





# DEDICATION ACKNOWLEDGED WOODSTOCK SHOW VOLUNTEERS

The Woodstock Memorial Show AGM held in March marked some big milestones, with outgoing President Ben Johnstone acknowledging three individuals with Lifetime Memberships. The contributions that these individuals have made over many years and continue to make have helped make the Woodstock Memorial Show what it is today!

Mr John Cooley is a strong advocate for the Woodstock Memorial Show. A steward in the prime lambs for 25 years. The instigator of Tractor Pull steward from the late 1990's until 2024. He served as Vice President for 5 years and President from 2006 to 2008. An individual whom also has tirelessly sought community sponsorship on behalf of the show body.

Mr Paul Dresser, a surname synonymous with the Woodstock Memorial Show. Paul introduced the wool section to the show in 1969 and stewarded the section in its early years. He also instigated the Prime Lamb section in 1976 with a long

standing association as steward. He served as Treasurer from 1971-1988. He has also served a term both as Vice President and President. The family and the business of the family has had a life long association with the show. Paul was appointed show patron in 2022.

Mr Kevin Graham has been an active competitor in the Woodstock Show for many years. Kevin instigated the popular tug-o-war event in 1980 through until 1986. He also instigated the woodchopping event in 1995, now a major event at the Show, attracting a strong contingent of competitors and spectators. He has been and continues to be the Chief Steward of the woodchopping event from its inception in 1995 to 2025. He has been chief gate steward for 36 years. Most significant though is the contribution Kevin makes behind the scenes, with countless hours of maintenance and mowing in and around the showground and seeking sponsorship for the show.


### **WOODSTOCK'S PIGEON MAN**

Ken Sigsworth has been a familiar face in the village of Woodstock since 1970, when he and his wife settled there. Originally from England, Ken arrived in Australia as a £10 pom first working in rural New South Wales, embracing the Australian lifestyle, before putting down roots in the Woodstock community. He and his wife, Jullieanne quickly fell in love with village life—the close-knit atmosphere where everyone knows each other, and at one time, everything a family needed could be found right there in town.

Ken's passion for pigeons began early. As a boy of nine or ten in England, he started keeping and racing pigeons, a hobby that connected him with nature, competition, and quiet moments. After moving to Australia, he helped Jullianne's family race trotters and, for a while, left the pigeon world behind. But after a ten-year hiatus, it was his daughter Janet who rekindled his love for the birds—she surprised him with two pigeons, setting him on a path back into the racing world.

Now a member of the Cowra/Woodstock Pigeon Club, Ken finds joy and challenge in every aspect of pigeon racing—from breeding and training to the thrill of watching them return home. He purchased his original birds from a breeder who left Cowra, and over time has developed a strong bloodline. Falcon attacks remain a constant threat to his flock, but the thrill of competition keeps him going. Ken's pigeons race from July to October, often competing with clubs in Bathurst, Parkes and Grenfell. Racing pigeons can reach incredible speeds—some in large clubs have been recorded flying up to 2,400 metres a minute. Ken once had a bird fly from Roma, Queensland, all the way to Woodstock, leaving at 7am and arriving home at 6pm—a remarkable feat of endurance and instinct.

Homing pigeons have a long storied history as reliable messengers, dating back thousands of years to ancient civilizations such as Egypt, Greece, and Rome, where they were used to carry important messages over great distances. Their incredible navigational abilities made them invaluable during times of war, especially in World War I and World War II. One of the highest honors awarded to animals for bravery is the Dickin



Medal, often referred to as the "animal Victoria Cross." Instituted in 1943 by Maria Dickin, the founder of the People's Dispensary for Sick Animals (PDSA) in the UK, the medal recognized acts of extraordinary bravery by animals serving with the armed forces. Several homing pigeons received the Dickin Medal for their heroic missions, including carrying critical messages that saved countless human lives under dangerous conditions.

For Ken, pigeon racing isn't just a hobby—it's a lifelong passion rooted in patience, care, and a deep connection to home.

# ST MATTHEW'S ANGLICAN CHURCH WOODSTOCK 2024

2024 was a most memorable year for St Matthew's and the village of Woodstock, as we celebrated the 120th anniversary of the current church building. The church foundation stone was laid on May 30th 1904 by Mrs Harry Glasson.

The current congregation celebrated at our service on Sunday 2nd June with prayers and blessings and a special "120" cake for morning tea after the service. Over the years many parishioners from the village and district have donated their time, gifts and skills to ensure the church still stands in good order.

At the end of 2024 St Matthew's Anglican Church was the only church still functioning in Woodstock. St Matthew's continues to only have one service a month held on the first Sunday of the month. There were eleven regular services conducted on the first Sunday of the month and very well attended services on both Easter Sunday and Christmas Day. The average attendance for the regular monthly services was eleven parishioners. With favorable grass-growing conditions through most of the year, it was necessary to continue to undertake an extensive grounds maintenance program to present the church grounds in a cared-for condition.

The email contact to all the St Matthew's parishioners and where possible SMS messaging of service dates and time was continued during the year. Contact was made by phone to those who were known to be unwell to check on their well-being.

Through negotiations with the Diocese, the shortfall in the funding for full-time employment of Rev Jono Williams up until his resignation in mid-October was able to be provided from the Glasson Bequest Interest Account. The legacy that was left to St Matthew's by the Glasson sisters is truly appreciated in assisting the continued operation of our very special Church to service the Woodstock district. We are grateful to LLM Ross Burnett for the services that he conducted when



required during the year despite his additional commitments following the former rector's resignation.

Special thanks to the Rev Ben Connelly of St John's Anglican Church in Cowra who very kindly offered to conduct the monthly services for November & December together with a very special service on Christmas Day. A well-deserved thank you to Mary-Ann Wright for her wonderful musical skills in playing the organ when available during the year, which was greatly appreciated by those attending the services.


