

## January LWML Mission Highlights

Read below to learn more about one LWML National grant and one LWML Chesapeake District grant. The mites we collect at church from our mite boxes on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of each month support these mission projects that touch the lives of people here and throughout the world sharing the message of Jesus's love.

### National LWML Mission Grant #6 – 2025-2027

#### Biennium

The core of Phil's Friends mission is based on Matthew 25:36 - I was sick and you visited me. In the past 18 years, Phil's Friends has sent nearly 60,000 care packages and more than one million Cards of Hope. This ministry supports anyone with cancer regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, or income level. It costs \$100 for one year to support a cancer patient. This total includes the care package, 12 Cards of Hope, and postage. The care packages are hand-decorated, and the contents are customized according to the age and gender of the recipient. They are filled with simple, practical comfort items that cancer patients can use during their treatments. Phil's Friends is 100% donor supported. This grant will purchase supplies for care packages and Cards of Hope and will pay for shipping and postage to support 1,000 cancer patients for one year.

### Chesapeake District LWML Mission Grant #8 – 2024-2026 Biennium

**St. John's Lutheran Community Jobs Program – Farmville, VA -- \$5,000** This grant will create pathways in the community through the establishment of a jobs program to prepare participants for meaningful work and lifelong skills in the Farmville, Virginia, region.

#### January 2026 Food Shelf Newsletter Article

**Proverbs 3:27:** "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to act."

In December, we provided gas and rent assistance to 2 neighbors and donated 20 pairs of socks, 30 emergency (Mylar) blankets in addition to 230 non perishable food items. GrabNGO lunch supplies were also donated.

Overall, in 2025 we assisted our neighbors by:

- Helping to pay for electric, gas, rent and short hotel stays.
- Providing lunch meats, cheese, bread, peanut butter and jelly for sandwiches and fruit distributed weekdays by Love INCs GrabNGo lunch ministry.
- Providing sheet sets, disposable rain ponchos, emergency thermal (Mylar) blankets, socks and hand warmers for Code Purple Providing emergency food boxes for needy individuals who may stop by our church for assistance.

Overall Donating:

3,080 non perishable food items and \$5,100 in monetary donations

Needs Met:

29 requests for assistance totaling \$5,155

## Ooooo ... We Have a Mystery! Can You Help?

Michelle and Pastor Nuss started a Visual Faith Ministry shortly after they arrived at Christ Lutheran. Visual Faith activities use drawing and writing to help us focus on God's Word and remind us of God's presence in our lives. We had workshops hosted with St John's, Dover, at our church for our LWML Zone, several Prayer Journal workshops for our own congregation, and even Bible Studies using Visual Faith activities. With a Thrivent grant, Michelle and Pastor Nuss purchased supplies and materials to use with our Visual Faith activities. Some of these materials included supply kits containing high quality colored pencils & markers, erasers, pens, & pencils, stored in individual glass mason jars. These supply kits were used this summer in July and August when Michelle hosted a Visual Faith Bible Study, titled "Psalms With Stories." For 7 weeks, over a dozen women gathered every week for Bible Study. It was a wonderful opportunity to study and worship together.

**Now, here's the mystery!** When Michelle moved at the end of summer, she placed the Visual Faith supplies in a copy paper box labeled **LWML** in the Banner Storage room. In November, plans were made to use the materials for a December activity. Michelle was called as there was a misunderstanding regarding the box location. While she was on the phone, the box was located in the Banner Storage room, with all supplies labeled and neatly organized. Two weeks ago, when the supplies were needed, they could not be found. Multiple people looked in the storage room and other areas of the church, too. The supplies had ... **DISAPPEARED!** Can you please help us solve this mystery? Do you know where they might be?
