REPORT SUMMARY

egional cooperation in Uzbekistan had two major events, the Uzbek President's first visit to Pakistan and the visit of Turkey's President to Uzbekistan. During both events important documents on cooperation were signed and new venues for economic development, such as the transport route from India to Uzbekistan were created. In addition, China, South Korea, Latvia, Finland, the US, and Iran have expressed high interest in intensifying economic and political ties with Uzbekistan.

China's Chamber of Commerce has agreed to boost trade, the Chinese Silk Road Fund expressed readiness to financially support new socio-economic projects in Uzbekistan, and the Chinese province of Shandong has shared plans on establishing partnerships with regions of Uzbekistan. South Korea has carried out talks with Uzbek authorities in light of its Northern Economic Cooperation program. Finland and Latvia have expressed interest in deepening trade and economic ties. And, Iran and Uzbekistan have agreed to increase cooperation in the area of regional security.

A number of regulatory changes took place during this month. One of the many significant changes is the amendment of the law "On advertisements", which has placed a number of requirements and restrictions on both locally and foreign made advertisements.

International reserves of the Uzbekistan have increased by USD 935,3 million in March 2022

After a USD 713,9 million drop in February 2022, Uzbekistan's Official reserve assets grew from USD 34,425.3 million to USD 35,360.6 million in March 2022. However, the value of Gold did not contribute to the USD 935,3 million increase. Its net volume decreased from 11.6 to 10.9 million troy ounces and the total value - from USD 20,774.6 million to USD 20,724.2 million. It was noted by Uzbekistan's Central Bank that "the impact of the rise in gold prices from USD 1,799.25 at the beginning of the year to USD 1,903.3 was USD 1.1 billion". *Source: CBU*

REGIONAL COOPERATION AND PARTNERSHIPS

The President of Uzbekistan visited Pakistan

From March 3-4 Shavkat Mirziyoyev made his first visit to Islamabad, Pakistan. He was welcomed by Prime Minister Imran Khan at the Noor Khan Airbase.

There, the President of Uzbekistan met with Pakistan's top businesses. The enterprises present at the meeting had a total asset value of USD 40 billion. A Preferential Trade Agreement was signed to boost bilateral trade to USD 500 million in the upcoming years. Uzbekistan's external debt nears USD 40 billion

According to Uzbekistan's Central Bank, total external debt of Uzbekistan since the beginning of the year has increased by 16% or USD 5.4 billion and as of January 1, 2022 amounted to USD 39.6 billion. Compared to the beginning of the year, the state external debt increased by 11% or USD 2.4 billion and amounted to USD 23.7 billion, while non-state external debt increased by 24% or USD 3.0 billion and reached USD 15.8 billion.

Uzbekistan and Finland to enhance trade-economic cooperation

The Ambassador of Uzbekistan in Helsinki and the Minister of Foreign Trade of Finland held a meeting, during which education, business, and inter-parliamentary cooperation were selected as the focus areas for future partnerships. It was agreed to increase the involvement of Finland's Ambassador in Uzbek projects and to hold a regular meeting of the Uzbek-Finnish Intergovernmental Commission this year. *Source: Dunyo*

The Delegation of the European Union to Uzbekistan launched a new Multi-Annual Indicative Programme (MIP) 2021-2027 for Uzbekistan. Devised by the European Commission, it details the financial and technical aspects of EU-Uzbek cooperation until 2027. LEGISLATIVE CHANGES

The law about geographical indications has been adopted

The purpose of this law is to regulate relations in the field of legal protection and use of geographical indications. The term "geographical indications" is defined as a sign that is used for describing a product's origins. Certain items depend to a large extent on geographical origins, where the quality, reputation or other characteristics of a product are defined. Same signs can be registered and used by multiple product manufacturers. Source: Lex.uz

The Public Services Agency and Agency for Intellectual Property are now part of the Ministry of Justice

Based on a presidential decree, the two agencies have become part of the Ministry of Justice. This change has decreased managerial personnel by 2.2% and reduced duplicative duties and functions in the system of the ministry. Source: Kun.uz

The law "On advertisements" has been modified

The amended law has been approved by the Senate of Uzbekistan. Based on the document, all advertisements shall be made in Uzbekistan's state language and, on an optional basis, in other foreign languages. To protect the viewers from purposeful misinformation, a number of requirements to an advertisement's content were placed. One of them is the ban on using celebrities and medical workers in promotional videos for healthcare products.
