VALE: DONALD JAMES CRAWFORD

One of our members passed away on 12th May after a long illness. Don was formerly a member of Concord RSL sub-Branch. He transferred to us in 2019 after that sub-Branch closed down.

Don was born on 18th September 1925 at Concord West, and he enlisted with the Army on 13th October 1943. He saw active service in Borneo at the Battles of Tarakan and Balikpapan fighting with the Second/Second Pioneer Battalion in the Seventh Division right up until just after the Surrender of Japan.

Promoted to Corporal, he remained with the Army assisting with recovery operations and war graves overseas until his discharge from the Army on 30 June 1947.

- 4. GIVE YOURSELF PERMISSION

 Don't be your own harsh critic, start small, give yourself permission to say no and permission to rest.
- 5. REACH OUT HAVE GOOD SOCIAL CONNECTION Socially connect with family, partners, and friends.


Afterwards we adjourned to the nearby Commercial Hotel for lunch and finished off an informative and socially enjoyable day.

VISIT TO THE JEWISH HOLOCAUST MUSEUM

LOCATION: Jewish Holocaust Museum, CNR Darlinghurst Rd and Burton St, Darlinghurst.

DATE: 15 July 2024

TIME: 1100-1200h - Guided tour

1200-1230h – Presentation by Holocaust survivor (Digital/Interactive)

LUNCH: Probably at The Tropicana, 227 Victoria St, Darlinghurst. Good food choice, reasonable

COST: \$22 pp

RV: At the museum entrance at 1045h

TRANSPORT: Own means.

- a. Bus up Oxford St to the Law Courts at Taylor Square, then walk down Darlinghurst Rd one (big) block. The obvious landmark is Green Park.
- b. Bus up William St to Kings Cross, then walk south along Darlinghurst Rd four blocks.
- c. Train to Kings Cross Station, then walk south along Darlinghurst Rd as mentioned above.
- d. Taxi/Uber obviously also a choice.
