### Pastor's Portion April 2021

<sup>25</sup> Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, <sup>26</sup> and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

John 11:25-26 ESV

In the past year we have been surrounded by so much that threatened to drain the life out of us all. Last year we weren't even in the building for worship at Easter; the COVID-19 pandemic was raging. Since then 543,000 people in the US have died from the virus. The pandemic threatened to kill our economy, our schools, and our social behaviors. It drove us away from our families and friends; as a Pastor I couldn't visit people in person so as not to spread the virus either from me or to me. It all felt like death!

The feeling of loss was overwhelming, like it was for Mary and Martha as their brother Lazarus had died and laid in the tomb. They felt so helpless, so hopeless; so do we sometimes Where was Jesus in all of that? Where has Jesus been throughout? Jesus knew that His friend Lazarus had died and He knows the experiences that are "killing" us too. Does He care? YOU BET HE DOES! He came to the tomb of Lazarus looked death straight in the eye and made one statement to Martha and to us: *I am the resurrection and the life.* Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, <sup>26</sup> and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die.

And then He asked one question: *Do you believe this?*" That question is the most important question of all. Is Jesus who He says He is? Is He really the resurrection and the life? YOU BET HE IS! Jesus conquered death and Jesus has victory over the grave. Nothing could destroy Him and nothing can destroy us. The greatest news this Easter is: "Fear not, I am the first and the last, <sup>18</sup> and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades (Rev. 1).

And like Jesus: ... in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. (Romans 8:37).

So here's the question: Do you believe that Jesus is the Resurrection and the life?

Let's let Martha's response be ours this Easter and every day: Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world."

And with that trust; all that was once doom and gloom slowly, but surely goes away.

National Grant: LWML Reaches 2019-2021 Mission Goal!

### Chesapeake District Grant – <u>Faith and Works Enterprises</u>, Baltimore, MD – \$5,000


In support of the Southeastern District's vision of ministry to every zip code, Faith and Work Enterprises, Inc. was established in 2017 in partnership with Emmanuel Lutheran Church as an innovative nonprofit ministry around the mission of "Standing with local neighborhoods, building capacity for meaningful work and holistic wellbeing" to serve people in the 21217 zip code, and more specifically the inner-city neighborhood of Sandtown-Winchester in West Baltimore. The threefold ministry of Faith and Work Enterprises incorporates a Gospel-centered approach focusing on 1) Community Stabilization, 2) Workforce Development, and 3) Long-term Financial Literacy and Holistic Wellbeing. Community Stabilization helps people connect to supportive services for the essentials of daily living (ie: housing, food, transportation, drug treatment, and mental health services) to create stability in preparation for employment. The Workforce Development program will include classroom training and a practical working experience in the self-funded social enterprise of Pennsylvania Avenue Chocolates, deigned to provide the men with stipends and a venue to practice the lessons learned in the classroom. The Financial Literacy and Holistic Wellbeing component of the program is designed for graduates of the Workforce Development program as well as other residents in the community to provide training and support in the areas of social, physical, financial, community, and spiritual wellbeing. The long-term vision is to establish a mission church that will provide Christ-centered ministry to serve the people in the Sandtown-Winchester community for the long term, nurturing their holistic wellbeing with Christ as the foundation, and establishing relationships in a community that is slow to trust anyone from outside which takes a lot of time and consistent presence.



### News from the Hoech Family, our Missionaries son in Central Asia:

In February we gathered a team to translate the story of the Woman Caught in Adultery, John 8:2-12, into oral Dungan story form. It has been many years since our last translation project, and only one of our former Dungan translation team members is able to work with us now. But the night before we were to start, she and her children became sick.

We knew the other two Dungan teammates both have limitations. R. has lived in the multi-ethnic capital city so many years that his Dungan is rusty. On the plus side, he's a professional emcee and an excellent public speaker. On the other hand, Zu. speaks perfect Dungan, but she is shy and uneducated and has difficulty holding all the details of a two-minute story in her head. We decided to try this short, simple story with them and see how it went.

The first translation day was both exhilarating and exhausting! The highlight was three hours of oral "Bible study." We listened to several Bible versions, watched a video, acted it out, drew a storyboard and discussed every aspect of the story including application to our own lives. However, translating it into Dungan and then trying to record this first draft proved challenging. Good audio editing software helped us overcome. We finally put together an accurate, meaningful Dungan first draft. Now we were ready to test it with people who had never heard it before.

Visiting these testers individually and recording their insights helped us discover what was unclear or misunderstood. How encouraged we were to hear what these Dungan listeners learned in the process. They said:

Everyone sins, and we should not condemn each other! No sin is too great for God to forgive!

Jesus is the Light, and people who follow him leave their darkness!

We met again to incorporate the testers' feedback and record our improved story in final form. It has already been shared dozens of times via cell phones. We plan to put it on a Dungan website along with dozens of our earlier stories and use social media campaigns to generate interest.
