Resources

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Disposal

In the midst of a global pandemic, it's not surprising that the use of disposable face masks and gloves has been on the rise. While these items of personal protective equipment (PPE) are helping to reduce the transmission of the coronavirus, they are also causing problems for our waste streams when disposed of improperly. All face masks, gloves and other PPE should be tossed in the garbage whether or not they have been used.

When these items are tossed into the recycling, sanitation workers at the various facilities have to remove these items from the sorting line — often by hand — because they are not recyclable. In addition, disposable masks with their elastic bands are more likely to get snagged in machinery where they will have to be removed by workers.

Help keep our essential sanitation workers safe by disposing of all face masks, gloves and other PPE in the garbage whether or not they have been used.

General Recycling

The City of Scottsdale provides free use and collection of one mauve 90- or 200-gallon recycling bin per household. Inside of these you may place plastic containers numbered one through seven, paper, cardboard, glass, and metals.

City of Scottsdale residents can properly dispose of electronics like computers, printers, phones, cameras, televisions and stereo equipment at the City's free Electronics Recycling Days. Visit scottsdaleaz.gov/solid-waste/electronics-recycling for more details and specific dates of this program.

Battery and Bulb Recycle

<u>Batteries Plus Bulbs</u> is committed to recycling spent batteries and light bulbs as a means to reduce waste in our landfills, stop harmful chemicals from contaminating our soil and water, and preserve our environment by decreasing the need for new raw materials from the Earth.



Composting

For composting needs, we recommend R. City.

Did you know that food travels on average 1500 miles to reach your dinner plate?

R. City wants to reduce that number as much as possible and believes urban farms are a great way to keep food fresher, for longer. They also want to make organic food easily accessible to everyone, without the added costs of time and transportation. Goodbye food-desert, hello desert grown food!

By recycling our food waste, we may build the urban farmland needed to sustain our desire for rich, local food and R. CIty can bring that food to you.

Energy Conservation

Unplug all appliances and turn off power strips you are not using.

Put all devices in power-saving mode, reduce their brightness, and make sure they are set to go to sleep when not used.

Only do full loads of laundry, then allow them to air dry.

Use a non-emitting means of altering room temperature and light settings in a room, such as opening a window or the blinds.

Water-Efficient Irrigation

Watering is a critical component in keeping a typical home's landscaping alive. Many homeowners, however, may be using too much water. Over-watering can inhibit lawn growth, cause a variety of diseases and is more expensive than necessary. Under-watering, on the other hand, will stunt the growth of a lawn, cause it to brown and lead to an insufficient depth of root growth. Understanding how one's irrigation system functions can help ensure that just the right amount of water is used.

Electronics Recycling

City of Scottsdale residents can properly dispose of electronics like computers, printers, phones, cameras, televisions and stereo equipment at the City's free Electronics Recycling Days. Visit scottsdaleaz.gov/solid-waste/electronics-recycling for more details and specific dates of this program.

Hazardous Waste Disposal

Household cleaners, paint, automotive fluids, batteries and electronics should <u>not</u> be placed in trash or recycling containers. Scottsdale Solid Waste offers two ways to recycle household hazardous waste: the annual Drop-Off Yard Event and monthly Home Collection (by appointment).

Did you know it can take hundreds of years for plastic bags to breakdown in landfills and when they do, harmful toxins are released into the soil? Or that grocery bags, dry cleaning bags, bread bags and produce bags cause severe complications in processing machines when mixed with your curbside recyclables, but can be easily recycled at your local grocery store?

Recycling Drop-Off Areas

Four percent of Scottsdale multifamily properties use the city's recycling program, though additional properties use commercial recyclers.

Apartment complexes can get recycling at a discount from the city if the property manager also purchases public trash service. More information is available on the Scottsdale city website.
