compared to 2 years ago


 Pittsburgh = 41% decrease over same period


Across PA gun homicides have decreased


Pass Our Common Agenda To End Gun Violence.

The following evidence-based policies can help save many of the lives lost to gun suicide, mass shootings, community-based homicides, and unintentional shootings in Pennsylvania:

- Lost or Stolen Gun Reporting
- Child Access Prevention Laws
 (Safe Storage)
- Extreme Risk Protection Orders
- Universal Background Checks



Lost or Stolen Firearm Reporting









Significant reduction in traced illegal gun movement for states with lost or stolen laws.



CHILD ACCESS PREVENTION LAWS - SAFE STORAGE



PA has no legal requirements for safe firearm storage

Prevents:

- Unintentional shooting
- Youth suicide
- School shooting
- Firearm theft

Education/Resources + Legal Duty is Best











Extreme Risk Protection Orders

Extreme Risk Protection Orders temporarily remove an individual's firearms so they can get the help they need before it is too late.

HB 1018



May 2023: passed the PA House of Representatives



This bill sat for 400+ days ignored, in Senate Judiciary Committee

Policy Solution: ERPOs

Background checks won't stop criminals from getting a gun.

In 2021, PA background checks stopped 29,062 gun sales to prohibited individuals.
