May 25, 2019 Chinese Temple Open for tours and more

Meet our new curator John Seed as he opens the doors to the Chinese Temple as part of the Cambria Historical Society's Heritage Day program on May 25. Curator Seed comes to Greenspace after a long career as a professor of art and art history; he has a deep interest in Chinese art and often writes for Arts of Asia magazine. He'll be present when Greenspace opens the Chinese temple to the public for Nan Rae's demonstration on May 25th.

Seed is bringing the painter Nan Rae to demonstrate Chinese brush style painting at the Greenspace Chinese Temple. Her work focuses on scenes of nature and flowers. Rather than relying on preparatory sketches or models, the artist paints with rapid, intuitive movements of the brush that convey a "mind image" of the subject. Nan is a very gifted artist who often teaches at the Huntington Library and has offered workshops in the Pasadena area for over 30 years. The Saturday events at the Temple are free of charge.
