What a busy 2022-23 season that **Asociación de Artes** has had! After being the recipient of a grant to help

with the 21 East Cape area schools, we set to work to improve and meet the needs that each school had.

We started with surveys of each school asking them what they needed to be done and what they would love to have. A spread sheet was made to keep track of the needs and we worked the budget off of that. Then we set out on shopping trips, getting prices, tracking budgets, lots more shopping (a whole lot of trips to La Paz!) and many Amazon deliveries to Wolf Management. The next step was division of supplies by schools (21 of them) utilizing our spreadsheet, and then the monumental task of the deliveries – which some of you had the opportunity to help. The entire process took way more time than we ever thought. Who would have thought spending money would take so much time! Our personal thriftiness

benefited us well in this project and we made every cent count so we could make the funds go as far as possible to fulfill more.

All in all, we are very pleased with our progress. We are still working on projects, and the AC installation and repair is still a work in progress. The list on the next page does not count the school exterior painting, sports court lights and restroom repairs at LB Secondary and High school. Curtains for La Ribera high school, restroom repair at Santa Cruz and new concrete play area at LB Kinder school. There were many more 'big' projects we worked on, and many that will be in the works this year. You can see just some of what we purchased for the schools last year on the list on the next page.

We just touched the surface of the school needs last season and this project will continue in the 2023-24 season. We will continue to reach out to the residents of the East Cape asking for help with our projects and some of the parts and pieces. Your assistance helped our dollars go so much further because you saved us from having to, Continued on Page 3





Everything You Need To Know To Live In The Baja...Tech Wise

This Tech article is a compilation of different subjects targeted toward those of us in Baja East Cape. Some subjects may seem very technical, but I encourage you to read on. My wife is my proofreader and she made it to the last article before she fell asleep! Keep it by your bedside in case you run out of sheep!

There are now several options for internet in the BCS area. Some things are common to all. First, make sure you have a Cat 6 Ethernet cable from the Modem to the WiFi Router (most likely not included with the router). Second, make sure you have a WiFi router that can handle the speed – preferably a Gigabit Router. I recommend a Mesh Router to distribute the signal throughout the house and beyond. Remember the WiFi "extenders" will extend the signal but will cut the speed in half at the "extender" connection since it takes turns sending and receiving signals. Mesh routers have a back channel to handle simultaneous signals.

If you have an older Google Gmail account that you haven't used in a long time, Google will begin to deactivate those old accounts after about two years of inactivity. If you have a Yahoo account, remember that it's been sold a number of times and now is owned by a Private Equity company. That means they are interested in profit and that may sacrifice service. Unbelievably I have an AOL account and a Yahoo account. I don't use them for primary emails. I have two close friends who stored all their important business documents in their Yahoo email accounts. For some unknown reason, they were locked out of their accounts. Don't let that happen! Backup your important documents to an external hard drive and in the cloud.

Amazon is now beginning to ship packages in their native boxes. That's going to save a lot of paper, card-

board, packing materials. If you see a box that looks like the one from a store, that may be from Amazon. Obviously, it should have shipping labels.

In major cities everywhere, the criminals are using Bluetooth scanners to see if you left something of value in your car. No sense in breaking into a car that doesn't have anything worthwhile. Make sure you "power off" all your portable devices. That doesn't mean just turning off the screen. Power down completely. Iphone users, hold the volume up and the power button at the same time and slide the screen to off. Android uses, it depends. Newer Continued on Page 14

phones, volume up and power button. Older android, just the power button.

Back up your photos! It's easy. Download the Amazon Photos App and it will automatically upload your photos to Amazon at full resolution (native quality without compression). Of course, you have to be an Amazon Prime member for the free service.

Watch out for bogus QR codes. There are a number of places asking you to honestly pay for a service using a QR code. For instance, when you park in a pay-to-park area, there may be a QR code to scan to pay. Make sure that it takes you to a legit site! Some scammers create their own QR code and place it over the legit one. What's a QR code you ask? That's the square black and white symbol that looks like an unsolvable maze. It contains code to take you to a web page or provide contact information.

You can create your own QR code at hellohi.me You can include as much data as you choose. Name, address, phone number, etc. My wife asks: "Why on earth do I need a QR code". Excellent question. She stumped the Geek! But, now I have one.


If you are signing up for a website or service that you are unfamiliar with, there are two things that may be helpful. You can get a "burner" phone number for one week at www.burnerapp.com. Some credit card companies will issue you a temporary credit card number (virtual card number). Using that will keep you from having your credit card illegally used. Need a burner (fake but real) email address go to: https://burnermail.io/

The most frequently asked question is "how do I watch my favorite media in Mexico?". The easiest way is to buy an Amazon Fire TV Stick. Next subscribe to Express VPN or Nord VPN. Why those two? They have apps for the Fire Stick. Download and install the app. Login to your VPN account. Now you are good to go. The Fire Stick does not have or store your location information. The VPN will locate you to the US or any country of your choice. Some people like programs from the BBC. You can locate yourself to England and masquerade as a local. Now, that's not 100% fool proof. Content creators are paid by Netflix, Hulu, etc for the number of viewers and the countries viewing. When the creators discover that people are watching in countries not listed in their contract, they call the streamers and demand more money. So, the streaming services shutdown the VPN IP address. It's pretty easy for them to discover when there are 5,000 devices connected to one IP address. The Express and Nord VPN change the IP address. Yes, a cat and mouse game.

Speaking of streaming media. Netflix began the trend and now all the streaming services are following their lead. Not only have

they raised prices and now they are cracking down on "passcode sharing". If you have been sharing an account with a family member or friend, that may soon end if they are not in the same household. They can check your IP addresses to see if you are both located in the same household for some of the time. I suspect but can't substantiate that if everyone is using a VPN, that may be a work around.

The Monday, April 8, 2024, total solar eclipse will cross North America, passing over Mexico, the United States, and Canada. The total solar eclipse will begin over the South Pacific Ocean. Weather permitting, the first location in continental North America that will experience totality is Mexico's Pacific coast at around 11:07 a.m. PDT.



BAJA SHAKESPEARE TURNS 24!



Turtle Season Is Overflowing Literally

This may be the largest baby turtle season in the 14-year history of the nonprofit, all volunteer, Grupo Tortuguero program.

Perhaps it's because this season is ushering in El Nino. Perhaps we may be seeing the first full cycle of success because it also takes 13 - 15 years for turtles to reach reproductive maturity. Whatever it is, it has been nearly crushing.

Each morning, July 1 to December 1, Omar Araiza leaves La Ribera in the dark, a big Yeti coffee thermos in his ATV's basket, looking for momma turtle tracks. He's so experienced and well trained that he easily sees tracks and locates the hidden spot where she's covered the nest.

Mommas typically haul themselves ashore in the dark of night, searching for the perfect moist, warm sand to create a strong nest to insulate the eggs. On average, 100 eggs per nest, based on the age of the mother and in six weeks' time they'll hatch. Females may lay as many as 4 nests a season! Omar uses a small wooden stick to assure the exact spot to dig, then on his hands and knees removes up to a foot and a half of sand to gently lift the malleable, golf ball sized turtle eggs into a bag. He counts them going in and records each nest and date so the hatching time will be known. He can manage up to 15 nests a day—that's as many as 1500 baby turtle eggs each morning!

Omar meets his brother Noe at the turtle nursery on the beach in Buenos Aires to 'renest' the baby eggs, making sure to follow the same nest pattern, structure, depth, width, size that the momma turtle dug.

This is a nonpaid conservation effort selflessly undertaken by the Araiza brothers and their turtle sister Kareema who helps raise awareness. It is from their heart and soul because of their commitment to turtles and their place on the earth. Both brothers have full time jobs, children, wives, homes and commitments. They are not paid. They are not on 'turtle call'. They manage the program they've designed to meet their work obligations. Any turtles that appear on the shore and lay their eggs during the day, may be picked up the following morning. If waves and vehicle tires obscure the momma's tracks, the nest may not be found. Many kind and caring community folks that see a daytime turtle laying eggs create a circle of sticks about a nest which may help protect the nest. Omar encourages observers to stay far away to lessen the stress on the mother turtle as she goes through her laying process.

Eggs can begin to hatch by mid-August. Warmth encourages a six-week hatching cycle and there can be as many as 500, 1000, 1500 baby turtles a day hatching when the brothers escort them to the sea. As days shorten and cool, it can take as much as eight weeks for nests to hatch. On the occasion that a mother turtle lays from mid-December to April, most eggs will not hatch as the sand is not warm enough to insulate them to maturity.



Seeing baby turtles hatch and make their way to the sea, the males never to return to land, can create memories that last a lifetime. Mexico continues to be ranked number 1 in the world per capita in the overpopulation of dogs and cats. To combat this, S.N.A.P's mission is to help Mexican families improve their lives as pet owners by educating them, reducing animal cruelty, and reducing the burden placed on families and rescues caused by unwanted litters. We were excited to be included in the 2023 Curso de Verano camp organized by the Los Barriles DIF. community, so it seemed only appropriate to partner with Cortez Rescue for a July Spay and Neuter Campaign that not only covered the cost of the spay or neuter surgery but also provided the owner of each dog sterilized a free bag of food. Mike McMahan Classic Baja Maps Did You Know....

Those of us who have and enjoy the classic Mike McMahan Baja maps over the years may be interested to know they have a local East Cape connection to them. If you look closely at the bottom of the maps they are made by The McMahon Desk Company in Los Angeles California. My parents were close to Mike as fellow members of the Westport Beach Club in Playa del Rey California, and longtime bowling league partners. Throughout the 60's and 70's long before the Baja highway system was even conceived, Mike and his family would explore the peninsula in his famous "La Burrita". Their fascinating adventures are chronicled in his book "Adventures in Baja". Because there were no dependable maps of Baja at the time Mike began to do it having made over 200 trips down. As many of you may remember, back then Americans that had interest in traveling to Mexico for beach vacations usually ended up in Rosarita Beach, or on the mainland in Acapulco, Mazatlan, Puerta Vallarta, or Manzanillo. Flights were available. Baja not so much.

It was truly "the forgotten peninsula" not only by tourists but by the Mexican government as well. When Mike was ready to publish his first edition map through his desk company in 1967, the Mexican government got wind of it and told him he could not do it. Maps were under the jurisdiction of the government. Using his Baja adventure ingenuity Mike go

got around the government restriction by making a PURPOSE MISTAKE on the map therefore enabling the map to be designated as art! And thereby sold and distributed. The "mistake" can be found along the Sea of Cortez coast where Baja Norte and Baja Sur meet. Mike named an eastern point, Punta Mary Pitcher, after his longtime girlfriend from Playa del Rey who often reminisced about Mike with my mom after his passing. See if you can find it. In addition, Mike made a VERY LIMITED and expensive run of maps that were etched on copper for a select few that my dad hung in his office for many years. — As for the East Cape connection, Mike along with a son, also had three daughters including Ginger, who married long time La Ribera resident Chuck Potter. Chuck was the "quintessential traveling salesman" who drove up and down the peninsula selling every book available about Baja he could get his hands on to any bookstore, hotel or resident he would encounter. And as you can imagine business quickly boomed as the paved Baja highways were made and interest in Baja exploded. He was an original East Cape gringo resident along with locals Jimmy Smith, Steve Chism, and Bobby Van Wormer. Chuck and Ginger were true pioneering Baja couple. Mary and I first ran into them by chance at Hotel Punta Colorada one afternoon around 1976. Although I had met her father and Mary Pitcher at Westport and at the house as a kid, I didn't know Ginger. My wife Mary's folks also knew Mike from Westport but she had never known Ginger either. What a great afternoon the four of us spent together that day discovering our "six degrees of separation" and sipping margaritas.

But ask some of your old timers here and they most certainly will have stories about them they might share. Local artist Sally Lask, and Paul Gilbert (Tio Pablo) would certainly be a good places to start. —-I hope these memories and personal tidbits about Mike's "piece of art" will add to your enjoyment of it.

On Ceviche

One of the joys of living by the ocean is pleasing your palate with scrumptious *ceviche*. In this dish, fish (or seafood) is marinated in the juices of acidic fruit, typically lime or lemon. This bringing together of the fish and acidic juices is called "denature" – a chemical process that transforms fish from raw to firm and opaque. (A note of caution, denaturing is not as efficient at killing para-

sites in foods as heat.) The secret to the healthiest and most delicious *ceviche* is to use the freshest of fish or seafood.

In Latin America, *ceviche* is woven into the culinary traditions of its Pacific coast countries. Modern day Peruvians take ownership of its genesis, consuming and celebrating *ceviche* as a vital part of their culture, pointing to its ancient roots on the Peruvian coast. *Ceviche* is the country's national dish, and there's a lot of it consumed there every June 28 which is National Ceviche Day (*Día Nacional del Ceviche*), highlighting its importance in Peruvian culture.

While countering theories abound, it is now accepted that modern *ceviche* arose from the coming together of Peruvian and Spanish culinary traditions. Around 2,000 year ago, in coastal Peru, the Moche people were eating fish that they marinated in fermented banana passionfruit juice. In coastal Spain, there was a dish, *escabeche*, made with macerated raw fish and meat with vinegar, sour oranges and spices. What we know as *ceviche* was born as old world ingredients, such as citrus, cilantro, and onions were merged with the peppers, and fish species used in Moche and Inca cuisines.

The wide regional diversity of *ceviche* in its birthplace, Peru, has been documented through books and, Peru served for 400 years as the capital of the

Viceroyalty of Peru, which at its height covered most of western South America. In this way, *ceviche* radiated out from Peru to outlying regions, over time finding homes in the coastal regions of Latin America, reaching Mexico and eventually many coastal regions of the world.

At its most basic, in modern coastal Latin America, ceviche is simply chunks of raw fish (or seafood) marinated in citrus, with sliced onions, chili peppers, salt and pepper. To this base, other ingredients are added. Many cevicherias in South America include, as an appetizer, a small glass of the marinade, called leche de tigre (tiger's milk), widely held to be an aphrodisiac. In most Latin American Pacific coastal countries (with the exception of Chile, Panama and Peru), tomatoes or its juices are added to the citrus mix. In Ecuador, broth made from cooked shrimp shells is a common ingre-In Colombia, mayonnaise is sometimes added, as is mustard. Ceviche is served


cold or at room temperature with accompaniments that change regionally and nationally, and include: corn on the cob, boiled or roasted sweet potatoes, savory pastry, popcorn, crackers. In Mexico, *ceviche* is typically topped with slices of avocado, and served with *tostadas*, *totopos* (tortilla chips) or crackers.

Ceviche wasn't born in Mexico, but it has certainly been adopted into its cuisine. As would be expected, Mexican ceviche yields all the freshness, textures, and flavors you want when life presents you with fresh fish. Enjoy this recipe for classic Mexican ceviche.

Ceviche a la Mexicana - Classic Mexican Ceviche

- * 3 pounds high-quality skinless firm white ocean fish fillet (halibut, snapper and bass are great choices), cut into cubes a little smaller than ½ inch
- * 4 ½ cups fresh lime juice
- * 3 small red onions, chopped into 1/4-inch pieces Hot green *chiles* to taste (roughly 3 or 4 *serranos* or 2 large *jalapeños*), stemmed and roughly chopped
- * 3/4 cup green olives (preferably manzanillos)
- * 2 pounds ripe tomatoes, cored, and cut into 1/4-inch pieces
- * ½ small jicama, peeled and chopped into 1/4-inch pieces
- * 3/4 cup (loosely packed) chopped fresh cilantro (thick bottom stems cut off)
- * 1/3 cup olive oil
- * Salt
- * 1 Tbsp. sugar
- * 1 ripe avocado, sliced
- * Sturdy tortilla chips, 3- to 4-inch tostadas, or crackers for serving
- 1. In a large stainless steel or glass bowl, combine the fish, citrus juice and onion. The fish should float freely in the juice; if not, add a little more. Cover and refrigerate until the fish is as "done" as you like. An hour or so for medium-rare, 3 to 4 hours for "cooked" all the way through. Drain off the juice and discard.
- 2. Finely chop the green *chile* and olives. Add to the fish along with the tomato, jícama, cilantro and olive oil. Stir well, then season with salt and sugar.
- 3. Refrigerate up to 2 hours, add slices of avocado, serve with tortilla chips, tostadas or crackers.

Does BCS Even Need a New Children's Home?

Recently, we put out a survey to get information from the community about their views on charitable causes and organizations. We also wanted to know what people thought about Leaders2Give, our nonprofit that does most of its work in the East Cape and is expanding to the greater BCS area.

Many of the responses were in alignment with what we knew about our community, but there were some unexpected twists and turns that left us scratching our heads.

Some individuals questioned or failed to comprehend the necessity of the new home, which will provide a haven for children during their families' medical challenges.

Shortly thereafter, some people took to social media to question the validity of the home. We were overwhelmed by the number of positive comments on these posts from the community both Mexican and expat alike who understood the very real need for the home.

Allow us to present the facts that demonstrate the urgent need for this facility:

- Over the last few years poverty has increased in BCS by over 200%. Many of those living in poverty are single mothers with children.
- Childhood leukemia and breast cancer are among the leading causes of death in Mexico with an extraordinary number of cases right here in Baja California Sur.

- Many single mothers living in poverty must abandon their children in order to seek medical treatment for themselves or a sick child.
- This sad situation was confirmed by DIF, the agency responsible for child and family welfare.
- It was also confirmed by FIPCAM, a Mexican nonprofit exclusively serving women living in poverty in Baja California Sur requiring treatment for cancer.
- It was the Mexican community which originally advocated for the home.
- The John Gullo Home for Children is being built in collaboration with the government of Baja California Sur, DIF, the local municipality of El Cardonal and has the support of the local Mexican community.

All the hubbub was a good thing, in the end. It gave us a chance to explain the very real need for this home and dispel some of the myths floating about.

And now, I am thrilled to share with you an exciting update on the construction of the new children's home. We are on the cusp of completing Phase One!

That means the construction of all the vital infrastructure (walls, roofs, foundations) across all three new buildings is almost finished.

We are now setting our sights on Phase Two which includes all masonry and finishes such as paint and plaster, doors and windows, tiles, installation of septic, appliances, and fencing for privacy and security, and more.

With most funding now in place, it will then be crucial to continue our momentum to complete the landscaping,


A warm welcome back to all our friends and visitors. We look forward to assisting with your medical and dental needs this season.

Our summer this year was typically long and hot with several rainy days that contributed mightily to the lush green beauty that surrounds us this time of year. The rains, however, also bring with it the return of mosquitos and bobos that can carry nasty diseases. Be mindful of these pests.

This summer also saw a fantastic youth program organized by the local DIF known as "Cursos Verano." This useful, older rig will provide safe, non-emergent transport that will include the added security of oxygen, suction and sirens to get quickly through traffic — helping to ensure patient safety.



Persons with low mineral levels

Persons with an overly alkaline blood stream

When your bloodstream is too alkaline, something called the bore effect kicks in. This means, when the blood is to alkaline, oxygen cannot leave the blood and go into the tissues where it needs to be for energy production.

Here is where the problem comes in with the Ketogenic diet. The burning of carbs, which is much easier then burning fat and protein for fuel, helps the body to produce CO2. CO2 is acidic, so helps to acidify the bloodstream. In people who lean towards being more alkaline, the carbs actually help them balance out their bloodstream. If they reduce carbohydrate intake dramatically, the bloodstream will become even more alkaline and the result will be really low energy. First this imbalance should be corrected, before thinking about going on a Keto Diet.

Keto with caution!

Before you decide to go on a Keto Diet, make sure you really know how to do it properly. Also make sure your body is ready for it.

In my opinion the Keto diet is not a diet for the long term. It can be extremely helpful to lose weight. You should however, only follow it for 2-3 month max. at a time as you are seriously depriving your gut microbiome of food (the good bacteria that live in your gut). This may cause imbalance in that microbiome and favor the bad bacteria. In the worst case, it can lead to a whole host of other problems like vitamin deficiencies, food intolerance and constipation amongst others.

Activity Choices

Being a part of the Fitness Industry for over five decades has been informative, frustrating, enlightening and downright fun. What was the hottest trend and latest information available in the 80's, 90's and 2000's has quickly been pushed aside as more and more research becomes available to us on what is needed to stay fit and healthy. Staying current with fitness information and research can be quite a challenge and I have been attending the same annual, fitness conference with world renowned presenters for the past 30 years to ensure that my continuing education credits are up to date and despite all this new information, it is still difficult to keep up with the latest trends evolving each year. No wonder my participants and clients are boggled when it comes to making lifestyle and activity choices!!

One of the big questions I always get asked "Is cardiovascular (aerobic) fitness more important than either strength, flexibility, mobility or balance training?" To

me the answer is a simple NO, because you strength, flexibility, mobility and balance for overall fit-Maintaining aerobic fitness has been shown to reduce the risks of coronary artery disease and its related problems, regular strength training can help reduce the risk for problems of osteopenia and osteoporosis. Maintaining flexibility and mobility helps reduce the risk of injury when you are doing other exercises and recreational sports activities and balance is a key component in keeping us from falling and incurring bone breaks especially in the hip area as we age.

Another related question is "To get stronger, do I need to work each muscle group with weights at least three times per week or more?" Many studies have shown that doing strength training exercises (weights, chines, elastic bands, body weight) just twice a week will lead to significant strength gains. The key is to take the muscle to fatigue by performing about eight to 12 repetitions – fatigue means

that the muscles being worked tire to the point that you ca nnot complete any more repetitions using proper and correct form. Wayne Wescott performed a study where senior participants did just one set of eight to 12 repetitions twice per week and it led to substantial strength improvement in just 12 short weeks. If you are new to resistance training, it is always a good idea to work with a qualified, certified professional to ensure that your program works all the major muscle groups in a balanced fashion.

The question of "Which of the following techniques is best for a mind and body fitness lifestyle; Yoga, Tai Chi, Mediation, Pilates, or Biofeedback, etc." is also a popular one and all of them can have a dramatic impact and are all proven and valid disciplines. Research has proven that optimal fitness encompasses much more than physical capabilities. What's important is the practiced integration of both mental and physical functions. Whatever practice or technique you choose, the benefits of a mind/body pro-gram can include reduced stress, lower blood pressure, Continued On Page 34

Exercise is not only a well-documented means of maintaining muscle mass and losing fat, recent studies propose that it can also revitalize your sex life. In the Journal of the American Medical Association, scientists found that sexual dysfunction is more likely among those with poor physical and emotional health and plays a major role with overall well-being. Doctors believe that exercise has the effect it does on increasing sexual potency because it strengthens the cardiovascular system and improves circulation and good circulation is important for sexual function.
