace talks, that he effectively meandered or walked Iran into lowering its defenses so that Israel could attack it. I say that all to say this. We now have a war, and I don't see how this de-escalates.

What we do gather, based on our own intelligence, is that Israel has a nuclear triad. That means it can launch nukes from ships, it can launch nukes from land, and it can launch nukes from the air. How many do they have? Well, it's estimated that they've got 90, but that they can produce hundreds if they need to. Plutonium. They have also threatened to use nuclear weapons before. They threatened during the Yom Kippur War and the Six-Day War. So the delineation here is extremely important. Now, a couple other things that are very important to note. Is Israel underneath the United States' nuclear umbrella? No, they're not. NATO members are under the nuclear umbrella and Japan and South Korea. Why? Because those powers don't have nuclear weapons. Israel has nuclear weapons. We're not obligated to defend them. In addition to that, there is no formal alliance that obligates the United States to do anything on behalf of the state of Israel. Do you see where I'm going with this? I'm speaking to an audience that cannot speak back. We have been had. We have been subverted. There is nothing in our governmental structure, our constitution, the international community, our international treaties in general, that involves us in anything that Israel does. We have been subverted by a Jewish elite that has gotten control of the entire Congress, the government, and as I said, the military industrial complex and the national security apparatus. This is how dangerous the situation is. That's why electing a president would never make a damn bit of a difference. Yasser Arafat died in 2004. There is conjectural assessment that he was poisoned to death. And C, stressing self-reliance in a new strategic cooperation with the United States. The policy of clean break under the policy objectives mentioned 34 actionable goals to achieve these objectives. Among these objectives. And this is important. The most important was to contain, destabilize, and roll back regional challengers. You may have heard Nick Fuentes say earlier this week that the only way that Israel sees that they can be safe is to destroy everybody around them, and I think that that's totally true. They had five actionable goals, challenging Arab countries as police states lacking in legitimacy, fortifying regional alliances, working with Turkey and Jordan to insert hostile Arab tribes into Syria; yes, military action in Iraq, Syria, Iran, Lebanon for containment, striking selected military targets in Syria without the U. S. support and physical involvement. Actionable goals were not achievable. So Israel brought in the United States in the implementation of the policy of the clean break. And they did that in a subversive way and above board, which is why we're seeing so much outright support; The U.S. Administration in Washington does not survive in the office without the support of American-Israeli Public Affairs Committee, the most powerful Zionist lobby in the United States. A clean break towards 2000. The United States made the plan for seven wars to destabilize and roll back countries, having the potential to challenge Israel. It was the brainchild of Netanyahu. The United States had the good military force to do the job. Going by the Israelis' playbook to remake the Middle East aligned with

What that's doing is that's creating a war between Israel. The House of Islam, and the House of Islam is what two billion Muslims on this planet, a billion of whom I think live in the Middle East. You have to understand that this is a region that's already very fragile, in which there are bombshells everywhere that could go off at any time. And what I mean specifically by that is if you take Egypt, for example, Egypt is run by a general military regime. They're under tremendous pressure to do something about what's happening in Gaza. And if they don't, that regime could fall. The same thing is happening in Jordan. There's also pressure on the Saudi regime to do the same thing. And the Gulf Coast countries are in the same position. In other words, the whole region is on the cusp of coming down hard on Israel and the confederated governments that have been bribed or extorted to support it. In other words, guys, is a paradigm shift in the Middle East. Now, in addition to that, you've got a war in Eastern Europe, a war between Russia and the United States by proxy in Ukraine. Because of landscape, because of the strategic overview of the region itself, but because of the entire world, the global south, the global majority, who, by the way, has all the industry, the rare earths, the supply chains, the trade relationships and alternative payment gateways such that they could obviate, if not completely isolate the United States and the Zionist-dominated countries in Western Europe. For this purpose the re-entry vehicle is equipped with a liquid propellant thruster system for attitude control enabling it to perform continuous and pseudo-random trajectory changes. This forces the ballistic missile defense interceptor and its kill vehicle to deplete their fuel reserves, which were designed for targets that cannot significantly alter their trajectory outside of the atmosphere. Once the exo-atmospheric MARV completes its evasive maneuvers, it is put on a precise ballistic trajectory to hit its intended target unguided. The thruster attitude control system puts the re-entry vehicle into a steep dive angle and it's put into a spin traveling the atmospheric re-entry phase unguided but at a very high velocity; Its impact velocity of over Mach 8 means that most endo-atmospheric ballistic missile interceptors with hit-to-kill warheads lack the necessary reaction time to compensate for motion fluctuations encountered during re-entry.

[01:30:13] Capital ships, one of which was an aircraft carrier. And I think there were something like 15,000 to 20,000 sailors that were killed. Now, why was that? Why did that happen? Well, it happened largely because we were operating with 20th century platforms, which is what capital ships are, in very shallow water, what they call littoral water, against 21st century technology, no defense if you're floating on the surface in the littoral, which is exactly what Donald Trump is doing with our naval forces. Now, in addition to that, you have to remember that Iran has integrated air defense. In fact, their air defense system is one of the best in the world. And that's why I said earlier, all systems are going to fail. But that means they have sensors, they have command centers, they have missiles, they can quickly re-engineer and rebuild it. And I think that's effectively what you're going to see happen. In addition to that, They have officially the estimates are that they've got between five and ten thousand ballistic missiles, hypersonic missiles, things of that nature, which I think have a two-thousand-kilometer range. All right. Can basically strike across the Middle East. I've heard anecdotally that they have a lot more than that, that they don't have five to ten thousand. They may have tens of thousands. I don't know. We're going to find out. But the point of all of this is as follows. Number one, warfare has changed. We're not fighting Leyte Gulf, all right? We're fighting in an environment in which lethality from the air, in which precision strike missiles can devastate forces in ways we've never experienced before. Part of this is what's happening in Ukraine, all right? The Russians are using devastating aerial power and bombardment against the Ukrainian force in ways that we've never seen before. So number one is that warfare has changed. Has been preparing for this for a long, long time. And then number three, and this speaks to your question, Rebecca, which is, well, what are the consequences going to be? Look, Iran has the capacity to shut down key choke points like the Straits of Hormuz, through which about 20% of global oil passes at any given time. Now, that oil and natural gas doesn't come to the United States, but it goes to China and it goes to

other major powers in the world who will, I think by necessity, be involved in this conflict if we take on Iran. So you can see how crucial, not just from a geostrategic standpoint, that this war potentially could be, but from an economic standpoint, it could be substantial as well. And remember that if we go to war with Iran, if other powers are involved, what does that mean for a very fragile U. S. economy that I think is already in a recession, for a government that's desperate to finance its debt through U. S. Treasuries? A lot of which are bought by foreign investors. Well, you're going to see a fire sale out of U. S. Treasury bonds. And that means that our deficit, which is only going to compound because we go into a recession, it's going to explode the fiscal situation even worse. That is where we're headed. And I'm not even being creative with what more could be done. There could also be, and this is something we have not talked about on the show tonight, there could also be terrorist attacks in the United States. Filtered who's coming into the country over the last 20 to 30 years. We've got millions of people here and almost certainly terrorist cells or capable militant groups that could do us harm to our bridges, our tunnels, our nuclear sites, et cetera, et cetera. So this is extremely dangerous. And if we engage, I think it's going to go off the rails.

Based on our experience using Patriot battery missiles, for every missile you shoot down, it's like two or three that you have to launch, which means that you're depleting your stocks at a lot faster rate. Secondly, it appears as though Iran is using a lot of their older munitions, a lot of their older missiles, to absorb those Patriot missiles and basically eat away at that stock. So, yeah, I think, I don't know about 10 days. A lot of that will depend on the volume that's launched from Iran. But the Iron Dome, as you can see on the screen, right, as we showed earlier this evening, cannot hold up. And remember, Israel's the size of New Jersey, folks. And Iran has thousands upon thousands upon thousands of missiles. In the hopes that they could regime change very, very quickly. Every day that passes that there is no regime change in Iran means that Iran gets stronger and Israel gets weaker. That's a fact.

And then that could cause downstream effects to us. That could affect our trade negotiations with China. So I don't think it would be detrimental, at least not to us in the immediate sense, but it would just catalyze a worsening of the global economy. Inflation would probably get worse. My guess is that while we have the energy supply, it might take some time to make up for the 20% that's offline temporarily or disrupted. So it would be at a minimum inflationary and it would intensify a global recession. But I think we could weather the storm. Now, if things get worse, if there's escalation of violence, if our ships are sunk, that's when things get really dicey. And as I said, I think that's where we're headed.

Now, that is down a bit to maybe 25 percent, so the more they threaten uh to close the straits, the more they kind of decentralize from that. And I believe Saudi Arabia also recently opened a pipeline that kind of bypasses the whole thing from Oman to the other side.

And the genesis of this anxiety, this insecurity, goes back to the Shah falling and the rise of Ayatollah Khamenei in 1979. That was the turning point, because Iran and Israel were not necessarily on bad relations for a lot of their history, okay? It was after that 1979 revolution. Things have completely changed in the sense that Israel is desperately trying to provoke Iran. But Iran sort of takes one step forward, then another step, and then another step. So it seems to me that they've actually handled this pretty well. And part of the reason I think so, or I think they have, is because

they're also trying to court international opinion in their favor. Whereas Israel said, 'fuck international thinking or fuck international consensus.' We don't care. They basically said, 'if you don't agree with us, you're an anti-Semite, right?' Iran has taken a very different track, and I think it's served them well. So they are slowly escalating. If this gets into a full-fledged war, they'll target our forces. They'll target oil pipelines across the Middle East if they have to, because then it will be about survival and nothing else. Let's hope it doesn't get to that point.
