"No," said Pooh after a bit. "No, I don't think I do."


"That's okay," said Piglet, and he came and sat beside his friend.

HYMN NOTES - SILENT NIGHT! HOLY NIGHT!

When this hymn was written in 1818 by two church leaders for their own mountain parishioners, they had no way of knowing how popular this hymn would become. Joseph Mohr, an assistant priest in a small town high in the Alps, was moved to write the words for a new Christmas hymn after he learned that their organ was broken. He then took the words he had written to Franz Gruber, the church organist, who wrote a simple tune to fit the words. At the Christmas Eve service that night, they sang their new hymn to the accompaniment of Gruber's guitar.

Soon after Christmas, the repairman who came to fix the organ acquired a copy of the new hymn and helped to spread it throughout the Alpine region. In addition, the four children of a local businessman began singing it at local fairs and festivals in an effort to attract customers to the booth where the family sold their handiwork. 'Silent Night' was published for congregational singing in 1838 as part of a German hymnbook. First used in America by German-speaking congregations, it was soon translated into English and is still sung in almost all Christmas celebrations.
