2020 Highlights

We at Greenspace Cambria are so thankful for all the support we receive from our donors, volunteers, partners, friends and community. Without you, we would not be able to pursue our mission of protecting the natural spaces and Monterey pine forests of SLO County's north coast. So here are some things your support did this year!

Reforestation and protection of our valuable and unique Monterey Pine (*Pinus radiata*) forests is a priority for Greenspace every year. Although Monterey Pines are important globally for lumber, the largest remaining native population is right here. Early this year volunteers and local students helped us plant 3,000 seedlings just north of the San Simeon campground, and those trees are doing well. Greenspace and our volunteer tree growers also raised and provided 450 Monterey pines for San Francisco's world-famous Golden Gate Park.

Much of Cambria's coastal Monterey pine forest runs through personal and private properties in our community. Did you know that a permit is required to remove any Monterey pines or coastal live oaks and property owners are required to mitigate trees removed at a species-specific ratio? Basically, if you have to

take down a diseased, injured, old or dead tree for any reason, you're required by law to replace the tree by planting young trees as near as possible to that site. The number of new trees you plant depends on the tree species:

Monterey pines removed should be replaced by four (4) young trees and Coastal live oaks removed should be replaced by six (6) young trees (of same species).

Every year, all year, Greenspace Cambria has 1 gallon Monterey pine seedlings for purchase. Visit our website or contact us for more information.

Conservation of Cambria's open space for neighbors and visitors to safely enjoy our beautiful environment has never been more important. This year we expanded Greenspace's Sterling Forest to include spectacular views of the Santa Lucias. The expansion sits adjacent to a protected watershed and the vast open ranchlands south of Cambria. Greenspace continues to seek parcels with potential ecological and community value. Stewardship of Greenspace parks, improving their natural and cultural value is important to us. We are pleased to announce that Greenspace Cambria has received a beautification grant for native landscaping, interpretive signage and accessible parking for the Creekside Reserve.

If you haven't seen the Native Plant Demonstration Garden lately, call us at 805-927-2866 to stop by Pocahontas Park where volunteers have planted and nurtured a lush garden of native and drought resistant plants, all of which can be used in your own garden.

We are also thrilled to announce that after several years of effort, the Chinese Temple at Creekside Reserve has been designated as a California Place of Historic Importance! We are so excited and honored by this state recognition.

Environmental education is a major part of our mission, we are proud to have an established forestry education program. This year's pandemic posed a great challenge to our normal, in-person outreach and education events and activities. Teaching Cambria's youth about our surrounding forests ecosystems and watersheds is the mission of Greenspace's education program. Thanks to support from Harold J. Miossi Charitable Trust, this year we were able to continue working with local school groups including 8th graders from Santa Lucia Middle School. We translated our normal Monterey pine tree ecology curriculum into a digital, distanced learning unit. Each student received a learning box with supplies for students to germinate and nurture their own family of Monterey Pines from home.



Property Manager Rick Hawley demonstrating how to disinfect pine cones for digital forest ecology field trip.


