Colonel Michael Miller LVO RFD, Official Secretary to Her Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, gave an interesting and informative address on the Vice Regal role and its history.

The picture shows Colonel Miller receiving his LVO (Lieutenant of the Royal Victorian Order) for his distinguished Vice Regal Service, from His Majesty, King Charles III, in May this year.

In his address Colonel Miller described the roles of the Governor being constitutional, and ceremonial, community Patron (She for manv is community organisations,). also pointed out that the office of Governor of New South Wales is the oldest public office in Australia.

Colonel Miller did mention that his first membership in the RSL movement was with Combined Services RSL sub-Branch. However, becoming Patron of 3 Transport Association Inc., the powers that be in that Association, had him transferred to the Ashfield RSL sub Branch, being their preferred RSL sub Branch.

Shane Burette, our Vice President, proposed a vote of thanks for a very informative address.

The Luncheon was also attended by the RSL NSW President, Mr Ray James OAM, his wife, Mrs Pauline James OAM, State Coordinator RSL NSW Auxiliaries, Jeff O'Brien, RSL NSW State Secretary, a number of representatives from other veterans organisations, and Presidents or their representatives from eight other sub Branches as well as Executives of the East Metropolitan District Council (EMDC). In all nearly 80 people attended the three course Luncheon on Friday 8th September. Several of the sub Branch Presidents at the EMDC Meeting the following week praised our sub Branch for a very successfully run Anniversary Luncheon.

A souvenir coffee mug was provided to members and VIP attendees, as was an 80th Anniversary Souvenir Magazine prepared by Kim Metra and Ron Hack with the support of Committee Members. 2. VALE: KATHLEEN MONTGOMERY 101 YEARS

Sadly Kathleen passed away on Saturday 23 September 2023. Born on 13 May 1922 as Kathleen Violet Rexstraw. She joined the RSL on 15 January 1981 and was also a member of the Combined Services RSL Club (Barracks on Barrack). As a regular attendee at General Meetings, she last attended at our President's Lunch in December 2022.

She served as an Aircraftwoman in the Royal Australian Air Force from 17 August 1942 until 5 November 1943, specialising as an Equipment Assistant. For serving during the War she was awarded the War Medal 1939-1945.

RSL members are welcome to attend the funeral which will be held on Tuesday 3rd October at 10.30 am. The location is the Camelia North Chapel at Macquarie Park Crematorium, Plassey Road, Macquarie Park.

PROFILE OF JAMES WARRAND





James has been a keen sailor since he grew up on the Pittwater sailing VJ's, and then owned a small yacht on Sydney Harbour for many years.

His working life included being a dairy farmer and contractor, also as a life insurance and general fire insurance agent, marketing of insurance funding companies and as a financial planner. He has been a volunteer guide at the Maritime Museum for fourteen years, and since 2017 has been part of the Speakers Group (historical and maritime topics).

James also serves as the Enquiry Desk for the HMS Hood Association as his father, Commander John Warrand, was the Squadron Navigation Officer at the time of her sinking in 1941.

James was involved with the Cobbitty Rural Fire Brigade for over 35 years, and has been involved with several organizations based in the Camden District.

James has been a volunteer guide at the ANMM for many years and since 2017 has been part of the Speakers Group.

5. CYBERSECURITY TIPS

Detective Sergeant Andrew Lam, of the NSW Police Cybercrime Squad, was our Guest Speaker at our previous General Meeting.

He is also a Lieutenant Colonel in the Army Reserve.

He spoke on Cyber Crime in Australia and its impacts on our computers and mobile phones.

On a follow up request he has issued a list of tips for handling scams and attempts at identity theft.
