## CHANGES TO NORTH LIDO BEACH PARK



North Lido Beach Park was purchased by the City of Sarasota in 1977. The park contains an upland area with 49 acres of Australian pine woods, grassy savannas and walking trails, plus 22.5 acres of beach and mangroves. Until recently the park was largely overgrown and, quite honestly, had developed a less than salubrious reputation. All that has been changing.....

After years of individuals trying to "clean up" the park, Sarasota County has finally been making concerted efforts to remove many of the

Australian pines and Brazilian peppers and has been restocking the park with native plant species. In addition, there has been a general clearing of overgrown areas and detritus and many of the Racoons have been relocated off the island. Many of the native birds have been returning and a nesting Bald Eagle has already been spotted....



All this change has made the park much more family friendly, hopefully the park will continue to develop a new reputation!
