# Marisa McPherson - Jr/Sr High English

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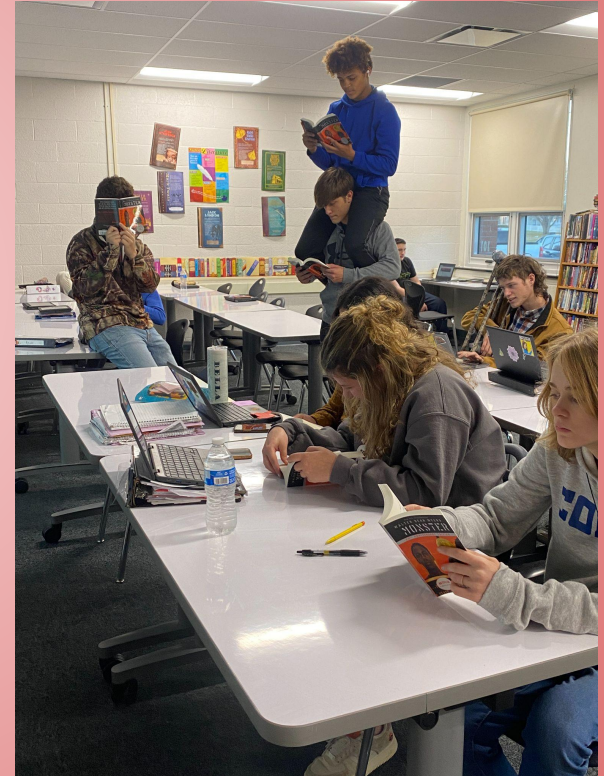

We are very proud of the work she is doing with these students!

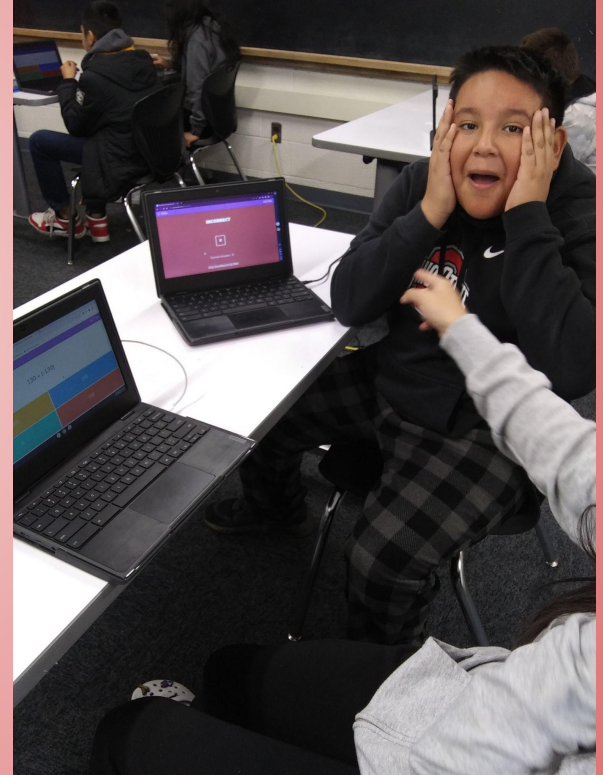

# Cheryl Van Camp - Jr/Sr High Math

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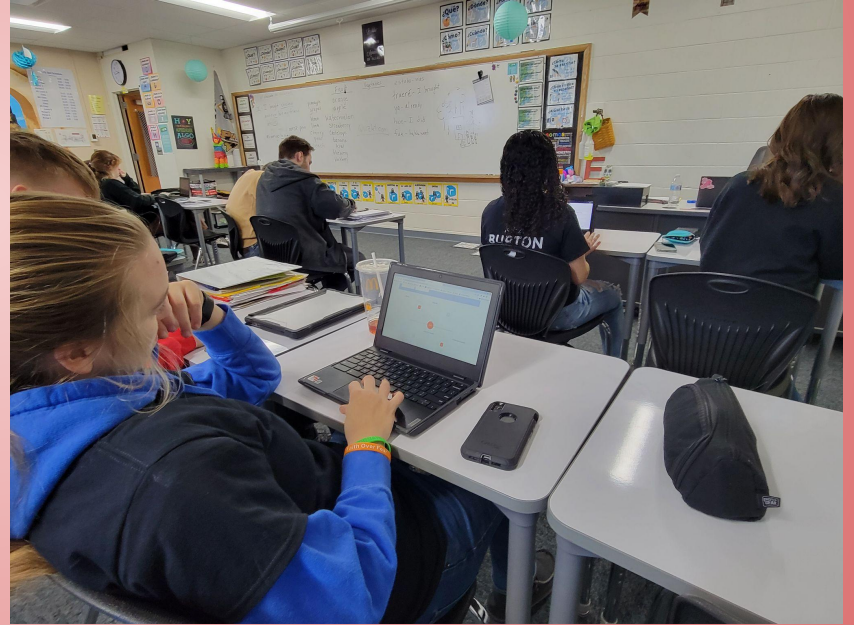
I subscribe to two online sites, WordWall and Blooket. I also will be using the remainder of my funds for supplies that allow us to do more in class.

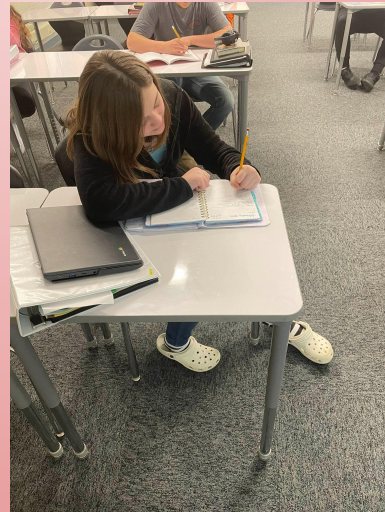
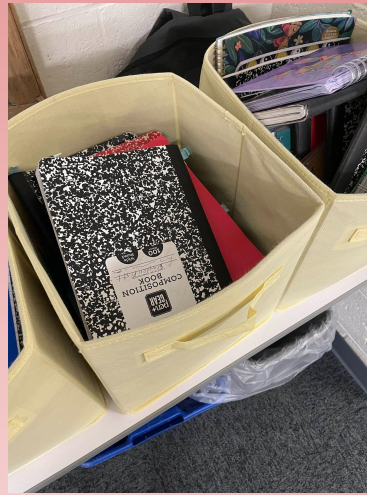

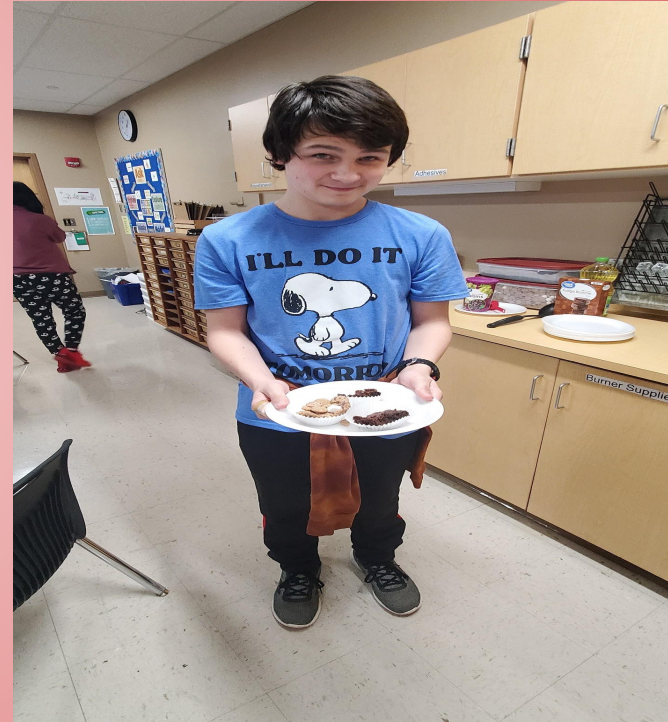
# Nancy Whitted

# Erica Calhoun - Jr High Science

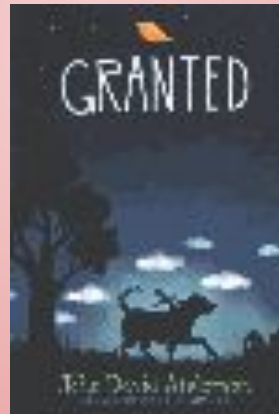
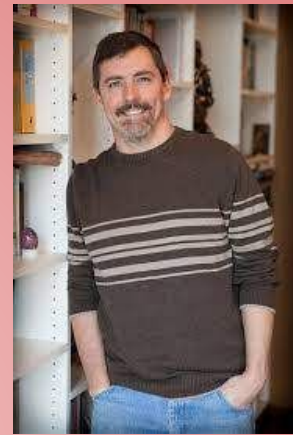

Thanks to the grant from the Alumni Association, I was able to fund some activities for the AVID Class of 2023. We used the funds on a field trip to visit IVY Tech in Richmond, Indiana, where the students met with Vice-President of Admissions and the Chancellor, who helped answer their questions about their future plans and helped them enroll in a TACOU class, which is a free IVY Tech class they will take during the spring semester under the support of their AVID class.

We celebrated their enrollment in this college class by having lunch at Olive Garden and visiting Two Sisters Bookstore in Richmond.
