BREAKTHROUGHS IN THE TREATMENT OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AT CU ANSCHUTZ: PRESENTED BY. DR. HUNTINGTON POTTER.

Dr. Huntington Potter is a Professor of Neurology, a member of the Linda Crnic Institute for Down Syndrome, and the founder and director of the University of Colorado Alzheimer's and Cognition Center. His research focuses on the mechanistic relationship between Alzheimer's Disease and Down Syndrome including the development of novel therapeutics and their testing in animal models and human trials. In a recently completed CUACC trial,



Dr. Potter and colleagues showed that three weeks of treatment with a natural human signaling protein, GM-CSF, FDA-approved for other disorders, partially reverses memory problems and blood markers of brain damage in Alzheimer's disease patients. A longer trial is underway. CUACC researchers have also found that two well-known psychiatric drugs block a key step in the Alzheimer's disease pathogenic pathway in the laboratory and improve memory and clinical diagnosis toward normal in Alzheimer's patients taking the drugs for their approved indications. Further tests are underway, and a clinical trial is being planned.

FIELD TRIP: WILD ANIMAL SANCTUARY

The Wild Animal Sanctuary offers an incredible 10,500+ acres of natural habitats for its rescued animals to enjoy. It is home to more than 600 rehabilitated animals. Their three facilities represent the largest carnivore sanctuaries in the world and are designed and built like no others in existence. We will hear from Founder and Executive Director, Pat Craig upon our arrival. Pat began saving captive wildlife after learning that thousands of "surplus" animals were being kept in tiny cages in the back of zoos all across the country, with many being euthanized on a daily basis. Pat set out on a mission to help save these animals by building a small rescue facility on his family farm outside Boulder, CO. At age 19, Pat became the youngest state and federally licensed person in the country, as well as the first person to build a sanctuary dedicated to saving large carnivores. Pat's vision has led 40 years later to the oldest and largest nonprofit sanctuary in the world dedicated exclusively to the rescue of captive exotic and endangered large carnivores that have been abused, abandoned, exploited, or illegally kept. He has also pioneered the art of building large acreage species-specific habitats, allowing rescued animals the opportunity to live together and roam freely within large natural spaces.



Through a unique partnership with Metro Denver Crime Stoppers, United Data Connect has solved seven murders, the oldest from 1963, one rape, and identified the remains of a young woman after 27 years.



One of the greatest wildlife spectacles in America occurs every year within a day's drive of Denver during the spring-time migration of over half a million Sandhill Cranes across the Platte River in Nebraska. All around the world there are other magnificent cranes that share special places with different human cultures. Ken Strom, who managed the Audubon Crane Sanctuary on the Platte, uses colorful slides of the birds and their habitats to illustrate the stories he tells about the Platte and other unique places where cranes are



revered and received as international ambassadors of peace and hope. A wildlife ecologist who retired after a long career with the National Audubon Society, Ken traveled the world to assist crane conservationists and learn about the cranes of their countries. The information in his presentation will also help you to plan your own trip to Nebraska in March and to better appreciate the experience you will have among the cranes.
