

Active Seniors Enjoy Life More

The best prescription for our older adults in the East Cape area for a healthier and better retirement is exercise. Your stay will be much more enjoyable for your 2025 - 2026 season if you can discover a movement practice that you enjoy and can also stick with.

Did you know that moderate intensity physical activity can help you live longer and reduce health problems? Regular activity helps to control blood pressure, body weight and cholesterol levels and even cuts the risk of hardening of the arteries, heart attack and stroke. It also conditions the muscles, tendons, ligaments and bones to prevent osteoporosis, it keeps your body more limber and stabilizes your joints which lowers your risk of everyday injury. Exercise also improves your digestion, can help manage low back pain, arthritis and diabetes. One of my favourites is that regular activity helps you maintain your independence longer which we all strive for and, of course, makes you feel so much better, manages stress and gives your more energy to enjoy your work and play here in paradise.

A well-balanced exercise program includes cardiovascular and muscle conditioning, flexibility and balance training to prevent falls as we age. It is best to start slow and build up gradually to at least 30 minutes of movement activity on most days of the week.

A few safety tips if you are new to activity - always remember to keep safety in mind when exercising.

- Wear comfortable, well-fitting, supportive shoes if your activity requires impact.
- Avoid outdoor activities in extreme temperatures.
- Drink plenty of fluids to stay well hydrated and consider electrolytes if you exercise for prolonged periods of time.
- Listen to your body when determining an appropriate exercise intensity (keep in mind that monitoring intensity using heart rate is not always accurate if you are on

heart rate altering medications).

Be aware of the danger signs. Stop activity and contact your doctor or health clinic if you experience any of the following symptoms: pain, pressure in your chest, arms, neck or jaw; feeling lightheaded, nauseated, or weak; becoming short of breath, developing pain in your legs, calves, or back; or feeling like your heart is beating too fast or skipping beats.

I experienced firsthand the results of not listening to my body eight summers ago while actively working out in extreme temperatures. My sodium levels dropped way below normal, I had two seizures, fractured my lower thoracic spine as well as L5. Many tests later, lectures from my attending physicians that "I of all people should have known better" and a week in the hospital changed not only my attitude about the intensity of how I move now but also my mindset. Moving at a slower pace with compassion and less vigor has served me well and reminding myself that my 76-year-old body deserves this (even though my ego brain thinks I can still go hard core).

We are extremely fortunate in Los Barriles to have a bounty of options available to us whatever your mobility needs may be - we need to get up and move our own way intelligently. Our community offers everything from gym memberships, studio classes with chair-based movements if you are not able to get off the floor easily, mind body yoga and Pilates classes, pickleball, a plethora of watersports including lessons, and dance style classes and adult ballet. Join the growing number of older adults who are demonstrating that exercise helps keep your body strong.

Remember:

Spotlight on La RiberaBy: George Bergin (from Summer 2005)

La Ribera is Spanish for "shore, bank or beach." Originally, this little East Cape fishing village was known as Tres Rios. Although there are no rivers near here today, we can imagine how the town got its name, especially in the rainy season. Three broad arroyos fan out from the slopes of the nearby La Laguna mountain range and run to the Sea of Cortéz on either side of the town. When the canyons high up in the Lagunas absorb more rainfall than they can hold, these arroyos run like shallow rivers.

Many years ago, the main village of La Ribera was located on a flat shelf of land touching the beach. Over the years, hurricanes and monsoonal rains flooded the area, devastating the town. As a result, residents were forced to abandon the site and rebuild their homes and businesses on higher ground. The skeletons of tow or three crumbling concrete and brick structures remain to mark the site. An Ejido, composed of 59 families, owns all the beach property where the original village was laid out.

La Ribera's beach lays east and west. Prevailing winds

come from the north and down from the la Lagunas. The water is held inshore in long ponds of brackish water called, Charcos. At times, rain, wind, waves and tides act together to break through the berms. The whole marine food chain for miles along the beach benefits from the rich factor in La Ribera's ability to sustain its commercial fishing operations over the years. This "mountains feeding the fish" scenario is rare on the Baja peninsula as well as other parts of Mexico where mountains are much further from the sea.

La Ribera's first fishing resort began operation in the 1970's. Others soon followed. The town has prospered with the growth of this sport fishing/tourist business. The latest economic "boom" is due to the influx of retirees from the US and Canada. Their many trips to the Baja peninsula convinced them that there are few places with city services remaining in East Cape, which have affordable lots for single-family homes.

So, what does the future hold for La Ribera? What will happen to all of that Ejido-owned beach front property? Several developers, envisioning golf courses and a marina, have studied the area and want to buy. The Ejido is willing to sell. But the process is exceedingly slow. Don't look for any major changes in the lifestyle of La Riberians any time soon. In the meantime, they're just going to keep on fishing!

Life of a Baja Dog: The Last Story

Hi, this is Missy, the Baja Dog that has been telling you about my life in Los Barriles and in Washington State for the last two years. When we left off last time, my health was declining rapidly and I knew that my parents, Bill and Cheryl, were very upset about what was happening to me. As the cancer progressed; I didn't like it whenever one of them was not with me.

After Bill took our family portrait on September 30, 2024, he spent some time on the computer looking at the pictures he took that morning. I sat at his feet on a blanket and watched him intently. He called Cheryl over to where he was working and said, "I got it. This picture is perfect!" Cheryl looked at the picture, gave me a hug and started crying. I couldn't understand why she would cry if the picture was so good. I would find out soon what brought her to tears.

October 1, 2024, started like every other day. I woke Bill up early by whining and scratching at him. I had to go now! He quickly got dressed and took me for my walk. Unlike most mornings, I did my major duty quickly. Then he did something I had never experienced. He burst into tears and cried uncontrollably. I had seen Cheryl cry many times in the last few months, but this was a first for Bill. At first, I tried to pull away, but I realized he needed me, so I sat down beside

him and looked into his eyes. The crying continued. He held my head in his hands and kept saying, "I love you so much." I knew he and Cheryl loved me, but this time was different.

After what seemed like an eternity, Bill stopped crying and took me to the house for a special breakfast. Cheryl gave me some freshly-cooked chicken and Bill topped it off with a chocolate-covered ice cream bar, one of my favorite treats. I heard Cheryl say that dogs aren't supposed to eat chocolate, but "It doesn't matter anymore."

After a nice nap, I reminded Bill that I needed to go again. To my surprise, Bill cried again. I could not figure out what was wrong. We walked down to the river, but unlike yesterday where I swam in the river, today I looked at the water and headed back to the house. Cheryl greeted us with a hug for Bill and a nice tummy rub for me.

When I went to one of my beds, they both sat next to me and showered me love and affection. I slept for an hour or so, when Bill came to me with the lead. This time, both of them took me for a walk. Little did I know this would be the last such walk for me. They put me in the car, and we headed to The Dalles, Oregon. It felt like just another trip for Cheryl to go shopping. She stopped at the Fred Meyer store to get some things she needed for dinner. As was the usual case, I sat in the passenger seat and nervously awaited her return.

Instead of returning home they drove to the Columbia Veterinary Clinic. I had never been there before. Bill went in alone to talk with them. Like it was when Cheryl was the grocery store, I was much happier when he returned. The two of them hugged me and professed their love for me.

We all exited the car and went into the office. One of the nice ladies escorted us into a small room where we were greeted by two nice women. Of course, I had to greet them, lick some hands and check out the room by sniffing everything. The vet talked very seriously to Bill and Cheryl. She explained what was going to happen next. After going into great detail, she asked, "Do you want to stay?" They both nodded their heads.

The veterinarian said, "The first shot I am going to give her will sting like a big bee sting. She isn't going to like it, but the pain will be brief, and she will become very calm." After receiving the shot, I turned around and licked her hand.

Cheryl kneeled down, held my head, and rubbed my ears. Bill laid down beside me with his face next to me. I looked at him, gave and a big kiss on the lips and fell asleep. The next shot was given in my left rear leg. Within a minute, I stopped breathing, and my heart stopped. My life had ended.

From my place in Dog Heaven, I watched the two people who loved me like no others cry and left the room. For the first time in more than two years, I was out of pain. I know it was the toughest thing Bill and Cheryl ever did but letting me go with dignity was the right thing. I know that my spirit will live with them forever.

The Origins of Day of the Dead Traditions

The Day of the Dead, or Día de los Muertos, is a vibrant and deeply meaningful celebration that honors the lives of those who have passed away. Rooted in ancient traditions and enriched by cultural influences over the centuries, this holiday is not just a time for mourning but a joyous occasion that brings families and communities together. From elaborate altars adorned with colorful decorations to festive gatherings filled with laughter and remembrance, the Day of the Dead encapsulates the belief that death is not an end, but a continuation of life in another form.

Historical Background of Day of the Dead

The Day of the Dead, or Día de los Muertos, is a cele-

bration that honors deceased loved ones in Mexico and among Mexican communities worldwide. Its origins are deeply rooted in pre-Columbian traditions, shaped significantly by Spanish colonization, and have evolved over the centuries into a unique blend of indigenous and European customs. Understanding the historical background of Día de los Muertos not only illuminates its significance in Mexican culture but also highlights its role in preserving memory and fostering community connections.

Pre-Columbian Traditions

Long before the arrival of the Spanish, indigenous peoples in Mesoamerica celebrated death as a part of life, viewing it not as an end but as a transition to another existence. They believed in an afterlife where the soul would journey through various challenges, and the manner of one's death greatly influenced their fate in the afterlife.

One of the most significant deities related to death in the Aztec pantheon was Mictecacihuatl, the Lady of the Dead, who ruled over the Mictlán, the underworld. The Aztecs honored their dead through elaborate rituals and ceremonies, often involving offerings of

food, flowers, and personal items. Families would create altars, or *ofrendas*, to welcome the spirits of their ancestors back to the world of the living during specific times of the year, particularly during the harvest season.

Additionally, other indigenous cultures, such as the Purepechas and the Mixtecs, also celebrated death with their unique customs. They created intricate altars adorned with flowers, particularly *cempasúchil* (marigolds), which were believed to guide the spirits with their vibrant color and scent. These practices laid the groundwork for the modern celebration of Día de los Muertos, demonstrating a reverence for life and death that has persisted through generations.

Influence of Spanish Colonization

The arrival of Spanish colonizers in the 16th century drastically altered the religious landscape of Mexico, leading to the imposition of Catholicism and the suppression of indigenous beliefs. However, rather than completely erasing indigenous customs, the Spanish often integrated them

into their religious practices. This syncretism is particularly evident in the celebration of Día de los Muertos, which coincides with the Catholic observances of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, celebrated on November 1st and 2nd, respectively.

During this period, the Catholic Church sought to convert indigenous peoples by adapting their existing traditions. The concept of honoring the dead was aligned with Catholic teachings about the afterlife, purgatory, and the importance of praying for the souls of the deceased. Consequently, many indigenous practices were absorbed into the Catholic framework, leading to the formation of a hybrid celebration that included both Catholic and indigenous elements.

The altars, once solely dedicated to indigenous deities, began to incorporate Catholic symbols such as crucifixes, rosaries, and images of saints. The fusion of these traditions created a rich tapestry of beliefs surrounding death and the afterlife, allowing communities to maintain their cultural identity while also embracing elements of the dominant religion.

Symbolism of Altars (Ofrendas)

At the heart of the Day of the Dead celebrations are the

altars, or ofrendas, which are meticulously created to honor the departed. These altars serve not only as a physical space for remembrance but also as a symbolic representation of the deceased's journey back to the world of the living. Typically adorned with a variety of items, each element of the altar holds deep meaning.

Photographs: Images of the deceased are prominently displayed to welcome their spirits back.

Marigolds: Known as cempasúchil, these vibrant flowers are believed to guide the spirits to their altars with their bright color and scent.

Food and Drink: Traditional foods such as pan de muerto (a special bread) and favorite dishes of the deceased are placed on the altar, symbolizing nourishment for the spir-

Personal Items: Belongings or mementos of the deceased are included to signify their presence and honor their memory.

Candles: The light from candles represents faith and hope, illuminating the way for the returning souls. Water: A glass of water is often placed to quench the thirst of the spirits after their long journey.

This intricate arrangement of items reflects the belief that the spirits of the deceased return to visit their families during this time. The altars serve as a bridge between the worlds, facilitating a connection that is both sacred and celebratory. The creation of these altars is often a collaborative effort, involving family members in the preparation and decoration, reinforcing bonds and collective memory.

Role of Food and Drink in Celebrations

Food plays a central role in the Day of the Dead festivities, symbolizing life, sustenance, and the continuation of traditions. The culinary offerings are not merely for consumption; they carry deep significance, with each dish reflecting the tastes and preferences of the deceased. The preparation and sharing of these foods serve as a communal activity that fosters connection among family members and friends.

- **Pan de muerto:** This traditional bread is shaped like a skull or decorated with bone-like pieces. Its sweet flavor and symbolic form make it a staple of the celebration.
- Calaveras de azúcar: Sugar skulls, often decorated with colorful icing, are both a playful and poignant representation of the dead, serving as a reminder of mortality.

Atole and champurrado: These warm beverages made from corn and chocolate are commonly served,

By offering free spay and neuter services in Los Barriles and surrounding towns, we help reduce abandonment and neglect. Beyond surgeries, our mission includes education and mentoring youth to become tomorrow's leaders in humane pet ownership. SNAP is 100% funded through donations, and every peso directly supports this work.

For our friends returning for the season, here's a look at what we've accomplished while you were away:

- We've averaged about 125 animals sterilized each month, with our busiest month reaching 181 surgeries.
- We've hosted community clinics in El Cardonal, Mira Flores, Santiago, and Campamento—towns where transportation can be a challenge.



Technology Safety, New **Technology and Good Tips**By: Lane Sykes

Here's a great way to start a new season: Beware of Google searches or any internet searches. If you are looking for tech support online and decide to Google Search for tech phone numbers, beware that the first several on the list are mostly paid ads. Yes, you can pay Google to move your Ad to the top of the search results list. Scammers are willing to buy ads. If you look carefully, you can see the Ad logo in the Google search. Far too many unsuspecting people with Tech problems search for the number, call and are charged a huge sum of money. Some even have the credit cards used for illicit purposes. When you search for Tech Support phone numbers, look at the top of the screen where all that www.xxxx is and verify that it is indeed the tech site you are searching. Also, you can renew your passports online. Use: travel.state.gov. Do NOT Google search for Renew My Passport. The first several hits are potential scams.

Speaking of online searches, I use Artificial Intelligence (AI) all the time no matter what the search. My go to is "Gemini" by Google, second is Grok, followed by Chat GPT and CoPi-If you need to repair something or gain general knowledge about a subject, they all work great. If you search for opinions, that will change with each AI provider. I just finished my Living Trust using AI. Grok gave me a Trust that was reviewed and blessed by an attorney. Gemini was no

Be careful when you use a QR code that is out there in the public domain. For instance, you park in a pay-to-park area or lot. You see a QR code that lets you pay via your cell phone. Make sure the QR code is not an overlay with scammers QR. Always check the URL or internet address. Another scam involves the tap to pay. At a huge number of gas stations you can see the gray pad the size of your credit card where you can tap your card for payment. Scammers are disabling the existing one, then place a phony square over it to conceal the original. The prompt on the screen will advised you to insert your card. That's where the scammers have placed a card reader. Next, all your credit/debit card info is revealed to the scammer. I still use tap to pay but beware.

Just before I left Baja for summer vacation, I purchased a Vsee Box just to give it a try. What the heck is a Vsee Box? Good question! It's a TV add-on box that connects to the TV via an available HDMI port on the TV. The Vsee box connects to the internet. After a few short, simple updates, you now have access to a huge host of media. You can access local stations all over the US. For our Canadian readers, yes there are 5 curling stations. My favorite sport as you can put your beer down on the playing surface and it never gets warm. Bottom line on the Vsee Box, I'm buying a second one. The TV resolution is good right out of the box. I'm going to swap the included HDMI cord for an upgraded one. BTW, no VPN required and it's worked all summer in the US. If your internet plan is truly unlimited, no problem. If your

bandwidth is metered, either turn off Vsee or select home. Otherwise, the Vsee will continue to download media and you may be charged with an overage.

When you use Apple Pay to pay for a recurring subscription that is outside the Apple Sphere, there will be a 30% surcharge added. I had subscribed to Consumers Report via Apple. Yes, I got hit with the 30%; so I canceled and went direct to Consumers Report.

Here's a quick way to price check when searching on Amazon. Click on the page in Amazon that has that nice gadget you've been searching for. Look in the top left of the corner of the screen and you will see Rufus with a search block. Just "Ask Rufus for a price check by simply typing "Price History" You will see a 30 day price history for that product. If there's a product that I don't need immediately, then I select "Save for Later". That helps me monitor prices. If there's a Prime Day in the near future, I generally fill up the "Save for Later" and wait for any price drops on Prime Day.

Reduced stress further decreases the risk of some physical and mental health problems, such as heart disease, stroke, depression, anxiety and general illness. In addition, people who volunteer have lower mortality rates than those who do not, even when controlling age, gender and physical health.

2. Provides a sense of purpose and teaches valuable

The work that volunteers provide is essential to everyday activities, giving volunteers a sense of purpose, especially when giving their time and talent in the areas they find meaningful. Older volunteers experience greater increases in life satisfaction and self-esteem.

At Mayo Clinic Health System, volunteers serve as greeters and waiting room attendants, provide patient room information and directions, and help transport patients and patient items. Many volunteers use their craft skills to make prayer shawls, blankets, sweaters and hats, that typically are given to newborn babies and patients with cancer. Other services volunteers provide include working in the hospital gift shop, performing clerical duties for staff or offering pet therapy to patients through the Paws Force team.

Volunteering increases social interaction and helps build a support system based on common interests. One of the best ways to make new friends and strengthen existing relationships is to participate in a shared activity.





I had dreams. I married a really nice guy who had a solid job in construction. Over the next five years we had two beautiful children. I was happy. We were renting a place to live and were beginning to carve out a good life for our young family.

Travelling to work one day, my husband was a passenger in a car that ran off the road. His back was injured. The accident left him in constant pain. It wasn't his fault, but he was the one who was suffering. To try to cope with the pain he began to drink. He drunk too much. This was not good.

When he drank too much his character changed. He became abusive and, as time went on, he started to become physically violent. I was frightened. My children began to suffer. My husband's temper was scaring them, and they were beginning to show signs of anxiety. I never thought life would turn out like this. My dream had turned into a nightmare.

For my kids' sake I left our place and moved back to live with my parents. This wasn't ideal but, in time, my kids were starting to calm down. I was beginning to get my life back in order. I found a cleaning job and my parents looked after my kids when I was working. This obviously wasn't my initial dream, but life was getting better again.

We might have made it, but then I got sick. The treatments

were hard. They were painful and tiring. I tried to keep going but my work suffered. Then the doctors told me that my body was not responding well to the treatment. The nightmare had returned.

I don't know why my life has been full of these challenges. I would give anything to have a different life.

I don't know what we would do without the food vouchers that I get from the Los Barriles Feeding the Hungry Charity. This guarantee of food is wonderful. It is such a relief to know that, despite what problems I have, my kids will not go to bed hungry.

I think a lot about this help I am getting. The fact that my kids are guaranteed food is only part of my gratefulness. Just knowing that someone else cares enough to help us is incredible. Somehow, I don't feel so alone in my struggles anymore. On my own this would be too much for me but, with the help I am getting, I have a chance.

I want whoever it is that is paying for these food vouchers to know that your kindness and generosity makes a huge difference to me and my kids.

We Thought the Hard Part Was Building The John Gullo Home for Children

Several months ago, we proudly announced the John Gullo Home for Children in El Cardonal, BCS had received its operating permit. The home was ready. The staff was moving in. The vision was becoming real.

We thought the hard part was behind us. We thought building the home would be the toughest part. After all, this *is* Mexico. Anyone who's ever tried to build a house, get a residency card, or even set up regular water delivery knows the system doesn't exactly run on gringo time or expectations. But as it turns out, the building was just the beginning.

The hardest part? It's the day-to-day work of operationalizing it... of filling this beautiful, nurturing space with the very children it was built for. That work is still ongoing.

What We've Learned

Shortly after opening, we welcomed our first child. His stay was temporary but pivotal. It gave us insight into the complexity of the challenges children bring with them and what kind of support is needed to help them heal and thrive.

Since then, we've been listening, learning, and adjusting. Some of that learning came from Casa Hogar in Cabo San Lucas, one of the most respected children's homes in the state... and, if the name sounds familiar, that's because their story inspired the Netflix movie *Blue Miracle*. Yes, that Casa Hogar.

Their leadership team spent several days with us this summer, offering practical feedback, encouragement, and a powerful reminder that this work takes time—and that children will come, most often through word of mouth and trust built slowly. We later visited their facility in Cabo and came away with a renewed sense of purpose, a list of ideas we're now implementing, and a deeper commitment to creating a truly sustainable, caring, and child-centered

home.

One Step Closer

In August, we took a big step forward by hosting a three-day "pilot camp" at the home for 23 children and 8 staff members from Casa Hogar. It was our first chance to see the home filled with so much laughter, life, and movement.

We spent time on the beach, shared meals around the table, and learned from both the staff and children what it really means to make a space feel welcoming and safe. The children left us with handmade gifts, including a thank-you poster and a "tree of handprints" that now hangs in the facility, a reminder of the future we're building toward.

What We're Doing Now

One of the biggest changes? We've launched an aggressive outreach strategy across the entire Baja peninsula. Under the leadership of our on-site Facility Director, Belén Meza Sandez, and Assistant Director, Sara María Esparza Lucero, we've created a comprehensive plan to strengthen connections with social workers, hospitals, clinics, and DIF offices in every major municipality from La Paz and Their calendar now includes nearly two dozen site visits between now and the end of November, with posters, flyers, and presentations designed to explain the home's mis-



sion and who it serves: children whose families are experiencing a medical crisis. And at every stop, we're hearing the same thing, "This home is so needed."

Building Our Village

Right now, we're looking for:

- Local professionals who can offer specialized support (e.g., child psychologists, therapists, social workers)
- Helpers for enrichment activities like arts and crafts, tutoring, gardening, music, or even just playing a board game
- People willing to be on call for occasional help with errands, repairs, or supplies

As we continue outreach across the peninsula, we're also building a local volunteer network to strengthen day-today operations at the John Gullo Home for Children






