

Hitting another ball while on the putting green. Golfers have been asking about the rule and penalty regarding hitting another ball while on the putting green.

USGA rule 19-5a for a ball played on the putting green in stroke play is: If the player's ball in motion hits another ball at rest on the putting green and both balls were on the putting green before the stroke, the

player putting gets the two (2) stroke penalty. It is the person doing the putting responsibility to ask the person in front to mark his ball. (This rule does not apply if you are off the green).

<u>Safety First!!</u> The Golf Committee is asking residents to be aware of golfers on the golf course in the mornings during league golf. The start time for the month of June is 8:00 AM. We ask that you avoid walking this area from 8:00 to 11:30 a.m. You are putting yourself in harm's way and risk getting hit by a golf ball which could cause serious injury. Golfers try to be aware of residents, but accidents do happen. Let's all use caution; and be aware that there are golfers and walkers out at different times of the day.
