### Pretty In Pink - Petunias

Whether used in beds, hanging baskets, containers or

as border plants, petunias are an outstanding choice offering brilliant color and dense massing. They grow rapidly and are heat tolerant with most varieties blooming from



spring to fall. They run from compact to mounding forms, tennis ball to dime sized blooms, mono-colored or striped, and with variations in the number of petals.

Wave types spread out and cover a bed while



<u>Carpet</u> varieties are similar but have smaller blooms and grow lower resulting in a tighter, tidier groundcover. Here are some outstanding wave and carpet varieties:

Easy Wave Pink Passion – A vigorous grower, deeply colored with a touch of lavender.

**Supertunia Watermelon Charm** – Spreads up to 24 inches in bright fuchsia pink.

Carpet Pink – Heat & disease resistant; compact.

Carpet Pink Morn – Multiflora; soft pink.

**Carpet Rose Star** – Vibrant pink w/white stripes.

Tidal Wave Hot Pink – Large, intense blooms.

<u>Frilled</u> and <u>Double Petal</u> types with new varieties that are heat and rain tolerant protecting delicate petals.

**Double Valentine** – Mounding & massing.

**Espresso Frappe Rose** - Deep color, ruffled edges, some shade tolerance.



**Double Cascade Pink Orchid** – Variety of tones.

**Double Cascade Pink** – Extra large, dark rose, frilly.

**Pink Fluffy Ruffles** – Blooms up to 4.5" across. **Frillytunia Pink** – Old fashioned but updated.

Other popular pink petunia varieties: Aladdin Peach Morn, Bella Rose & White, Candy Picotee Rose, Dolcissima Fragolino, Aladdin Pink, Daddy Orchid and Dreams Neon Rose.


