

!CROCHET TURTLE!



Today, I will show you how to crochet a small, cute turtle!

Now before we start crocheting, we need a few notes on what colours and what materials we will use. For this pattern you can use any combinations of colour of wool you like, as long as it is DK yarn. You could use a black and white combination or a navy and light blue, but in this pattern, I used white and turquoise.

Abbreviations:

MR - magic ring

ss - slip stitch

st(s) - stitch(es)

[12] - 12 stitches at the end of the round

sc dec - single crochet 2 stitches together

2sc - single crochet 2 in one stitch

sc2 - single crochet 2 in 2 stitches

What you will need...

- 50g white dk yarn
- 50g turquoise dk yarn
- 3.50mm crochet hook
- black embroidery thread
- safety eyes (any size)
- stuffing

bottom of shell

MR:6sts [6]

2sc in each st [12]

(2sc, sc) x6 [18]

(2sc, sc2) x6 [24]

(2sc, sc3) x6 [30]

(2sc, sc4) x6 [36]

finish and attach to top of shell
and stuff

2sc in each st [12]

back legs (make 2)

ch 6 [6]

ch 1, turn, sc in each st [6]

MR:6sts [6]

2sc in each st [12]

(2sc, sc) x6 [18]

ch 9 [9]
