





Best Bingo Bites

DENISE'S MEDITERRANEAN RICE SALAD



INGREDIENTS

1 1/2 teaspoons salt 1 1/2 cups long-grain rice 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice 1/3 cup extra-virgin olive oil 1 clove garlic, minced 1 teaspoon fresh oregano, minced 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

1/8 to 1/4 tsp. red pepper flakes 2 cups chopped spinach leaves 1 red bell pepper, finely chopped 1 small cucumber, peeled, seeded, and finely chopped 1/2 cup chopped green onion 1/2 cup chopped kalamata olives 1 cup crumbled feta cheese

DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a medium saucepan, bring 2 1/2 cups water to a boil. Add 1/2 tsp. salt and rice. Turn heat to low, cover, and simmer for 15 minutes. Remove from heat and let sit for 5 minutes. Uncover and fluff with a fork.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk lemon juice, olive oil, garlic, oregano, pepper, pepper flakes, and remaining tsp. salt.
- 3. Add rice to dressing and toss to combine. Add spinach, toss, and let sit until no longer steaming, about 20 minutes. Add remaining ingredients and toss to combine. Serve at room temperature or cold.

- Proposition for membership 1st Read: 6 Applicants
- 2nd Read and Balloting: 4 Initiates Report from interview committee: All found favorable
- Initiated: 4 Initiates
- Report of sick visiting committee: Pat McEwen has her own room at the rehab center. Ed Schwartz is also
 in the rehab center. Sooky has been bringing them both pies. Doug Phelan is intubated and has 5 cracked
 ribs and is currently stable.
- Communications: Upcoming officer training class Saturday July 20 in Port Orchard.
- Reception and disposition of bills: Bills as of 7.16.2024 totaled \$14,515.29. Motion was made to accept the bills as read, seconded and motion passed.
- Excuse of absentees: Beth Brizee is on call for work. Motion for Beth Brizee to be excused, seconded & motion passed.
- Unfinished business: Buck Electric finished the estimate on moving the outlets in the kitchen but combined it with a second job, waiting to separate the two. The freezer from Home Depot was severely damaged and will be returned. Once returned we will make a new purchase. George Barth will take a few days to come up with a bid for the bar area. Update on pool felt is pending contact with Mike Flanigan.
- New business: Due to rising cost motion to raise all drink prices \$0.25 on Aug 1, seconded and motion passed. Motion to keep Trustee account to \$6,500, seconded motion passed. Beckie Thornton requested additional help this weekend for Hog Wild.
- Trustee Report of finances: 7.2.2024 \$0.00, 7.9.2024 \$5,667.81 & 7.16.2042 \$5,923.66 was transferred to the Aerie. Motion was made to accept the Trustee's report as read, seconded and motion passed.

- Initiated: 10 Initiates
- Report of sick visiting committee: Dog is out of the hospital and is doing OK. Pat McEwen's status is
 unknown but she has been at the Aerie playing bingo. Ed Swartz is home now and is under physical
 therapy to regain his strength. Peggy Tryer is in need of prayers. Claire Fagan is having surgery this
 Thursday.
- Communications: WA State Aerie E-News. Letter from Grand Worthy President Chuck Weber. Thank you card from the WA. State Sons of the American Revolution. Thank you card from the Grays Harbor Youth Athletics. Letter from Millville Aerie #1836 requesting donation to help with cost.
- Reception and disposition of bills: Bills as of 8.06.2024 totaled \$9,844.08. Motion was made to accept the bills as read, seconded and motion passed.
- Standing Committee: Planning committee meets 1st Tue at 5pm every month. We discuss ideas, events and lock in the volunteers that are needed. The Aerie newsletter cost has more than doubled in price, but is still cheaper than Staples. Current idea would be to just print 50 copies rather than the 75 copies we currently print.
- Special Committee: Chair committee has not found any large quantity of available used chairs. Pool table felt has been replaced, we are now waiting on the rails (something or someone has sat or set down a heavy object on the side rail making it dead).
- Excuse of absentees: Beth Brizee is with a client at work. Motion for Beth Brizee to be excused due to work, seconded & motion passed.
- Unfinished business: Kitchen is open Wed Sat 4pm 7pm. Buck Electric estimate for a dishwasher breaker, moving the electrical circuit and light switch is \$2,460.21. Breaking it into multiple jobs would cost an extra \$90.00.
- New business: Motion for Kendall Jakes to spend \$700 for Halloween party at the Aerie (DJ, costume party, drink tickets, small number of decorations). Motion for Linda Perez to purchase microphone batteries and expo markers for Queen of Hearts board not to exceed \$40, seconded & motion passed. Motion for not more than \$800.00 for new shelving units in the liquor room, seconded & motion passed. Motion to have Buck Electric complete jobs at not more than \$2,700.00, seconded & motion passed.
- Trustee Report of finances: 07.23.2024 \$8,710.50 was transferred to the Aerie. Motion was made to accept the Trustee's report as read, seconded and motion passed.
