Supporting Cambria's native Monterey Pine forest and the wildlife that live in its unique ecosystem is Greenspace's established practice. Tonight we celebrate Greenspace's next 30 years of service to Cambria and the forest to coastline landscape we value.



Shirley Pittman (1929-2013) attended the Art Institute of Chicago and Chouinard Art Institute in Los Angeles. When she was sixteen, she won 3rd prize in a competition in California that was juried by Salvador Dali. Shirley studied with Rex Brandt, Milford Zornes, Dong Kingman, Carolyn Lord, Dan Burt, Roger Armstrong, Frank Webb, and Don O'Neil.

Since moving to Cambria, Shirley had painted in the SLO Plein Air Festival several times. She had also participated in the Carmel Festival, painted instruments in the Mozart Festivals, and won Best of Show in the Aquarius watercolor exhibit two years in a row. She was awarded 1st place in oil in an OPAG showing and won 2nd in the Color of Autumn show.

Shirley had been in numerous solo and group exhibits in California. She was a juried member of Watercolor West, Central Coast Watercolor Society, San Luis Outdoor Painting Enterprise, San Luis Obispo Art Center, and she painted with the "Wednesday Irregulars" for over ten years.

Born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, she moved to Redondo Beach as a teen, later marrying her loving husband and mentor, Carl. She then raised a family, attended college at Cal State Long Beach and worked as an artist for 26 years in educational TV.

Mary Rowley Cole's (-2004) early years were spent on the southwest shores of Lake Superior, born in Bayfield and grew up in Ashland, Wisconsin. She graduated from Northland College in Ashland.

After moving to Pasadena, California, with her family, she spent several years in the newspaper field. She married Walter Cole in the depression years and they had three children. Then, with the children well along in school, she began to join the painters that congregated around their boat yard at Newport Beach, California.

Mary studied at Orange Coast College with Rex and Joan Brandt. After Mary and Walt moved to Cambria in 1959, she studied with Phil Paradise and Arne Nybak. She also studied with George Post, Edgar Whitney, Jeanne Dobie and others.

Mary traveled extensively, usually with art groups and enjoyed painting in foreign lands as well as with the Wednesday Irregulars along California's Central Coast.

Mary taught drawing and watercolor for 16 years at the Allied Arts Schoolhouse Gallery and for Cuesta College. Her paintings are part of many private collections.

Adventure will be on one of the boats in our local sport fishing fleet (Coast Guard inspected and fully insured). It will include tackle (if desired) and pre-trip lessons to facilitate a productive adventure. Successful bidder should expect to return to port with a limit of rockfish (including up to ten rockfish and one lingcod). The fish will be cleaned and filleted on board. Dates are open based upon weather and availability of sport boats. You should prepare for a variety of weather conditions, from cool foggy mornings to windy afternoons. Food available for purchase on the boat or bring your own.

- Ticket for a "long range" fishing trip (typically 6am to 4pm)
- California resident fishing license
- Participation in boat "jackpot" (awarded to biggest fish of the day)
- · Fish filleting and bagging
- · All tackle or bring your own

- Seasickness prevention advice

TEJON RANCH TOUR FOR 10 Including Lunch

Tejon Ranch is a California landmark, a land of legacy – bigger than life, rich in history, blessed by nature.

Established in 1843 as a Mexican land grant, this grand sweep of territory was home to some of the Old West's most illustrious exploits. Trappers, hardy settlers and frontiersmen, outlaws, the Camel Corps, Butterfield stagecoach lines and Army dragoons all traversed its range. Historic pioneers such as Jedediah Smith, Kit Carson and John C. Fremont explored Tejon's frontier. In the decades following its founding, the Ranch grew in size as additional land grants were purchased by Tejon's founder, General Edward Fitzgerald Beale, an explorer of the west and a historic figure in early California.

Located just an hour north of the Los Angeles metropolitan area, a survey of Tejon's remarkable landscape reveals a dramatic tapestry of rugged mountains, steep canyons, oak-covered rolling hills, and broad valleys. Oaks of almost every kind can be found on the land, as can conifer forests, Joshua trees, and spectacular spring displays of wildflowers as far as the eye can see.

BRUCE EVERETT


View from Figueroa Mountain Oil

Bruce Everett's landscapes in oil are characterized by bold and often dark compositional forms, dramatic effects of light, and a sense of solitude. The combination of both smooth and expressive brushwork within a single painting creates a visual intensity and lends truthfulness to the subject. In larger works of up to 10' x 13', viewers often feel their presence within the scene. Many of his studio paintings were done from photos he took while flying his ultralight airplane, giving the scenes an unusual viewpoint. In addition to his larger technically involved studio pieces, Everett often does smaller more immediate plein air paintings to study and capture the transitory effects of light and weather, and to experience a location more directly.

He received a Masters in Art from the University of Iowa, and a Master of Fine Arts in Painting from the University of California, Santa Barbara. He taught briefly at the University of Washington, Seattle. He then became a Professor of Art at California State University, Northridge from 1970 until retiring in 2005.

Bruce has had a successful career as a painter for more than forty five years. He has had many one-man shows, including in New York, Los Angeles and San Francisco. His work has been exhibited in museums and galleries in Los Angeles and throughout Southern California, Oregon, Seattle, New York, Connecticut and Texas. He is also included in numerous books, exhibition catalogs, and publications on Photorealism and landscape painting. His paintings are in many public, private and corporate collections.

California artist, Adam Licsko, has been painting professionally since 2001. Within the first five years of his professional debut, his unique minimalist style attracted an international following and critical acclaim. He has collections with Nissan, Amgen Cancer Research Institute, Seagate Technologies, Raytheon, Loyola Marymount University, Cisco Systems and State Farm, to name just a few, as well as numerous celebrity collectors. Paintings he has donated have raised funds for charities, including Make A Wish Foundation- Miami, Central Coast Wine Classic, and The Ventana Wildlife Society (for the California condor) and Greenspace.

Licsko was a featured artist at "Love, Faith, Shame, and Hope," a muse-um show in which his paintings were featured next to those of Tissot, Dali, Warhol, T.H. Benton and Rembrandt among others. In collaboration with Rolls Royce of Beverly Hills, Adam had a private one-man show at the Walters Estate in Beverly Hills. Furthermore, Adam's latest series, titled "Remember Yourself", and his modern conceptual landscapes, were featured in six articles in the prominent Huffington Post.

His works portray an incisive perception of the world around him as he brings to both urban life and natural settings, an acute awareness of his audience. He explores a triad between the viewer's perspective and dualities on the canvas, emphasizing the contrasts between light and shadow, cool and warm colors, beauty and its opposite, but always exploring them as they would be seen or felt by the observer.
