One of the hurdles the Progress Association faces is available funds to complete projects, we will be undertaking some grant applications in the near future and contemplating a community event in coming months. In the meantime one of our primary focus remain the installation and completion of our feature entry to the Woodstock village. With another high priority of the Association the renovation of the community notice board on the corner of Parkes and Rankin Streets and the replacement of the highway signage of both the highway approaches to the village. Discussions surrounding these projects will be undertaken at the next meeting on 28th February.

WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR WHAT?

The Woodstock Soldiers Memorial Park is situated on Crown Land and is managed by a community land manager made up of VOLUNTEERS. Positions are advertised approximately every 5 years, these volunteers apply to the Crown and are appointed by the Crown. The community land manager owns the mower that undertakes work in the park and all fuel is donated by an anonymous member of the community.

The **Woodstock Showground** is also situated on Crown Land however is managed by Cowra Council, any enquiries relating to the Woodstock Showground should be directed to Cowra Council.

The **Woodstock Lions Park** is also situated on Crown Land and is also managed by Cowra Council.

The **Woodstock Common** is also situated on Crown Land but is managed by an appointed community land manager.



SOLDIERS MEMORIAL PARK DEVELOPMENTS

Recent improvements in the park include the first section of the concrete pathway funded by Round 1 of the Drought Communities Funding, a compulsory component of the funding was that all work be carried out by local contractors. The car park area was funded by the Crown Lands Reserves Improvement Fund and completed by a local contractor.

During 2020 the Community Land Manager submitted a grant application for the annual Crown Lands Reserves Improvement Fund, to secure funding to complete the concrete footpath, this work amounts to \$22,000 in value and has been approved. Work will commence as soon as **possible**. The previous granite path was intended to fit more naturally with the environment however did not withstand the elements and is now a hazard to pedestrians.

The Community Land Manager is also awaiting an outcome on a pending Aboriginal Lands Claim over the Soldiers Park that was placed in 2007. Once resolved, a development application will be lodged with Cowra Council for the construction of an disabled amenities block, funds totaling \$70,000 have been secured for the project through Round 2 of the Drought Communities Funding Programme. It is just a waiting game now.









2020 dealt this community organisation a year of challenges financially, however with the receipt of some helpful grants, upgrades and ongoing maintenance have continued.

Partial funding was received from NSW Sport & Recreation for a defibrillator. The defibrillator was purchased from Lifesaving NSW and has been installed next to the canteen door. Continued financial support from Cowra Council has assisted with the cost of annual insurance. The Council have assisted us with financial support each year and without their support we would not be able to keep the pool open. Cowra Council have also assisted with funding to update the male and female amenitities. Funding was also received to paint the inside of the canteen. This work is yet to be completed.

Additional partial funding from Cowra Council to purchase a pool cleaning robot was also secured. The robot is placed in the pool each night when the cover is placed on the pool. Pool maintenance is a major task for the volunteers. This work is carried out, along with the chemical testing and lawn mowing, by a relatively new comer to

Woodstock, volunteer Jeff McInerney. Jeff has taken over from Ken Sigsworth, and his contribution is greatly appreciated by the Committee.

A massive thankyou to Ken Sigsworth for his contribution over the last couple of years. He worked tirelessly to keep the pool in tip top condition during the swimming season.

One of the major expenditures for the pool is the need for chlorine to sanitize the pool. After lengthy discussions with NSW Health we have received permission to convert the pool to salt. The committee are currently investigating options and hope to be able to apply for a grant so the conversion of the pool can be carried out over the winter break. A substantial reduction in costs and volunteer hours is hoped to be achieved.

At the recent Woodstock Swimming Pool AGM, Simone Gough resigned as the Committee President due to work and family commitments . Lee Brien was nominated for and accepted the roll of President. The other positions on the committee remain unchanged.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FUNDS SHOWGROUND UPGRADE

In March 2020 the Woodstock Memorial Show organization were successful in securing \$124,999 to facilitate the Roofs, Rails and Restrooms project.

An additional 3 toilets and 2 showers plus change rooms have been added to the southern side of the toilet block. This work has been conducted by Cowra builder Bruce Thurtell.

The original ringside grandstand has been dismantled and re-homed with the Starr brothers.

A new covered area was erected in January 2021 with a kiosk to be installed in coming months.

The relocation of the cattle rail is yet to be completed. An undercover area will be constructed to house animals and a fenced parading area will be installed for public safety.

All works are to be completed by June 2021. This project is being managed by the Woodstock Memorial Show, but Cowra Council remains the Land Manager of the showground.
