Pastor's Portion October 2020

As the weather begins to turn cooler and even to cold; we keep our eyes on the thermometer. The dictionary defines a thermometer as an instrument for measuring temperature, the amount of heat or cold. One thing that we don't want to have happen is for our faith in Jesus Christ to grow cold. October is the month during which we celebrate the Reformation. Martin Luther began to notice that the faith of the church had gotten pretty frosty. Priests weren't teaching the faith as they should've been and most families did not know the basic teachings of the Bible—the 10 commandments, the Apostle's Creed, the Lord's Prayer etc. Faith in Jesus Christ had gotten cold and was almost frozen to death.

We have a similar situation in the world today. Jesus predicted that this would be the case as the end drew near He said to His Disciples:

Many will fall away and betray one another and hate one another. And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold. (Matthew 24:10-12).

When the temperature drops we seek ways to get warm—put on more clothing, grab a blanket, turn on the heat, start a fire in the fireplace, wood or pellet stove. We know what to do to get and keep warm. But do you know how to warm up your faith when it grows cold? Like fuel for your fire, stack up more of the Bible to fuel your heart, stay connected with Christian friends, who will encourage your faith with their stories of how God works in their lives, as the Apostle Paul suggests: *Speak to one another with psalms, hymns*,

and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your hearts to the ... (Ephesians 5:19)., stir each other up. Help others and share the Good News of the Kingdom of God to others who are frozen and need to warm up. These are the things that will keep our faith hot. We need to stay "on fire" for our Lord. Jesus also explained to his disciples after describing how the love of many will grow cold; that proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom would be important:

And this gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come. (Matthew 24: 14). So let's turn up the heat on our faith and let it radiate to others. Let's keep the world from freezing to death! There is a song that describes this action by Kurt Kaizer: It only takes a spark to get a fire going, And soon all those around can warm up in its glowing;

That's how it is with God's Love, Once you've experienced it, You spread the love to everyone.

You want to pass it on.

Would you like to warm up this world's faith? Then PASS IT ON!

Evangelism at Work!

I want to thank all of those who came up with the door knob hangers. As Christians, we are called to spread the Word and welcome others to worship with us. Members have gone door to door reaching out to our neighbors and invite them to join us in online worship.

And - it's working! GoDaddy (who hosts our website) reports that we had 46 visitors to our website during the last week of August! In the month of August, we had 176 visits. LWML Mission Highlight

National Grant – <u>Training for Local Church Workers –</u> Mission Training Center, Africa - \$62,650

In villages across Ghana, Kenya, Malawi, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda, and Zambia, most local congregations are led by helpers, evangelists or seminary trained, and ordained pastors. Both the pre-seminary and post-seminary men are eager for opportunities to study theology in a community which will enable them to better serve their congregations. To enable those whom the church has called into service as lay leaders of these congregations, The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod Africa Mission Training Center provides continuing education opportunities for local pastors and their wives. The course may be taught by a church leader, a local seminary professor, or a missionary engaged in the work God has given him. This grant will provide basic theological training for lay leaders of congregations who serve under a pastor responsible for between five and 15 congregations. The training material allows the local pastor to work through a total of 22 workbooks (over two years) with his lay leaders. Lay leaders gather with their pastor for 5 days once a month. The program provides limited financial assistance to offset the costs of food and transportation. Paid Mission Grants – No NEW grants paid.

- The new florist will begin providing flowers in October. So, if you signed up for altar flowers after September, please follow the above guidelines.


Thanks to all congregation members who sign up for altar flowers. It is such a pop of color, and such a gracious way of honoring friends and family.

News from the Hoech Family, our Missionaries son in Central Asia:

While the number of soy farmers and acres planted in Kyrgyzstan continues to grow year by year, our soybean site was reaching capacity. Seminary prepared me well for cross-cultural gospel proclamation, but I must have missed the class on seed processing plant construction! Feeling a bit overwhelmed, what could I do but trust God? Soybeans are a tool for us to bless farmers in a practical way and to bring them Good News as we interact at our worksite, in their fields and homes. The expansion of our processing facility has taken more time than I thought. But God has been teaching me to take one step at a time as far as I can and trust Him for what's next.

Engaging the Dungan with the Gospel and starting the first churches of Dungan people is in some ways like this construction project. I know the result will come, but how long will it take? I feel inadequate, sometimes overwhelmed, without enough resources. Yet, God provides all that is needed, including YOU! Thank you for your prayers and financial support!
