

Gardeners Of Greater Youngstown's Annual Plant Sale

Before discussing this year's sale, a bit of club history may be in order. Years ago, we grew sale plants at a greenhouse the property owner wasn't using. When that facility was no longer available, John Schinker and other members persuaded the Mahoning County Board of Developmental Disabilities to allow use of its greenhouse attached to the board's occupational school

on Bev Rd. After the school closed and remained vacant, the county moved in its GreenTeam recycling efforts. FlyingHigh Rehabilitation was granted use of the greenhouse two years ago and, given our relationship with them, we were able to use it again.

Over the years, our Plant Sale endeavors have endured



periods when no greenhouse was available or shuffling

periods when no greenhouse was available or shuffling between inadequate facilities. Then there was the Covid shutdown. We had built up significant savings for club

activities including scholarships during the Bev Rd. years due to John's Plant Sale Committee leadership.





Bruce Brungard has ably taken charge of that committee with John's assistance. The number of hours each has dedicated to the sale's success, including tending to plants in their homes during winter, runs well into the

hundreds. Bruce and John want to thank members who transwatered planted. and worked during sale days. We'll continue to need this effort going forward because past stumbling blocks may again arise complicating future sales.



To get an idea of how popular our sale continues to be, be at the greenhouse the first day where crowded aisles and a backed up checkout line is the rule. Clare Neff introduced credit card payment last year and that has increased the amounts customers spent. To expedite the checkout procedure, Barb Arquilla tabulated the amount each customer had on their cart while they waited in the checkout line.

Members who were not assisting customers shop or



helping them load their vehicles continually scanned the tables for pots that needed watering or improved inventory presentation. Winners of the beautiful planters were Carol Roby and Holly Coleman. Many thanks

to them and all our loyal customers who we're sure will be back next year.

Advice from gardeningknowhow.com 9 Annual Flowers That Bloom All Summer

Our friend Dr. Laura Deeter loves annuals because they allow gardeners to change their landscapes every year. Most are container friendly with long lasting blooms, and enhance landscapes between various, shorter perennial bloom periods.

Nasturiums – Bright orange, yellow and redtinged blooms atop green-to-variegated foliage. They also repel pests.

Snapdragons — Distinctive snarling dragon blooms in combinations of red, yellow, white and pink that readily self-seed and return next year.

Zinnias – Blooms spring thru fall and are very draught tolerant.

Petunias – Modern times have produced hybrids with bigger blooms, stripes and color combinations. Deadheading no longer required. Pollinator friendly.

Begonias – While shade loving, they do require some dappled light. Tubers can be dug up in fall and reinstalled in spring.

Calibrachoa – Also called 'million bells', they do well in hanging baskets. Varieties come in a multitude of colors and are hummingbird magnets.

Lantana – Blooms of pink, orange, white, yellow and combinations thereof. Full sun and fast growing.

Marigolds – Orange, yellow and red blooms that repel pests. Deer resistant, heat tolerant and readily self-seed.

Impatiens – Shade loving plantss with scalloped foliage with purple, pink, white, orange and even variegated blooms.

Why and How to Deadhead Spent Blooms

Deadheading refers to removing flowers that have started to age or are no longer attractive. The process usually produces new blooms instead of seeds thus extending the blooming season. It can not only improve the plant's appearance but contribute to its health and vitality by preventing disease. A short time in the garden each day makes it easier. Waiting too long can make the task overwhelming.

Pinching is the method for plants with thin stems and soft blooms. Pinch off below the flower and just above the first set of full, healthy leaves. Sharp pruners are used on plants with larger flowers like woody perennials and shrubs. Cut back to the nearest set of healthy leaves. Flowers with tall stems can be removed individually while those growing in bunches may require shearing the plant. Up to one-third can be removed without harming the plant.
