DESCRIPTION OF SITUATION NECESSITATING A REQUEST. (Give us a short description of the city {area, region, republic}, where your organization is working, what is a situation in the area. Please supply a brief statement describing the emergency necessitating the request.)	Tarkwa Breman is a rural community in the Western Region of Ghana. Most of the residents are farmers, harvesting crops such as cocoa, cassava, plantains, maize, and palm oil.
	Shadrack Frimpong, a resident of Tarkwa Breman, graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 2015. That same year, he established an organization called <b>Cocoa360</b> <sup>1</sup> , which is pioneering a new model of development that uses revenues from community cocoa farms to invest in educational and healthcare services for rural communities in Ghana.
	Cocoa360 founded <b>Tarkwa Breman Girls' School</b> (TBGS) and the <b>Tarkwa Breman Community Clinic</b> (TBCC) in 2016 and 2017, respectively. Thanks to Cocoa360's model, TBGS is tuition-free and TBCC services are substantially subsidized. The model calls for pupils' parents and community members to work on a designated community cocoa farm each month, and the profits are used to fund the operational costs of the school and the clinic.
	Education in Tarkwa Breman
	The Ghanaian educational system progresses as such: Kindergarten (KG) 1, KG 2, Class 1-6, Junior High School 1-3, etc. TBGS currently has four classrooms, which are adequate for the KG 1, KG 2, Class 1, and Class 2 groups starting school in September 2018. However, campus expansion is essential to accommodate the incoming KG 1 class each year.
	At the moment, a new primary block is being built, which will provide infrastructure for an additional six classrooms. The continuous expansion of the campus coupled with the annual increase of students and classrooms compels Cocoa360 to fall on philanthropic organizations and individuals to support TBGS development. Thus, the school-related request in question is extremely relevant to TBGS development, as it will furnish the new classrooms with desks, books, and other related teaching and learning materials.

#### Health in Tarkwa Breman

Before 2017, the closest healthcare facility was in Bawdie, about 11 miles away. The substantial distance of unpaved road made accessing healthcare extremely difficult. To address this serious need, Cocoa360 established the Tarkwa Breman Community Clinic (TBCC).

Currently, TBCC is the only clinic in the entire community of Tarkwa Breman and the surrounding villages. The clinic is equipped with one physician, one midwife, two nurses, and a records clerk. Because of the high rate of childbirth in the community, the clinic has a major focus on maternal and newborn health. Additionally, the five most prevalent diseases include malaria, respiratory tract infection, hypertension, anemia, and gastroenteritis. Within the first year of operation, TBCC treated about 1300 patients, and all treatment is heavily subsidized by Cocoa360's model.

Despite the great importance of TBCC to the health of the community, the facility still faces many challenges with providing certain services. For example, without an ultrasound machine, the facility must hire an ultrasound technician to bring a machine once per month. Additionally, before TBCC can register with the Ghana Health Facilities Regulatory Agency², the facility must acquire additional medical equipment. Since the facility is well equipped with healthcare professionals, the acquisition of medical equipment is the most effective strategy to improve the available services.

Tarkwa Breman is home to about 8,000 residents.

TBGS currently educates **120+** female pupils, and the number of pupils will increase by one class (~30 students) each year.

Presently, TBCC cares for **1,300+** patients, and the number of patients continues to grow each day.

Due to the widespread effect of education and healthcare on the entire community, any assistance to TBGS or TBCC will positively impact the entire community of Tarkwa Breman and the surrounding villages.

The collective health of the community is essential for household and communal productivity, particularly for the many farmers in the area.


