



Player Eligibility & Age Verification

Age group eligibility is determined by the player's age as of September 1, 2023. If a player is aged, for example, 16 on September 1, 2023, he or she is eligible to play the 16 & Underage group until August 31, 2024. This includes all official AAU events during period from September 1"2023, till August 31, 2024.

Coaches/Team Managers must have copies of player photo ID on hand to provide tournament officials for inspection. Any players found to be playing in an age group lower than their age will be ineligible to play and any games they have played in will have the results voided. This means the game will be considered a forfeit and the win be given to the opposing team(s).

Complaints about suspected age group violations must be brought directly to Tournament Directors who will investigate. Their decision on this matter is final.

Accepted forms of Age Verification are:

- Passport
- Driver's License
- School ID assuming photo is included

Players are only eligible to play in one team per age group.

Players must play at least 2 games in order to qualify for finals bracket play. The finals/playoffs game cannot be the second qualifying game.

Players can play in multiple age groups as long as they play only in age groups above their youngest age group. They can also play for other teams in other age groups without clearance, if their name is on the team sheets completed before tournament. There is no clearance required to play for different teams from one event to the next.

Game Rules

The following rules apply to all age groups:

- All teams to provide one scorer per game who is 15 years or older
- Game balls supplied by referees.
- 12U age group(s) will play with the size 6 ball
- All Girls age group will play with size 6 ball
- 14U Boys & above will play with size 7 ball
- NO BALLS TO BE BROUGHT TO THE STADIUM. TWO BALLS PER TEAM WILL BE SUPPLIED FOR WARM UP.
- Inbounds pass allowed into back court on the full

^{*} Call full or 30-second timeouts when in possession of the ball. During 30-second time outs, players must not sit and stay on court.





All Age Groups Boys and Girls

- 4 x 10 minute quarters
- Running clock
- Clock stops in all timeouts, and last 3 minutes of 4th guarter
- 1 minute break at end of 1st and 3rd quarters
- 2 minute break at end of 2nd quarter
- 2 x 30-second and 1 x full time out per half. Players must be on court and not sit for 30-second timeouts.

ELAM Ending

ELAM Ending is used to break a tied score at the end of regulation time. This means that at the end of regulation, a target score of + 8 points is set.

Game clock is turned off and the game ends when the target score is reached. The team to reach that score first is declared the winner. Team and personal fouls carry over into the ELAM period, and possession is determined by a jump ball at the beginning of the ELAM period and is controlled by the possession arrow thereafter.

Uniforms

- Players' jerseys must have numbers on both the front and back.
- Numbers can be 0, 00-99. c.
- Minimum size of numbers shall be 2"inches on the front and 4" inches on the back.
- The top/left team on the schedule shall be the home team and sit on the scorekeepers' left.
- The bottom/right team on the schedule shall be the visiting team and sit on the scorekeepers' right
- Club/association 'owned' singlets are not to be worn. eg. Brendale Bobcats
- Representative uniforms are not to be worn, eg. State affiliated competitions.
- A team may have on its bench only the eligible persons listed on its official roster, and non-players (coaches, team manager). Only eligible players may wear uniforms on the bench.
- Distinct uniform colours are encouraged and where possible a home & away variation encouraged but not mandatory. This is to reduce colour clashes between teams.

AAU Athlete and Officials Membership

Valid photo ID and your AAU Membership card must be presented for all AAU Australia Events entry. All players and coaching staff must have a current AAU Membership to participate in AAU Australia events. This provides injury insurance and covers all practices, travel to and from, and game play in AAU sectioned events. The coverage pays for anything not covered by Medicare in the treatment process and is similar to other insurances offered by State and Federal basketball bodies.

Membership status of players and coaches will be checked before AAU event commences. Failure to have current membership will mean denial of access to the event until membership status is updated to PAID. For participants less than or equal to 18 years of age, the AAU Junior Athlete Membership applies. For participants (including coaches) 19 years + the AAU Adult Membership applies.





Team Spreadsheets

Team Spreadsheets must be received by the Tournament Directorate by no later than 10-days before commencement of event.

Complete details must be included, and the format must be in the same format as supplied. No team sheets, no play.

Team Registration

Team Registration payments must be received into Game Elementz bank account by no later than 7 days before the event commencement. Team participation may be stopped until full payment is received.

BEHAVIOUR AND SAFETY

Participant and Spectator Behaviour

Only players, coaches, team manager/S and score officials shall sit on the bench. All spectators must sit opposite the bench (where possible).

There is zero tolerance for 'storming the court' during the game.

STORMING OF THE COURT BY ANY PLAYERS AND/OR SPECTATORS DURING A GAME WILL RESULT IN THE OFFENDING TEAM BEING DISQUALIFIED FROM THAT GAME.

There is zero tolerance for.

- Dissent, abusive and threatening language, or abusive and threatening behaviour to officials, coaches or players;
- Violence either inside or outside of the venue:
- Any form of bullying including, and especially, online;
- Theft or interference with property; and
- Dangerous or unnecessarily rough play;

Participants or spectators involved in such behaviour will be asked to leave the venue and will not be able to continue in the event. This is solely at the discretion of the Tournament Directorate. No refunds will be available.

Where a second technical foul is adjudged in a single game, the recipient will be ejected from the venue for the remainder of that day's competition.

If the ejected player/coach is under 18, they will need to stay at the Tournament Directorate table until released into the care of a parent or guardian.

ALL SANCTIONS FOR BEHAVIOURAL OR OTHER MATTERS IS AT THE COMPLETE DISCRETION OF THE TOURNAMENT DIRECTORATE AND NO CORRESPONDENCE WILL BE ENTERED INTO.





Zero Tolerance for Fighting

The AAU has ZERO TOLERANCE for fighting.

Coaches should meet with your parents, athletes and fellow coaches and advise them that any act of aggression will be met with severe consequences for individuals, team and club.

Please know and understand that formal criminal charges may be pursued. In addition, the team could be suspended from any AAU competition at AAU's discretion.

If a fight breaks out, the venue supervisor or referees may clear the venue of all spectators if deemed necessary and no refunds will be given. Parents and spectators are prohibited from offensive or hostile language towards the coaches, athletes, referees or other parents before, during or after the games. Disorderly behaviour will not be tolerated.

It is the coaches' responsibility to maintain your teams' sportsmanship. We suggest you print this memo and distribute it to your fellow coaches, parents, and athletes. This includes local and national competition.

Fighting will not be tolerated.

Event Safety

As a participant protection measure, we have introduced the following to maintain a safe event at all times both inside and immediately outside the venue. The Event Safety team is committed to ensuring that all AAU participants can enjoy their experience and come away having had a wonderful time.

- Event Safety staff will be in attendance and will be wearing high viz vests. Anyone
 experiencing any difficulty or is aware of any misbehaviour should approach these staff to
 discuss.
- No one is allowed entry into areas not being used at the venue. Those found in such areas will be asked to leave the venue.
- Anyone caught entering the venue other than through the main entrance, or anyone caught
 opening side entrances for others to access the venue will be asked to leave the venue and
 not be permitted to play with their team.
- Anyone in distress or who is aware of anti-social behaviour should call The Event Safety team.
