# LIDO KEY MATTERS

The meeting was called to order by President Tony Lagunovich at 9:45 a.m. It had been preceded by a delicious breakfast prepared by the Resort with approximately 80 residents in attendance. Guests in attendance at the meeting included County Commissioner Joe Barbetta, City Commissioner Suzanne Atwell, Mayor Richard Clapp, Police Lt. Jeff Karr and Police Chief Peter Abbott.

Mayor Clapp provided an update on the following issues related to city business.

- Baseball: The Orioles are on Deck. He spoke to the suit regarding the city relationship with the Orioles and funding issues. He stated that no property taxes are being used for funding but that taxes from the tax on tourism are being used.
- Sailor/Nurse Sculpture: Questions remain surrounding issues relating to copy write, location, and maintenance.
- Bird Key Part: The final plans were presented for the area incorporating the MURT Trail.
- South Lido Key Park: Improvement have been approved for the bathroom building and the parking lot and will be completed this year. The park is run by the county.
- Lido Pool: It is operated by the county. A joint meeting has been held with city and county commissioners regarding its use. Involvement of residents is requested.
- Beach Renourishment: Runs on about a seven year cycle. They are looking for a federal grant to start the planning process for the next renourishment.
- Oil drilling: The state controls the water for ten miles out. Discussion is going on regarding this issue. A major concern is the effect this issue can have on tourism.
- Beach: Longboat Key is working to contain their sand by building a barrier.
- Southgate Mall: Expansion by Westfield has been approved by the city.
- The city has received a grant of twenty-three million from HUD for neighborhood stabilization. It will be used around the Newtown area on housing.
- Palm Ave. Garage: It will be located behind the Opera House and should be open by fall.
- Noise Ordinance in the downtown area. The city is looking at extending the limit by one hour at the request of Paul Mattison. A public hearing will be held on 1/18.
- Downtown trolley circulation: The city is in discussion with the county regarding this issue.

After a lively question and answer period, the Mayor was thanked for his fact filled presentation.

The Membership Meeting was then called to order at 10:35 a.m. by the President.

- Treasurer Jeff Long reported that at the beginning of November we had \$14,945.00 and after income and disbursements had \$14,880.62. It was moved and seconded to accept this report.
- Carl Shoffstall reported 481 members and 25 Condo/Resorts/Hotels. Dues for 2010 Memberships are now being collected.
- Debbie Comer reported that the 3rd Annual Sunset Cocktail Party will be held on Thursday, March 25 at the Sun and Surf Colony Beach Club. MarkAnthony Roman, a one man bank will be returning for entertainment. It is free to members for appreciation and \$5.00 for guests. It will begin at 5:30 p.m. Bring your own drinks and a snack buffet will be served. (See Article)
- A gala affair in honor of the 30th anniversary of the Lido Key Residents Association is being planned for February, 2011.
- The collection for the Food Bank at the last meeting raised \$200.00 plus food.
- Next month at the Annual Meeting board member elections will be held. The following board members, all of whom were members appointed last year, are up for election. Mary Moss, Debbie Comer, Carl Shoffstall, Blair McMillan and Jeff Long. Two additional Board Members are being sought. The Secretary position needs to be filled.
- <u>Bylaws</u>: A vote on bylaw amendments will be held at the next meeting to bring the bylaws in line with current practice. They will be distributed to members, as required, in the next newsletter. (See Proposed Bylaw Changes)

# PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES 2/20/10

# ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

Currently: Dues shall be payable January 1 for the coming year.

Change; Dues shall be collected between November 1 and July1 for each operating year. Any dues paid after July I will be applied to the following year.

**RATIONALE:** This span covers the period during which most activities of the association occur.

## **ARTICLE V MEETINGS**

Section 1

Currently: The Annual meeting of the members of the Association shall be held on the third Saturday of February of each year. Membership meetings are on the third Saturday in October to the third Saturday in April. There is no meeting in December.

Change: Add "If a conflict occurs for any of the aforementioned dates a change can be made by the board."

**RATIONALE:** Provides more flexibility for the board.

Section 2

Currently: The Board of Directors shall meet regularly on the second Saturday of each month unless otherwise scheduled by said Board, at such place and time it may determine.

Change: The board of Directors shall meet regularly prior to each scheduled meeting. These meetings will be held at the discretion of the Board.

**RATIONALE:** Provides flexibility for the board.

#### **ARTICLE VI QUORUM**

Section 1

Currently: The presence of five(5) members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of said Board.

Change: The presence of a majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of said Board. Telephone participation may occur monthly as required.

**RATIONALE:** Provides for changing numbers of board members and for participation as needed when members may not be in residence.

CCNA has had two meeting since our last Newsletter on the first Saturday of the month at the fire station on Waldemere Ave.

The meetings were called to order and the usual reports (minutes, treasurer and presidents) were read and approved.

The agenda for the December 5th meeting was light due to having a Christmas Party. Billy Robinson, who has served the city over 31 years was presented a plaque to express everyone's deep appreciation for his many years of service to our citizens and our neighborhoods. With no other business, the Christmas Party commenced and was enjoyed by all.

At the January 9<sup>th</sup> meeting, it was voted on and approved by a majority of the neighborhoods to pass a resolution that supported the stance against oil drilling off the coast of Florida. It was reiterated that everyone needs to contact their local and state representative to voice their opinion on this issue which has far reaching implications on the future of our area and state.

Again, a list of names and contact information for our state representatives follows the end of this article.

The main part of the meeting was a presentation by representatives of SWFWMD regarding the FEMA flood maps that are being re-drawn at this time. Public hearings will be held to discuss this issue. This may have some economic impact on property values in the area.
