OUR LIFE BLOOD

Membership is the life blood of any organization. Even though we are the largest neighborhood association in the city, we can do much better. We have 1,475 full time residents and at least 1,000 snow birds. Membership does count when we visit City Hall to deal with issues here on our beloved beloved Lido Key. I challenge each member to sign up one new member in your condo or neighborhood. On the back of the membership form are many of the reasons to join. Snow bird owners and renters are encouraged to join.

Do your part and get at least one NEW member before our March meeting. At the present time we have almost 400 member households.

The Paleo and Calusa Indians lived on Lido Key and surrounding lands for 4,000 years, and archaeological evidence suggests they worshipped the sun. The Indians left the barrier island after Spanish explorers came in search of gold in the 1500's. Then, for more than three centuries, the barrier island was largely uninhabited.

But John Ringling took an interest in Lido Key in the 1920's. Hoping to inspire Warren G Harding, who was president at the time, to buy a winter home on nearby Bird Key, Ringling named the streets on Lido Key after American presidents.

In 1940, the city of Sarasota opened the Lido Casino with funding from the Works Progress Administration, the largest New Deal agency, to attract tourists and provide jobs. The casino was a popular attraction in the 1940's and 1950's. Tourists often lined up to have their pictures taken with the large seahorse sculptures that were attached to the building. The casino was demolished in 1969, and today, the Lido Beach Pavilion stands in its place. Two molds of the original seahorse sculptures from the Lido Beach Casino now stand at Mote Marine Aquarium, where they were moved in 2009 after spending decades in storage.

Lido Key was among the barrier islands Arvida purchased for \$13.5 million in 1958. But the public protested in 1967, when Arvida proposed enlarging part of Lido Key, as it had Bird Key. As a compromise, Arvida sold Sarasota County the northern and southern tips to use as county parks.

Today, Lido Key is home to a renowned white sand beach that was renourished in 2009, along with hotels and motels and a population of about 2,500 full and part time residents – who, like the islands earliest residents, no doubt also worship the sun!

In attendance were state of Florida DEP, Sarasota City engineer Alex Davis Shaw, Coastal Planning and Engineering Inc (CPE), Rick Spandohi, consultant for the City and Laird Wreford, Coastal Resource Manager for the County.

Some time in April, a meeting will be held in USACE office in Tampa and all principals will be in attendance to continue to discuss Lido Beach Project between New Pass and Big Pass.

At our breakfast meeting on January 21st, Laird Wreford, our guest speaker, talked about this project and did a slide presentation. All LKRA members in attendance were very impressed by his knowledge and the scope of this project

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Good Afternoon,

I have lived on Lido Key since 1996. What a great area!

I am not sure if you are aware that there are a great number of safety issues occurring daily concerning traffic control here on Lido Beach. Although the speed limit is posted as 25 mph, cars drive routinely on Ben Franklin Drive far in excess of the speed limit, cars do not yield to the pedestrian crosswalks and bicycles ride on the sidewalk and through stop signs and crosswalks.

I have spoken with Police officers numerous times and they advised me to contact you, the City Commissioners, as they do not have adequate staffing and their superiors feel we will deter tourism if they enforce the rules.

I truly believe with a few traffic calming efforts and a reasonable level of law enforcement, we can achieve a happy and safe environment for all to enjoy!

After the terrible accident that happened on Siesta recently, I hope we can be proactive before something like that happens on Lido.

Please, in the interest of safety, will you look into this matter?
