TOUR OF VICTORIA BARRACKS – 24th JULY 2025 REPORT

Our tour of Victoria Barracks on Thu 24 Jul 25 was attended by nine members, six from Masonic and three from Combined Services/City of Sydney sub-branches. A number of people who had wanted to attend had to pull out because the date became unsuitable.

As the organiser, I must confide that I wasn't sure how interesting and valuable this particular tour would be. I have always loved the place but what could they show me that would add to what I already know?

Well, I'm happy to say – and this was confirmed by the comments of others – that the tour was just great! We were fortunate to have a beautiful sunny July morning and to have two admirable guides (Dave and Denis) to show us around.

Of course, the centrepiece for the tour was the wonderful sandstone barracks building. Dave Bowron informed us that it is the longest building in the Southern Hemisphere. I'd be keen to hear of any competition for this boast.

This main building was, for many years, the accommodation for the soldiers here, and their NCO rank. As we walked along the front, we were shown dark scratch marks on the walls – being the scratches made as soldiers scratched their flints in order to light their cigarettes. Some sandstone blocks beside doors were a bit worn in the middle, due to soldiers using them to clean and sharpen their bayonets.

Lots of interesting stuff about the preparation of the sandy ground for establishing buildings, the use of local sandstone, the acquisition of tiles from England, and so on. My favourite buildings, of course, are the original sandstone structures built during the 1840s. Water supply came from nearby (Centennial Park area) by tunnel. Men in the cells were tasked to haul tubs of water from the deep well for distribution within the barracks.


We learned about the varying uses of buildings over the years as well as the cellars for aging quality wines beneath the Officers' Lines and in what is the current Officers' Mess.

That's enough from me. If any of those attending have points of interest to add, I would be very glad to receive them from you, to add in.

Lunch was just up the street at Paddo RSL Club and was very much enjoyed, as was the continued camaraderie.

A final reflection from me: I would be very happy to return to Vic Barracks to do that tour again, even after having done it just now. It was very pleasant and the guides were great!

Helen Leah Streeter (nee Burt) was born on March 30, 1932 in Neutral Bay and spent most of her life living on the North Shore, particularly in Killara. She sadly passed away, on the 17th July 2025 at the ripe old age of 93.

She attended Abbotsleigh girls' school, in Wahroonga. On September 1, 1961, she married Oscar—better known as George to all his friends. She was the first born of Alec & Anne, the big sister to her twin sisters Judith and Janet and her 2 brothers Bill and Ian. She was the step mother to Richard and Rosemary, mother to Alex mother-in-law to Chizuko, and grandma to Randle, Douglas, and Winston and most recently to Yu.

She even took the time to pick up Ian and Satoko's children from the bush school in Wahroonga every afternoon.

She was very independent and until the end lived by herself in her 2-bedroom apartment in Killara, and was still driving up to the age of 92. She was fiercely independent and sharp as a tack. After George passed, she managed everything herself—living on her own, driving, cooking, washing, looking after her grandchildren and maintaining a busy social life.

Helen went by many names—Mrs. Streeter, Helen, Auntie Helen, mum, Grandma—but the favourite was simply "the red hat." No explanation needed.

No matter what name you called her, she was unique, and truly one of a kind—thank God!

She loved playing games—not just cards, golf, or the pokies, she was the longest serving member of her beloved Killara Golf Club, not to mention the longest serving member of Asquith Leagues Club, Hornsby and North Ryde RSL clubs. Additionally, she loved the Royal Easter show and was also one of the longest serving members of the RAS. She would go every day of the show catching the train and the bus. She was known by everyone of the staff in the members stand. She simply loved the pomp and ceremony.

She proudly went to the ANZAC day service every year, as well as marched for Remembrance Day and other events and regularly attended the RSL, Masonic club and Combined services, sub branch committee meetings, luncheons and social events.

As she had been doing for many years, Helen attended Combined Services sub-Branch March on 11th April 2025 to the Cenotaph for the pre ANZAC day memorial service and laying our wreaths.

Helen was an amazing, caring person who always put others before herself. She loved to gamble and cherished her family and friends, but she especially loved Chizie and her grandkids: Randle, Douglas, Winston, and her latest addition, Yu.

LAST GENERAL MEETING 2025 - TUESDAY 2nd DECEMBER 2025


