Dear friends in Christ,

This Lenten season, we will have the opportunity to walk with Jesus in the light of the cross. The Lenten services will be held at noon and 7 pm. The theme this year is "Facing the Cross." For Maundy Thursday we will take time to consider the Passover dinner and Communion. In light of that dinner, that service will begin at 6 pm since it requires a little more time to accomplish. Good Friday service will be held at 7 pm. Devotional books are available as another tool to help us focus our journey through Lent. Easter Services will be held at the normal time of worship with a meal between.

Passover Seder

I just wanted to share a few words regarding the Passover Seder we will be holding on Maundy Thursday. We are not listing this as a Passover Dinner because the dinner portion of the meal would add a great deal of time to the event and may frankly be too long for some to make it to the end. The intention of this event is to recall the roots of Communion to the night when Jesus shared the last supper with His disciples. The ceremonial or remembrance part of the meal looks back at the exodus and the close connection between those events as they relate to the freedom from Egypt, and our freedom from sin, death and the devil. The evening should take between an hour and an hour and a half walking us through the Christian understanding of what has been done by Jesus and the Jewish population for generations. The Passover is not currently able to be held as it was in the time of Christ because with the destruction of the temple some of the elements essential to the Passover are not able to be obtained. During the appropriate place in the service, we will celebrate communion together. Because of the amount of wine that is used during the celebration, we will be using grape juice for all the cups including communion. We would regret having someone arrested on the way home from church. Please make sure that you sign up for this event to assist us in our purchasing needs. Thank you so much and God bless our journey facing the cross of Jesus.



Stephen Ministers use prayer as part of the caregiving process. Prayer is how we communicate with God. Prayer is how we express our concern for our care receivers, family, friends, and neighbors who touch our lives. Philippians 4:4-11 reminds us to turn to God in prayer. Specifically, verse 6-7 reads: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." It's important to remind our care receivers that prayers don't get answered based on what we want, but rather on what we need. Dr. Charles Stanley stated that there are 3 possible answers to our prayers:

- 1. Yes, and your request is granted
- 2. Wait, the time is not right.
- 3. I have another plan for your life.

In Paul's final instructions to the Thessalonians, he reminds them to "Be joyful always: pray continually: give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus". (5:16-17). When people are in crisis they may pray for peace (or good health) to come back into their lives. We need to remember that God's will overrides our desire. At the same time though, we must remain sensitive to our care receivers needs and ask them specifically what it is they want us to pray for to help them cope with their crisis.
