

CANNED GOODS- OPEN SHOW ENTRY RULES

All exhibitors will be under the control of the La Salle County Fair Food Show Committee.

2025 Important Dates & Times:

Entry - Friday March 7th - 8:00 a.m. -10:00 a.m.

Winners Announced - Friday March 7th – Approx. 1:00 p.m.

Photos - Friday March 7th - 1:30 p.m.

Auction (if applicable) - Saturday, March 8th - Approx 4:00 p.m.

1. **TIME OF ENTRY** - All food entries must be at the La Salle County Exhibit Hall between **8:00 AM and 10:00AM FRIDAY**

2. **ELIGIBILITY** –Contestants ADULT Exhibitors must be non-students over 18, Student of Cotulla ISD grades 1-12, OR a **resident of LaSalle County and must show proof of eligibility** to receive an award (Cotulla ISD current ID badge, or proof of local address). All entries will be checked in through the Food Show Committee. **All youth must be passing in grading period prior to fair week to be eligible to enter. No Pass, No Bake!**

3. **INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES** - A competitor may enter only **ONE** item in this category and must SUBMIT RECIPE INCLUDING: detailed list of ingredients used and a description of how the item was prepared. IF the entry used a ready-made item in it, please specify. Name should NOT be on the recipe. Entries must be entered by an individual, not as a group project. **The entry items become the property of the LSCFA and will be used as a donation to the annual Scholarship fundraiser*

4. **JUDGING** - All judging will be closed to everyone except the Food Show Committee and judges selected by the Food Committee. All decisions by the judges are final.

5. **AWARDS** - Each entry exhibited will be judged on its merit and awarded a First (Blue), Second (Red) or Third (White) ribbon. The articles of Blue-Ribbon quality of each category will have the potential to become the Grand Champion or Reserve Champion. A Grand Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected in each division and awarded a Trophy accordingly. **Contestants may not be awarded both Grand and Reserve Champion position in the same category, but may be awarded additional ribbons.**

6. **DISPLAY** – Please provide a minimum of 2 jars of your recipe. Jars must be properly sealed. Please use a **disposable tray** to display your entry. Serving dishes cannot be returned. Subject to the discretion of the Food Committee, all Grand Champion and Reserve Champion winners will be auctioned. All other blue, red, and white ribbon entries will be priced and sold starting Friday after judging and Saturday between the hours of 8:30a.m. and 1:00 p.m. Participants may view entries after approximately 1:00 p.m., Friday of the show.

TROPHY WINNERS' PICTURES WILL BE TAKEN ON FRIDAY AT 1:30 P.M.

AUCTION RULES

1. All auction item proceeds will be a donation to the La Salle County Fair Association. Premiums will not be given in the adult categories. (students will receive 75% of Auction proceeds similar to Youth Food Show Auction)
2. **Adult Winners** do not need to be present to display their winning entry during the food auction.
3. **Student Winners-** Students must abide by the Junior Livestock Show & Sale dress code {no shorts, T-shirts, etc. acceptable). SEE YOUTH FOOD SHOW RULES
4. Trophies or Ribbons may be picked up Friday after the judging and photos.
