FROM THE PROGRESS ASSOCIATION

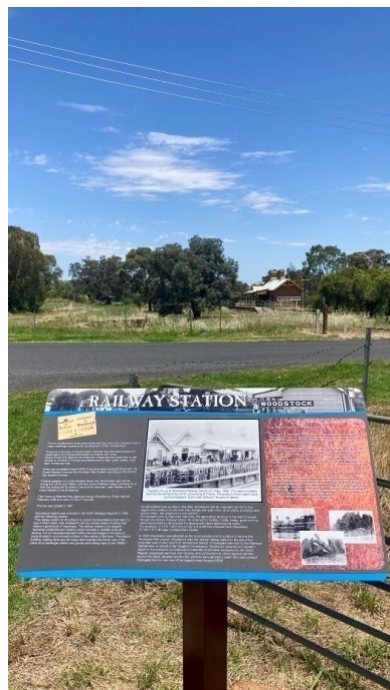
In late November three representatives from Woodstock, along with representatives from other shire villages met with nine Cowra Councillors and the managers of council departments to discuss updates and progress in relation to the Local Strategic Plan for Villages in the Cowra Shire. On behalf of the Woodstock community we raised the issue of footpaths that were outlined both in the Local Strategic Plan for Villages 2020 and the 2014 Pedestrian and Cycling Plan. We also raised the desire to have a campground/caravan park within the village. We are awaiting an outcome on these matters.

We continue to scout for funding opportunities in regards to the

restoration of ghost signage, upgrade of tennis courts and inclusion of a multipurpose court.

'Let's tell some Stories' project funded by Foundation of Rural and Regional Renewal is complete! Story boards have been installed at John Vane's burial site, the Woodstock Soldiers Memorial Hall, the Woodstock Railway Station, and Parkes Street. CLOSURE OF CATHOLIC CHURCH

After much prayerful contemplation and consultation, the decision has been made to close the Woodstock Catholic church for worship. This difficult decision has been prompted by the low and declining church attendance and the ever-increasing maintenance costs associated with these beloved places of worship.

These churches hold a special place in the hearts of many, and the prospect of their closure is undoubtedly met with mixed emotions. This decision was not made lightly and was done with the long-term sustainability and well-being of our entire parish community in mind. The memories, traditions and spiritual significance associated with these places are acknowledged, and the Parish is committed to providing support and guidance as they navigate this transition.

This beautiful church has served the community of Woodstock for almost 70 years, bearing witness to countless significant events, full of memories from days past, and carrying within its walls our Catholic heritage and traditions.

How it all began...The first priest visited Woodstock in 1853 to celebrate Mass at Sheet-o-Bark farming station, a few kilometres from present day Woodstock. In 1892, after the arrival of the railway line, this location was replaced by a galvanised building on a two-acre paddock in Carrington Street, called the Church of the Sacred Heart. It was officially opened by Bishop Byrnes.

In 1905, the church at Woodstock was listed as St Brigid's. Father O'Kennedy, parish priest of Cowra, travelled out on horseback to say Mass. He would stay overnight in the home of Mr Larry Purcell. It was on one of these visits that Mr Purcell died in the arms of Father O'Kennedy. 1918 saw the arrival of four Brigidine Sisters to take up residence in the two-storey building on the corner of Carrington and; Parkes Street (next to St Brigid's and now privately owned). This building was large enough to encompass their living quarters, classroom space, and a temporary church at the back. The Sisters oversaw a flourishing Primary School and Intermediate Certificate High School. The Sisters of St Joseph took over in 1963 until its closure in 1969.



Over the years, there was much effort put into fundraising by the Woodstock community, and Father McMahon in particular, to construct a new building. More than 1000 people attended the blessing and opening of the current St Brigid's Church on 21 October 1956, officiated by Cardinal Gilroy, the first Australian to be elected to the College of Cardinals. It was a gala occasion for the community and according to the Cardinal, "Everything seemed to be smiling, the heavens, the countryside, and it seemed as though the Lord was looking down on the people of Woodstock and saying 'You are doing very well indeed!'"

In 1964, Woodstock was proclaimed an independent parish with Father Tim Reen as Parish Priest. No presbytery existed at the time and so he accepted the hospitality of Mrs Mary Mallon and her sons Peter and Jack. The Parish closed in 1974, with Woodstock once again becoming part of the Cowra Parish until the current day.
