NOTABLE EVENTS PAST MONTH

Uzbekistan starts exports to Europe via the Middle Corridor

For the first time, Uzbekistan sent a train to Europe, consisting of 46 rail cars and 91 units of 20-foot containers of copper concentrate from the Almalyk Mining and Metallurgical Complex. The train travelled 4,000 km through Turkmenistan, Azerbaijan, and Georgia, also known as the Middle Corridor, before arriving at the port of Burgas (Bulgaria). Uzbek Deputy PM had meetings with Azerbaijan port authority in December to work on securing special port storage & transit capacity rights.

Russia ousts China as Uzbekistan's top trade partner

The two-way trade between Uzbekistan and Russia reached USD 8.33 bln in eleven months, making Russia the main trading partner surpassing China, the Uzbek State Statistics Committee reported.

Uzbekistan signs on to import 1.5 billion cubic metres (bcm) of natural gas from Turkmenistan this winter

After experiencing gas shortages due to freezing winter conditions & peak demand, Uzbekistan signed an import deal with Turkmenistan for 1.5 billion bcm of natural gas imports for the winter season. The deal was signed on the 12th of December in Ashgabat during a visit by Sardor Umurzakov, head of the Uzbekistan's Presidential Administration. Uzbekistan's transitioned from a net exporter to net importer of natural gas in 2022.

Hungarian OTP Bank closes the deal to buy the state share in lpotekabank JSCB (IPTB)

OTP Bank (Hungary) has signed the final purchase and sale contract on the privatisation of IPOTEKA BANK (Uzbekistan) on December 12. Ipoteka Bank is the fifth largest bank of Uzbekistan, with a market share of 8.5 percent and a retail clientele of more than 1.6 million. OTP Bank will purchase 100% of the shares held by the Ministry of Finance of the Republic of Uzbekistan (nearly 97% total shareholding) in two steps: 75% of the shares now and the remaining 25% three years after the financial closing of the first transaction. The financial closure of the first transaction is expected to take place in the first half of 2023.

Great Britain announces allocation of new funds for development of trade with Uzbekistan

During the 26th meeting of the Uzbek-British Trade and Industry Council (UBTIC), Director General for Exports and UK Trade, Andrew Mitchell, announced that new funds will be allocated for the development of trade relations and that the UK will further support Uzbekistan's accession to the WTO. Following the meeting, the parties signed a bilateral action plan. 126 British business delegates attended UBTIC, representing 73 different British companies. Learn more

Uzbekistan and Kazakhstan agree to support each Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan sign the Treaty of Alliance other in the event of third-party aggression

According to the draft document, the agreement reflects the two countries' new level of partnership and is aimed at providing peace, stability, and security in Central Asia. In the event of an external attack on one country, the other is obligated to do everything possible to bring the crisis to a close. Furthermore, Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan have agreed not to form an alliance or take action against one another. Neither will allow their territory or resources to be used for aggression against any agreement participant. Learn more

Uzbekistan to import 1.5 billion cubic metres (bcm) of natural gas from Turkmenistan

Uzbekistan has signed an import deal with neighbouring Turkmenistan for an extra 1.5 billion bcm of natural gas for the winter season. The deal was signed after a meeting on the 12th of December in Ashgabat between Turkmenistan's President Serdar Berdimuhammedov and Sardor Umurzakov, head of the Uzbek Presidential Administration. This latest move competes Uzbekistan's transition from a net exporter to net importer of natural gas. Learn more

Bilateral trade between Tajikistan and Uzbekistan reaches USD 500 million

According to Tajikistan's Agency for Statistics, bilateral trade between Tajikistan and Uzbekistan reached USD 503 million in the first 11 months of 2022, a 26.7% increase over the same time last year. This places Tajikistan in 6th position among countries with a high share of Uzbekistan's exports.

LEGISLATIVE & STATE STRUCTURAL CHANGES

President's annual address to the nation: key takeaways

On December 20, the President of Uzbekistan, Shavkat Mirziyoyev, delivered an address to the joint Chambers of Uzbek Parliament, outlining the country's top priorities for the year ahead.

- 1. Economics:
- Uzbekistan will be steadily transitioning towards market-regulated energy tariffs, gradually stepping back from highly subsidised local rates.
- Large industrial enterprises would be obliged to install local solar (rooftop) generation capacity to support their internal energy needs, or they shall ultimately be cut off from the national power grid. All state-owned industrial production enterprises are expected to install solar panels & collectors on rooftops within three years.
- To increase gas reserves, Uzbekistan will adopt a new 10-year gas & petroleum exploration program, aiming to extract gas from the deeper geological layers. All current exploration licences will be audited & revised.
- A new copper plant of the Almalyk Mining JSC (AGMK) comes into operation which adds 60 million tons of ore per year, and the total capacity will reach 100 million tons.
- A new gold refinery will be launched, which increases gold processing by 150 tons.
- During the next years Uzbekistan has to attract USD 30 billion, including USD 25 billion from private investment. About 40 new large projects will be implemented. In 2023 about 300 new projects will be launched.
- Another 1,000 medium and large enterprises will be privatised next year, including 10 large companies and banks brought to IPO.

2. Domestic policy:

- Several ministries are now merged into one, including: (1) Miniseries of Economy & Finance, (2) MIFT is now Ministry of Investments, Industry & Trade, (3) Ministry of higher education is merged with Ministry of Innovation and will also be responsible for science. A Ministry of Digital Technologies is established instead of the current ITC ministry.

Strengthening requirements for the data protection in Uzbekistan

On October 5, 2022, the Cabinet of Ministers of Uzbekistan adopted the Resolution "On the Approval of Certain Regulatory Legal Acts in the Field of Personal Data Processing" No. 570. The Resolution introduces two following Regulations:

- on determining the level of protection of personal data while its processing, which determines threats to the Personal Data (PD) security while the PD is processed by the owner and (or) the operator of the PD database, levels of the PD protection and the necessary measures to ensure the PD protection;
- on the requirements for physical media with biometric and genetic data and technologies for storing the data outside the personal data databases, which stipulates requirements for technologies storing biometric and genetic data outside of the PD databases, as well as for physical media with the data.


