Lido News Items

The City Development Review Committee has a pending (upon resubmittal) approval of the plan for a 9 story 50 room hotel at the Coquina on the Beach Resort site. This part of the Waldorf project. It will require a two conditional use permits (major and minor). Harvey Hoglund of the city planning staff is the contact.

The Lido Beach Renourishment permits have been received and the contract has been let for the dredging process. Work should begin in February and finish before turtle nesting season. Sand will come the from the New Pass shoal and should be nice fine white sand.

Two requests have been received from Lido residents to extend the MURT to the North—i.e., up to Ken Thompson Parkway. This request has been passed on the city staff for a response. They will have to consider potential cost and timing.

The Bayfront Conductivity Study and potential Master Plan has generated much interest. Questions from the barrier island residents concern traffic engineering practices. This Workshop can be found on the City website. During the Workshop a presentation was given by Mayor James Brainard of Carmel, IN. Carmel has installed more than 50 roundabouts and the residents there believe they work better than traffic in terms of safely, traffic flow. You can view the Workshop at City Commission Workshop.

The consultant presentation is at the beginning of the Workshop and the Carmel presentation begins at about the 50 minute mark. It is very instructive to view this presentation. More information about roundabouts in the Carmel can be found at Carmel, Indiana Department of Engineering.
