Background:	The basis for this report is a 19 th century CDV (carte de visite) photograph of a man and woman, which has a green 3-cent tax stamp and the words: "Emory S. Stockman & wife Esther Bierly Stockman," written in ink on the back. There is no photographer's imprint. See Attachment A
Objective:	Identify major life events for this couple (birth, marriage, military service, occupation, death, places of residence) and names of children, if any.
Limitations:	15 hrs

Background Analysis:	<p>The photograph, which measures 3.5" x 2.5," and has been trimmed from its original size, 4" x 2.5", shows a seated man wearing light colored pants, a dark frock coat and patterned vest. His beard is trimmed well below his lower lip, and he also has a faint moustache. His dark, receding hair is pomaded into a knot on the top of his head, with the sides combed back and hanging down slightly behind each ear. He is wearing a white shirt, but it is unclear whether he is wearing a tie. The woman standing beside him is wearing a full-length dark polka-dotted, long-sleeved dress. Its close-fitted bodice with dropped, ruffled shoulder seams is attached to a full skirt and the outline of a hooped petticoat can be clearly seen near the hem. She also wears a dark apron, tied at the waist, a white lace collar and ribbon with a brooch. Her dark hair is parted in the center and pulled back into a snood or perhaps a coiled braid, with a scarf or ribbon tied on top. She wears a band on her ring finger. The woman appears to be in her twenties or early thirties, the man a bit older.</p> <p>Judging from the hairstyles and clothing alone, this photograph was probably taken during the Civil War period. The fact that it carries a 3-cent revenue stamp</p>

confirms this, dating the photo to between 1 Aug 1864 and 1 Aug 1866¹. The handwriting on the back was probably written close to the time of the photograph, probably using a steel pen², popular during that era. The ink appears brown from age.

Research Strategy: Using information gleaned from examining the photograph:

- Determine location of this couple, occupations, and any children, around the time the photograph was taken by searching 1860 and 1870 U.S. census records online.
- Search for marriage records in the state of residence for this couple and any other marriage of either, using marriage indexes on *Ancestry* and *Family Search*.
- Search deeds for the location where the Stockmans lived.
- Search military records for any record for Emory Stockman.
- Search for death records for couple in state vital records and/or mortality schedules, obituaries, *Find a Grave* and local genealogical societies websites.

- Findings Summary:**
- Emory S. Stockman was born about 1830-1833, in New York. He moved to Ohio sometime before 1850.
 - Esther Ann Bierly, daughter of David Bierly of Pennsylvania and "Mattie" Shalenbarger of Germany, was born 18 February 1839, in Ohio.
 - Emory Stockman and Esther Bierly married in Seneca County, Ohio, on 22 Nov 1855. He was about 23-25 and she was 16 years old.
 - While living in Seneca County, Ohio, Emory and Esther had four children: Caroline M. (born March 1856), Mary A. (born 1860), Henry R. (born 1861) and John David (born 1870).
 - Emory Stockman served in Company C of the 180th Ohio (Union) Infantry from 8 September 1864 until 14 March 1865.
 - The CDV photograph of this couple was taken between 1 Aug 1864 and 1 Aug 1865.
 - Emory died in 1872, in Wood County, Ohio, when he was about 42-43 years old.

- Esther remarried 19 January 1873, when she was 33, to David H. Lee, of Bowling Green, Wood County, Ohio. Lee was about 30 years Esther's senior.
- David H. Lee died in March 1894 in Wood County, but no grave marker is known to exist for him and his burial place is unknown.
- Esther continued living in Bowling Green until her death 4 May 1914, at the age of 75. She is buried at Oak Grove cemetery in Bowling Green, Wood County, Ohio.

Suggestions for Further Research:

Copies of obituaries for Esther A. Lee, David Lee and a marriage notice for Emery and Hester[sic] are available, for a fee, through the Rutherford B. Hayes Presidential Library at <http://www.rbhayes.org>.

Ohio marriage, property and death records for the parents of Esther Bierly may reveal more about her background.

1850 and earlier US census records for Ohio might reveal Stockman family members who could be related to Emory Stockman.

Ashland County, Ohio, and New York estate records for the Stockman surname may reveal more about Emory Stockman's parents and siblings.

National Archives Civil War muster rolls may show further evidence about Emory Stockman's military service and explain why he was discharged early.

Ohio marriage and death records for the four children of Emory and Esther Stockman could help begin to extend information on the couple's four children.

Research Notes:

1860 U.S. census, Seneca County, Ohio, population schedule, Seneca township, p. 13 (stamped), dwelling 173, family 170, Emery and Ester Ann Stockman; digital image, *Ancestry* (<http://www.ancestry.com> : accessed 16 May 2018); citing NARA microfilm publication M653, roll 1034. **See Attachment B**

This is the only record for an Emory and Esther Stockman household found in a search of 1860 U.S. census records. It shows that Emery[sic] and Ester[sic] Ann Stockman were living in Seneca, Seneca County, Ohio. His age was given as 27, hers as 21. His birthplace was given as New York, hers as Ohio. No occupation or property values were listed for this couple. In the same household were two children: Caroline, age 4, born in Ohio, and an unnamed female infant, age 7 months, born in Ohio.

Analysis: This document gives direct evidence that Esther and Emory Stockman were in Seneca County, Ohio, in 1860, and had two female children in their home. We can infer a possible marriage date of around 1855 if Esther was the mother of the elder daughter. This would mean she married at about age 16, if the age given on the census is correct. Since it is unclear who gave the enumerator the information, further evidence is needed to support these inferences. An approximate birth year can be calculated for Emory of 1833/34 and for Esther of 1839/40.

1870 U.S. census, Seneca County, Ohio, population schedule, Seneca township, p.261B (stamped), dwelling 27, family 22, Emory and Esther Stockman; digital image, *Ancestry* (<http://www.ancestry.com> : accessed 16 May 2018); citing NARA microfilm publication M593, roll 1266. **See Attachment C**

This record identifies six people living in this household: Emory Stockman, farm laborer, age 40, Esther Stockman, age 30, Caroline Stockman, age 14, Mary Stockman, age 10, Henry Stockman, age 8, and David Stockman, age 1 month (born in May). This record also states that Emory was born in New York, while all others in the household were born in Ohio.

Analysis: From this document we can see that the Emory and Esther Stockman family were living in the same town as in 1860 and that their family had grown to include 2 more children. The birthdate for Emory, according to this census, would have been about 1830, three years earlier than in the previous census. Esther's given birth year is about the same as in the 1860 census. Oddly, although Emory is listed as owning real estate worth \$2000, he is listed as a farm laborer, not a farmer.

Seneca County, Ohio, Marriage Records 1850-1856 [Vol 4], p. 383, Emory Stockman-Hester Ann Beirly[sic], 22 November 1855; digital image, *FamilySearch* (<http://www.familysearch.org> : accessed 16 May 2018). **See Attachment D**

This record was apparently recorded or copied by a court clerk from information given by the Justice of the Peace who married this couple. Although the spelling is slightly at variance with that of the photo and some census records, it is clear from the place, date and names that this is the same couple.

Analysis: The information in this record supports our earlier inference as to a marriage date for the couple, now definitively specified as having taken place 22 November 1855 in Seneca County, Ohio.

A search of Seneca County, Ohio, deed indices, 1831-1889, revealed no entry for Emory Stockman.

A search of the 1880 U.S. census showed no entry for Emory and Esther Stockman.

Find A Grave, database and images (<http://www.findagrave.com> : accessed 16 May 2018), memorial 55159829, Emery Stockman, created by dchintx (contributor 47160808), bio by Lavidaloca (contributor 47233220).

This record gives a birth year (1830, New York) and death year (between late 1870 and late 1872, Wood County, Ohio) for Stockman. The contributor speculates that Emery may have been a part of the Stockman family of Ashland County, Ohio, who also moved there from New York and New Jersey. The record also contains a link to the memorials of Esther A Bierly Lee (spouse) and the same four children that are listed on the 1870 census.

Analysis: No source for the information in this record is cited, therefore it must be taken as a suggestion for further research and not as a proven fact. If this record is correct, Esther remarried after Emory's death, which occurred sometime between 1870 and 1872.

This Union Civil War grave marker's inscription reads "EMERY STOCKMAN, CO. C, 180 OHIO IN."

Analysis: Unfortunately, this inscription does not include birth or death dates. According to the image of the sign, the Mt. Zion Cemetery was not established until more than twenty years after Emery's death, therefore this may be a cenotaph and not the actual gravesite for Stockman. It does provide evidence of Civil War military service performed by Stockman, but further evidence should be found to provide details and confirm this record's accuracy.

In response to my query about the grave of Emery Stockman being located in a cemetery founded in 1896, I received the following answer:

One acre of land was purchased by Mt Zion Cemetery Trustees in 1872. The cemetery was deeded to the Portage Twp Trustees in 1896. Thus Emery Stockman was buried in 1872 and the reason the sign for the cemetery lists 1896 is when the Portage Twp. Trustee became the owners of the cemetery. As was the case with many cemeteries, they were first either private cemeteries or church cemeteries before becoming township cemeteries.

Analysis: This email explains why Emery's grave is located in a cemetery "founded" long after his death. It also confirms a probable death date of 1872, when the land for the cemetery was actually purchased.

Private Emery Stockman is included in the roster for Company C of the Ohio 180th Infantry. According to this record, he served from 8 September 1864 until he was discharged 14 March 1865 in Columbus, Ohio, by order of the War Department. He had enlisted for one year. The 180th was involved in one major battle during this time, from March 8-10, 1865, near Kinston, North Carolina.

Analysis: Emory served in the Union Army for just over 7 months and was discharged early for unknown reasons. His regiment had been involved in a large battle just a few days before his discharge, but it is unknown what, if any, impact this had on his leaving service. Further research into muster rolls for his unit, if they exist, might contain some answers.

Index to Compiled Service Records, Emory Stockman, Pvt. Co. C, 180th Ohio Infantry, Volunteer Organizations, Civil War; Records of the Adjutant General's Office, 1780s-1917; digital image, *Fold3* (<http://www.fold3.com> : accessed 24 May 2018), citing NARA microfilm publication 552.

This record gives the same information about Stockman that is recorded on his tombstone.

Analysis: This index gives no further information about Emory's military service. A check of records at the National Archives might give further evidence.

Find a Grave, database and images (<http://www.findagrave.com> : accessed 16 May 2018), memorial 109722266, Esther Ann Bierly Lee, contributed and maintained by Lavidaloca (contributor 47233220), citing the Oak Grove cemetery, Bowling Green, Wood County, Ohio. **See Attachment K**

This record contains a photograph of Esther's tombstone with inscriptions for Esther and her children: "Esther A. Stockman Lee 1839-1914, Mother of Caroline M. Marks 1856-1909, Mary M. Kuehne 1860-1884, Henry R. Stockman 1861-19__, John D. Stockman 1870-19__." The memorial states that Esther was born 18 Feb 1839, Seneca County, Ohio, and died 27 Apr 1914, in Bowling Green, Wood County, Ohio, and that she married David H. Lee 19 Jan 1873, in Wood County. One source citation is included for Esther's 1st marriage, to Emory Stockman, as: "Marriage article, *Seneca Advertiser*, 11/30/1855, p.2, col. 6." No other source is cited. The memorial also contains links to other memorials for David H. Lee and Esther and Emory's four children. No other children, nor her parents, are linked to this record.

Analysis: This record gives us a birth, death date and place of burial for Esther and adds the fact that she remarried after the death of her first husband, Emory Stockman. It also suggests that she had no children by her second husband. However, it must be remembered that headstones often contain errors and none of these facts have any sources cited (except the marriage information for Esther and Emory Stockman), therefore must be taken with extreme caution and used as suggestions for further research, rather than as proven facts.

A search of "Stockman" and of "Lee" in probate records for Wood County, Ohio, revealed no record for Emory Stockman, Esther Lee, or David Lee.

Wood County, Ohio, Marriage Records 1867-1879, p. 431, return 1280, David H. Lee-Esther Stockman, 19 January 1873; digital image, *FamilySearch* (<http://www.familysearch.org> : accessed 16 May 2018). **See Attachment G**

This is the marriage record for David H. Lee and Esther Stockman, who married 19 January 1873, in Wood County, Ohio. While a preprinted form was used and names and dates filled in, those names and dates are somewhat faded, but still mostly legible. The license gives no information about parents of the parties, birthplace or exact ages.

Analysis: This license, made at the time of the marriage or very shortly thereafter and signed by the bondsman, judge and Justice of the Peace, can be taken as firm evidence of this marriage. This marriage taking place in 1873 is indirect evidence for the death of Esther's first husband sometime after the

1870 census and prior to January 1873.

1880 U.S. census, Wood County, Ohio, population schedule, Center Township, ED 97, p. 183D, dwelling 215, family 220, David H. and Esther A. Lee; digital image, *Ancestry* (<http://www.ancestry.com> : accessed 16 May 2018); citing NARA microfilm publication T9, roll 1079. **See Attachment H**

This record lists David H. Lee, age 70, married, heading a household. Also in the household was Esther A. Lee, age 40, married, keeping house. She is listed as having been born in Ohio, her father born in Pennsylvania and her mother in Germany. There were two boys in the household, listed as David's stepsons: Henry R. Stockman, age 17, single, and John D. Stockman, age 10. Both boys were recorded as having been born in Ohio, their father in New York and their mother in Ohio.

Analysis: It is clear from this record that Esther and Emory's two younger children, Henry and John D(avid), were living with their mother and stepfather. Esther's age is given as 40, some 30 years younger than her husband.

1900 U.S. census, Wood County, Ohio, population schedule, Bowling Green, Center Township, ED 139, p. 18A, 16 S. Enterprise St, dwelling 388 family 426, Esther A. Lee household; digital image, *Ancestry* (<http://www.ancestry.com> : accessed 16 May 2018); citing NARA microfilm publication T623, roll 1333. **See Attachment I**

This census record lists Esther A. Lee, age 61, born Feb 1839, widowed, having borne 4 children, 3 of whom were living, heading a family in a rented house. Also living with her were her son, John D. Stockman, age 30, born May 1870, and her granddaughter, Emma Stockman, age 14, born April 1886. A boarder, widowed 78-year old James V. Owens, was also living in the household.

Analysis: This record is evidence that Esther's second husband, David H. Lee had died by 1900. It also clarifies birthdates for her and her son, John. These dates are consistent with earlier census records. It is probable that Emma was the daughter of Esther's other son, Henry R. Stockman, since John D. Stockman is listed here as single.

A search of Wood County, Ohio deed indices revealed no entries for David or Esther Lee.

Find a Grave, database and images (<http://www.findagrave.com> : accessed 16 May 2018), memorial 141619139, David Lee, created by Cynthia Mahaffey

(contributor 47784539), citing *Wood County Sentinel*, 15 Mar 1894 (no page number given).

This memorial gives a death date for David Lee of March 1894, in Wood County, Ohio. It includes no cemetery listing and no grave marker photograph. The contributor cites a newspaper obituary as the source for the information given of a death date and place.

Analysis: To verify the death date for David Lee, the cited obituary should be located and examined. However, the date given here can be used as a starting point for further searching. This record confirms that Esther was a widow at the time of the 1900 census.

Ohio Bureau of Vital Statistics, death certificate 25620 (1914), Esther A. Lee; digital image, Family Search (<http://www.familysearch.org> : accessed 18 May 2018). **See Attachment J**

This death certificate for Esther Bierly Lee indicates that her birthdate was 18 February 1839, and her death date 27 April 1914. Her parents are listed as David Bierly, born in Pennsylvania, and Mattie Schalenbarger, born in Germany. It states that Esther was born in Ohio and died at 453 N. Grove Street, in Bowling Green, Wood County, Ohio. The informant was John D. Stockman, also of Bowling Green.

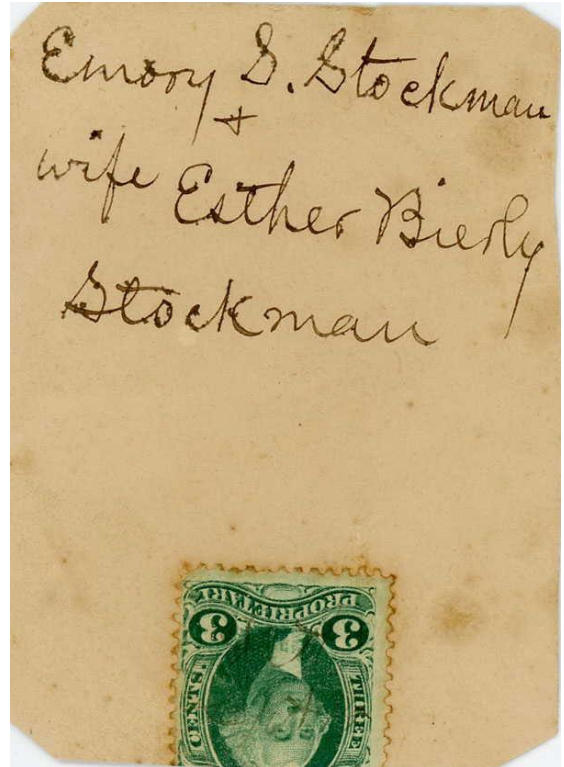
Analysis: The death information on this certificate was given by the physician in attendance and is primary direct evidence of Esther's death. The information about Esther's birthdate, place of birth, and parents' names and birthplaces, was given by John D. Stockman, most likely her son, although his being the only John D. Stockman in Bowling Green at the time should be checked. If he was the informant, although he was not present at his mother's birth, it is most likely he did know her birthday and his own grandparents' names. The birthdate and place given are in agreement with date on the 1900 census (Feb 1839) and the place given on every census (Ohio).

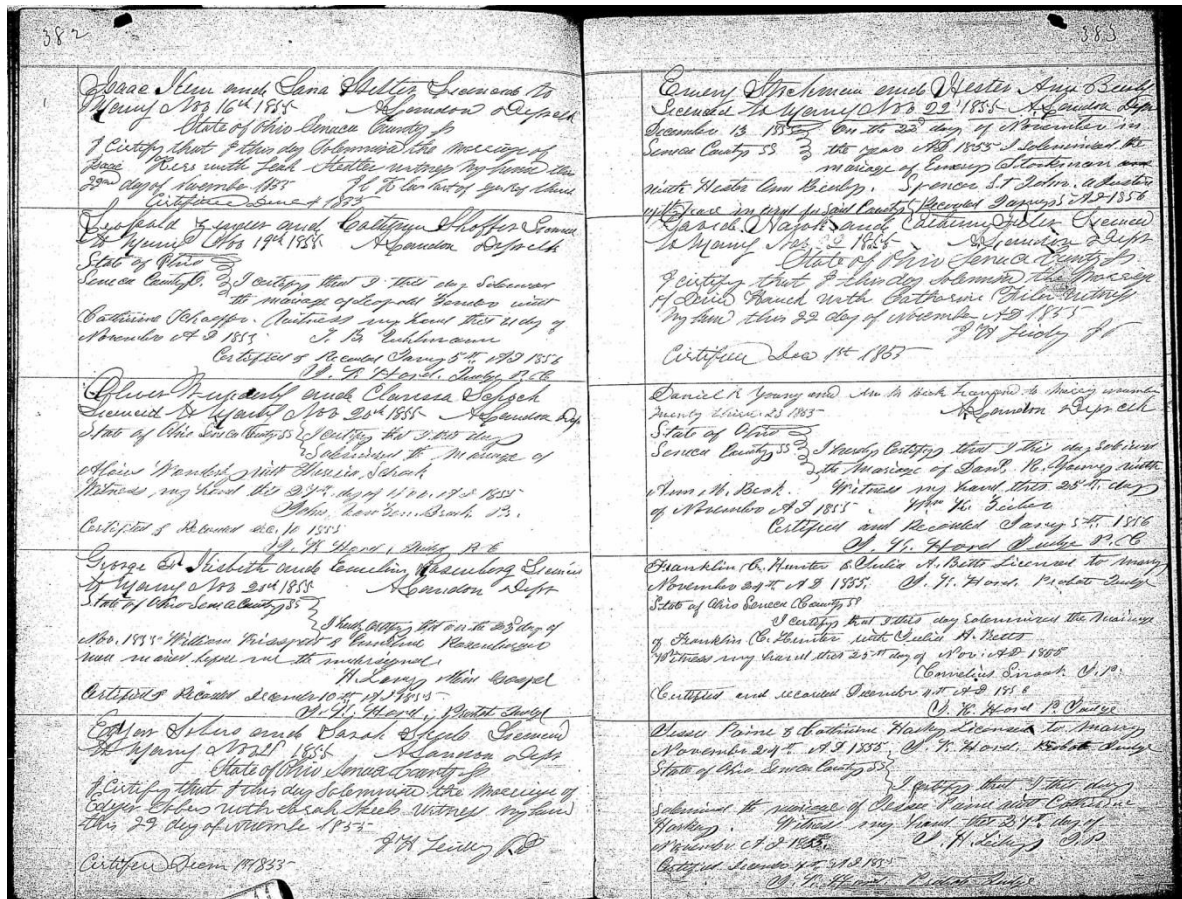
