Ted Sperling Park Police Enforcement

On June 13th the Sarasota County Board of Commissioners voted unanimously approving the Interlocal Agreement between Sarasota County and the City of Sarasota to appoint sworn law enforcement officers of the City of Sarasota Police Department (SPD) to act as agents of the County for the purpose of issuing trespass warnings on certain County owned properties within the City. This agreement allows the SPD to trespass individuals in that are violating park rules. This was accomplished as a result of the collaborative efforts of the City of Sarasota staff, SPD, Sarasota County staff, and the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office. We are all grateful to them for making this happen.

As I am wri;ng this, we are closing in on the end of June. It is hard to believe that we are already halfway through 2023. Before we know it the holidays and our season will be here. In the mean;me, I hope everyone enjoyed the boat races over the July 1st weekend.

The Bay Runner has been opera;ng now for more than a year. The ridership has been good and is increasing. If you haven't tried it yet, make it a point to do so in the next few months. The City Commission does not have mee;ngs in June, but we have been busy interviewing applicants for the Ad Hoc Commi/ee which will be analyzing the Van Wezel and how it should be u;lized going forward. There is considerable interest by the community regarding the future of the Van Wezel. So far, we have received 20 applica;ons for the two ci;zen slots and 10 for the expert slots. Once chosen, the Commi/ee will have two years to come up with their recommenda;ons.

July will be filled with budget mee;ngs in addi;on to the regular Commission mee;ngs. The biggest issues coming before the Commission soon are the con;nua;on of the dining parklets; zoning text amendments to implement zoning to allow for increased density if affordable housing is also provided; and building of new structures in the downtown and in the Quay.

The Bay is busy working on Phase 2 of The Bay. Phase 2 will include some sustainable shoreline projects, the cultural buildings corridor, and parts of the boat ramp area. Visit TheBaySarasota.org for more informa; on on what's happening, including all their events.

First U.S. Malaria Cases Diagnosed in Decades in Florida and Texas

(Reuters) - Five cases of malaria have been confirmed in Florida and Texas, the first time the potentially fatal mosquito-borne disease has been locally acquired in the United States in 20 years, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said Monday.

The four Florida cases, along with one in Texas, have been diagnosed over a period of two months, the agency said.

The state of Florida said that its first case was diagnosed on May 26 in Sarasota County, while officials in Texas said on June 23 that a Texas resident who worked outdoors in Cameron County had been diagnosed with the disease.

The CDC said in an alert released Monday that malaria is considered a medical emergency, and that anyone with symptoms should be "urgently evaluated."

However, the CDC said that risk of malaria remains low in the United States, and that most cases are acquired when people travel outside of the country. Fully 95% of malaria infections are acquired in Africa, the health agency said.

Malaria is caused by five species of a parasite carried by certain female mosquitoes. Symptoms include fever, chills, headache, muscle pain and fatigue. Nausea, diarrhea and vomiting may also appear. Malaria can cause life-threatening damage, including kidney failure, seizures and coma.

The state of Florida has issued a mosquito-borne illness alert and recommended that residents drain standing pools of water, make sure their window screens do not have holes in them and use insecticides that contain DEET to repel mosquitoes. Long sleeved shirts and pants are also recommended when mosquitoes are present.

The state of Texas has also issued a health alert, advising clinicians to routinely obtain a travel history to determine if a patient with symptoms of malaria has spent time outdoors and been bitten by mosquitoes in an area with malaria activity.

Winter Spectacular 2023 will not take place

Organizers of the 2022 St. Armands Circle event cite continued resistance of residents for not pursing a city permit.

In a letter to Sarasota city officials, Jeff and David Koffman of Ride Entertainment of Sarasota wrote that a reprise of the 2022 event will not be held.

"We are disappointed that, as a result of the loud voices of a minority of citizens, the potential and purpose of Winter Spectacular '23 will not be realized and is still mired in contentiousness," they wrote. "It seems that our efforts to continue down the path of bringing back the Winter Spectacular for this coming holiday season will only be divisive by these same loud minority voices and thus negate the true meaning of the holiday season and the purpose of the festival."

Ride Entertainment joined with St. Armands restaurant owner Tom Leonard to produce the three-week winter festival last year to highlight the new holiday tree paid for by the city to replace the 20-year-old tree that was no longer functional. The plan met with opposition from some residents of St. Armands Key over concerns about traffic and private use of public space in Circle Park.
