In order to be ready to plant sugar snap peas on St Pattie's Day, I also ordered legume inoculants. Coating the seeds with it allows the plants to take free nitrogen from the air.

I also bought the Baker Creek Heirloom Seed Co. catalog, (<u>www.rareseeds.com</u>) - Barnes and Noble (\$12) - filled with wonderful photos and stories about an incredible array of rare plants.
