


Dave Causer Memorial Tree Planting

Past President Dave Causer passed away recently and, in his honor, our club will hold a short ceremony and plant a tree donated by Terry Voland. The event is set for 5pm, prior to our Plant Aucion at Austintown Twsp. Park. Dave's widow will hopefully be able to attend.

Second Harvest Food Bank

Mike Ibiris, head of the charity's Mahoning, Trumbull and Columbiana County's hunger relief organization, gave a short presentation on its activities at our

May meeting. Second Harvest is one of more than 200 Feeding America food banks. It is a designated national recipient of donations from Target, Meijer, Walmart and local companies like Giant Eagle and Sparkle markets. They also conduct food drives and



campaigns like Harvest For Hunger and Feed Our Valley. All donations stay local.


Second Harvest began as The Food Assistance Warehouse in the early 1980's when a group of lay and religious leaders realized that people were going hungry while companies were throwing away still edible nutritious food. The effort would get companies to donate Page 2

food to one central location to ease collection and distribution difficulties and expenses of local charities.

In 2024, Second Harvest locally distributed 10.6 million pounds of food, including over 2.5 million pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables. Currently its partner agencies and programs help over 20,000 people with food assistance per week. Volunteers usually work one day a week and a few of GOGY members are involved. Gardeners can help by donating their excess harvest. For every \$1 donated, the food bank distributes up to \$10 worth of food, or up to 5 meals.

Effects of Sulfur on Algae & Basil

More specifically, the presentation by past scholarship recipient Joe Morrison at our May meeting, the study involved sulfur concentrations in hydroponics. Joe will be a senior at Ohio State University, Columbus, in the fall majoring in Sustainable Agriculture Systems. He was introduced by Scholarship Committee Chairman Bob Schilick.



Sometimes even those well versed in particular subject may find difficulty in following the details of an upper level college experiment. As we understand it, Joe's study involved finding a happy medium between growing healthy basil plants hydroponically while keeping algae at a minimum using sulfur compounds.

Algae has the negative effect on hydroponic systems by competing for nutrients, oxygen depletion and clogging filtering systems. Joe's experiment could have also been applied to many other plants including fruits and vegetables.

While hydroponics systems vary, this experiment involved floating rafts of basil in a nutrient rich, soilless solution. Among the potential problems needing to be addressed are nutrient imbalance, pH, water temperature, root diseases, algae growth, pests, system flaws, oxygenation issues, salinity buildup and plant crowding.

Associated studies and experiments include, nutrient film technique, deep water culture, wick systems, aeroponics, drip systems, and flood and drain systems

Another Plant Sale is in the books and, for the most part, it couldn't have gone better.

First of all, the weather was perfect. We experienced an unusual amount of rain which meant cloudy skies prevented young seedlings from being burned. Unseasonable warmth eliminated any worry of a freeze in case the heating system failed. And there was no spring storms that could damage the greenhouse. The only glitch was a problem with the credit card reader which could have prevented some customers from spending more.



Plant Sale Chair Bruce Brungard, ably assisted by past chair John Schinker, were very pleased with the timely delivery of seedling trays and other supplies. Chuck's Greenhouse supplied the geraniums, petunias and hanging baskets. Seedling trays were sourced from John Taylor. Friends of Fellows' Riverside Gardens donated the sunflowers.
