The defendant was formally judged guilty of the crime of **Count 1: Attempt to Commit 13-2316A  
COMPUTER TAMPERING, A Class 6 Undesignated.**

**CIRCUMSTANCES:**

This memo serves to provide information to the Court regarding a motion submitted on behalf of the defendant to request early release from probation or unsupervised probation.

The defendant has completed approximately two-thirds of his original probation grant. While on probation, he has reported as directed, maintained contact with his clinic for services and maintained notice of his whereabouts, even when nomadic. He has made twelve payments toward his fines and fees out of twenty-one payment requirements, with the most recent payment being October 2019. When he has received a travel permit, he has consistently complied with the requirements and requested from this officer. Due to his compliance, the defendant would be an appropriate candidate for early termination.

While this officer recognizes the defendant's mental health and attitude could benefit from ongoing supportive services, it does not appear the probation department has additional services which would benefit the defendant with long-term behavioral change. He has made strides to recognize and understand his symptoms and behaviors while in the community. He has advocated with his support system when he needed further assistance and participated in the necessary services. This officer has supervised the defendant since March 2018 and recognizes there is an underlying attitude of non-conformity; however, it does not appear any additional services the probation department can provide to address this belief system will enhance overall compliance with the Court's order. If anything, his clinical services will be the best match for success while he is in the community.

If the Court is inclined to place the defendant on unsupervised probation, and if the defendant intends to move to another state, it is requested the terms of probation be modified to include condition #1 and condition #15 only. Additionally, it is noted the defendant has received 207 days of Earned Time Credit toward his expiration date due to his compliance; thus making his current and revised expiration date August 21, 2020. If the Court is inclined to place the defendant on unsupervised probation, his expiration date will be modified to reflect the August 21, 2020 date and he would not be eligible for any additional earned time credit through the probation department.
