From the Pastor: What We Do...Because He First Loved Us My day seems incomplete if I don't make the time to have a morning devotion, reading from the devotions produced by an organization called Our Daily Bread. The devotion for July 17, entitled "Loving Jesus Most," really hit home with me. It's very brief, and I wanted to share it with you in its entirety.

The members asked why their church was buying a steeple. Was this the best use of God's resources? What about feeding the poor? The pastor replied that the funds came from donors and needed to be spent as they wished. "Besides," he quoted Jesus, "you will always have the poor among you" (John 12:8). The pastor quickly apologized for his flippant, out-of-context remark, which led me to wonder, What was Jesus' context? Six days before His death, a woman anointed Jesus' feet with expensive perfume. The disciples were disgusted. Why wasn't this perfume sold to help the poor? Jesus replied by quoting Deuteronomy 15:11: "You will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have me" (John 12:8). Jesus often cited Deuteronomy, so He knew what was written a few sentences earlier: "There need be no poor people among you, for in the land the Lord your God is giving you . . . , he will richly bless you, if only you fully obey the Lord your God" (Deuteronomy 15:4-5). Perhaps this was another reason for Jesus' rebuke. Poor people existed only because Israel hadn't obeyed God's instructions. Now the poor were being used to distract from Jesus—the true Israelite who would fully obey to the end.

We need not choose between Jesus and the poor. We love people best by loving Him most, and loving Him most inspires us to love others best.

Reflect & Pray: How do you help those less fortunate? How does the life of Jesus and the things He taught inspire you to share with those in need?

Now let me add just a couple of comments:

I thank God daily that this congregation, as long as I've been a member, has not fixated on facilities alone (the "steeple" part of ministry) but has shown a concern for the poor, as evidenced by your support for Love In the Name of Christ and Redemption City.

#### **Pastor's Portion Continued**

Only by the grace of God have we avoided the other extreme of thinking our help for the poor ends when we've provided them with what the Lord's Prayer calls "daily bread," things such as clothing, food, and shelter. We know that Jesus warded off the temptation of the devil to turn stones into bread and thus gain a large following. Jesus did so by quoting Deuteronomy: "Man does not live by bread alone," but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. Only as we're serving up a generous portion of Jesus, the Bread of Life, will anyone we touch be saved from sin to eternal life.

Our Vacation Bible School, beginning July 28 and running through August 1<sup>st</sup>, gives us a chance to put love for Jesus and love for people, rich and poor, into action. I praise God for all of you who have volunteered to help with everything from snacks to teaching to administration.

One new way we have opportunity to help someone in need and spread the Gospel is by getting involved in Concordia Seminary's Adopt-A-Student program. You can sponsor me on my 65 mile ride through Pocomoke State Forest on August 23<sup>rd</sup>. One Hundred percent of the money raised will go directly to a first-year student preparing for the Holy Ministry, and we will correspond with this student and lend further prayer and financial support throughout the year.

If you're not feeling especially loved today—and we all have those days—your homework is to read two short passages: Deuteronomy 7:6-8 and 1 John 4:10-16.





2025-2027 LWML National Mission Grants Announced at National

Convention

In Omaha, Nebraska, during our National LWML Convention, June 26-29, our 2025-2027 National Mission Grants were announced. Voting had taken place in May through computer by delegates from each LWML zone across our synod. Christ Lutheran is part of the DelMarVa LWML Zone covering the DelMarVa peninsula in the Chesapeake LWML District consisting of Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, and Washington, DC. Five members from our zone attended the national convention. A 2.6 million dollar goal was approved by delegates and 33 mission grants were selected. These are the first 2 projects to be funded through the mites we collect through our mite boxes to share the message of Jesus to the world.

1. Regional Disaster Response LERT (Lutheran Emergency Response Team) Shower Trailers - LCMS Office of National Mission, Disaster Response Ministry, U.S. - \$81,500. Shower trailers will be brought to every location LERT serves in disaster response providing much needed facilities for the communities being served.

2. Help for Ukraine's Orphans and Displaced Persons - Orphan Grain Train, Europe - \$100,000. Orphan Grain Train has locations across the United States serving communities in our country and around the world. This grant will pay shipping for all the containers ready to be shipped throughout the US with food, clothing, and medical supplies for the people of Ukraine.
