

REPORT SUMMARY

Initiatives and agreements have been made to provide more economic opportunities and protect women's rights. Specifically, USAID launched a program to finance rural women entrepreneurs and a memorandum was signed to aid women in need of help in Turkey. The government raises issues in the school education system and proposes radical reforms to address the low educational standards and lack of adequate facilities in schools. In 2022, wages will be raised for qualified teachers, and Russian language teachers with internationally recognized certificates can already receive 50% bonuses. Regarding higher education, discussions were made with Turkish authorities to open an Uzbek-Turkish university in Uzbekistan.

Japan will financially assist in preserving the heritage of the Silk Road through digital archives, and the "Lazgi" film is showcasing the history of Lazgi dance at international film festivals.

"In general, we will completely review the teaching methodology, textbooks, from the desk to the building. If we do not create conditions for education, for teachers, society will not change. School education reform councils will be established at the district, regional and national levels. I personally chair the Republican Council. USAID to Empower Rural Women Through Co-Financing Private Enterprises of Craftswomen

Rural women mostly occupy positions in smallholder farms, with no specialized education and financial resources to pursue entrepreneurial activities. USAID launched a "Gender Development Fund" to finance products and services that enable rural women to engage in more high-skilled labour and generate higher income. Specifically, USAID plans to co-invest in enterprises that employ women in managerial and technical positions.

EDUCATION

School Reform Councils Under the Presidential Leadership Are to Be Established

The President noted that 1,695 schools required major repairs, more than 3,000 lack training facilities, and 2,000 do not have gyms. Furthermore, he stressed the need to build additional 270 schools due to new housings, expansion of rural areas, and population growth. The need for radical reforms to address outdated curriculums and low educational standards was also emphasized. Regarding such issues, more state and local funds will be directed at increasing the teaching capacity of schools, expanding educational and recreational facilities, and developing programs in cooperation with international organizations.

Uzbekistan Plans to Raise Wages for Qualified Teachers

In line with the Presidential decree 'On Development Strategy of New Uzbekistan for 2022-2026', the government intends to revise and improve qualification assessments for teachers by involving international experts and introducing fair and transparent assessment systems. In 2022, the wages will increase by at least 15% for teachers of the highest category, at least 10% for teachers of the first category, and at least 5% for teachers of the second category.

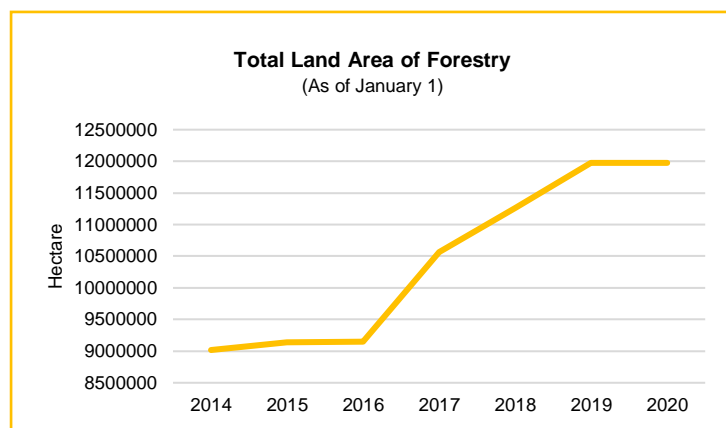

Forest Plantations are Being Created in Kashkadarya

Since 2018, Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) in partnership with the government began implementing projects to promote the sustainable forest management in the Sirdarya, Pap, Kitab, and Dehkanabad forests. Within this framework, only in 2021, forest plantations were created on 1220 hectares of land and over 265 thousand seedlings were planted.
